On Thursday, March 7th, 2024. Someone from the fish and game office off of Raspberry Rd, issued a complaint of the constant odor of marijuana coming Canamo Concepts located at 501 Raspberry Rd, in Anchorage, Alaska.

I arrived in the area at approximately 1630 Hours, traveling south on Arctic Blvd. and turned east on W. 67th ave. where no odor was detected, I returned to Arctic blvd. and proceeded south then east onto Raspberry road. The wind was gusting to the southern direction. Once in front of Canamo Concepts did I detect a strong odor of marijuana.

I then went to the parking area east of Canamo Concepts but did not detect any marijuana odor due to the wind gusting to the south.

This is a violation of:

3 AAC 306.430. Restricted access area. (c)(2)

(c) A marijuana cultivation facility shall ensure that any marijuana at the marijuana cultivation facility

(2) does not emit an odor that is detectable by the public from outside the cultivation facility except as specifically allowed by a local government approval.

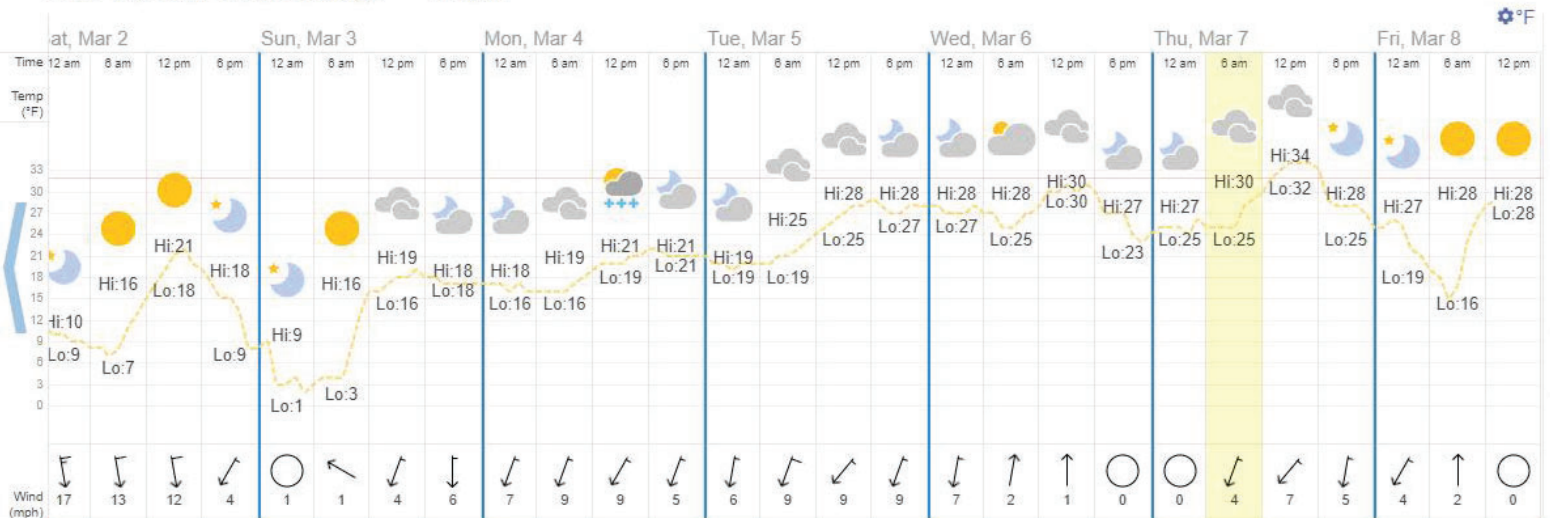

Dear Honorable MCB Members, AMCO and AMCO Enforcement,

This letter is in response to the NOV’s obtained by Canamo Concepts, License #10098 on March 8, 2024.

According to the information in NOV Case #AM 240426 provided by AMCO Enforcement, there was an odor of marijuana coming from the Canamo Concepts facility on March 7, 2024. Canamo Concepts facility has been operating since 2017 and has just recently been in violation of some smell issues – previous one coming last summer. With this most recent notice of smell pollution, Canamo Concepts has decided to test all eleven carbon scrubbing units to test their operational efficiency. During that investigation, we found no conclusive evidence that their function is compromised. If we do not see an improvement in the next three months, we will look to replace the entire can (unit) as the carbon within the filter might have ran its course.

Furthermore, Canamo has decided to invest in additional air purifying equipment. We have decided to go with three advanced air treatment systems that claim to reduce levels of odors by up to 99% - [Element Air Towers](#).

Lastly, you will see an attached smell monitoring log executed daily by our staff. On the aforementioned date of the violation, we did log a “zero” smell, but at 10:00am. Canamo’s personal has decided to change the logging procedure to accompany two logs per day, one in morning and one in afternoon (a start of shift and end of shift type concept). This will allow us to be more proactive in assessing the carbon scrubbing efficiency.

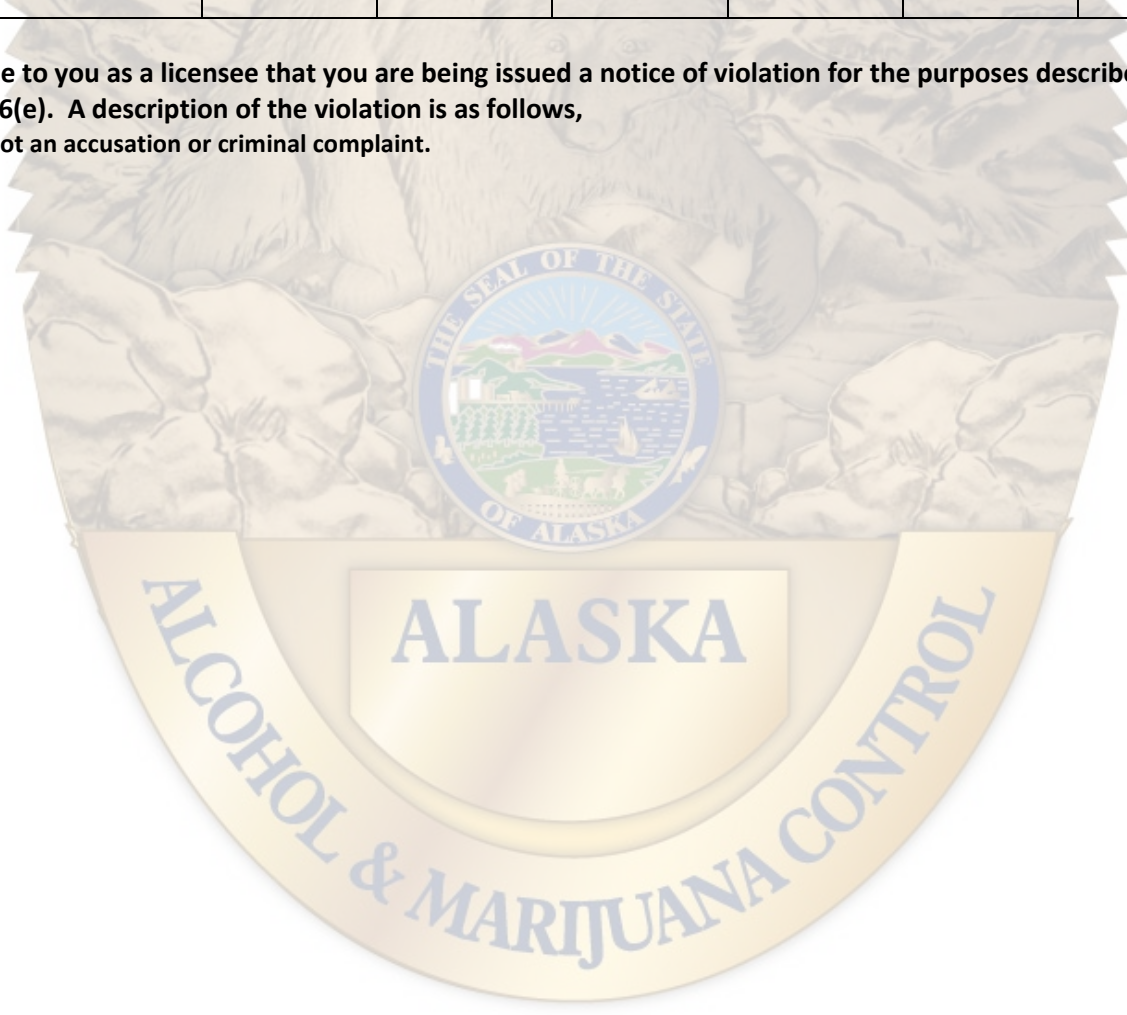

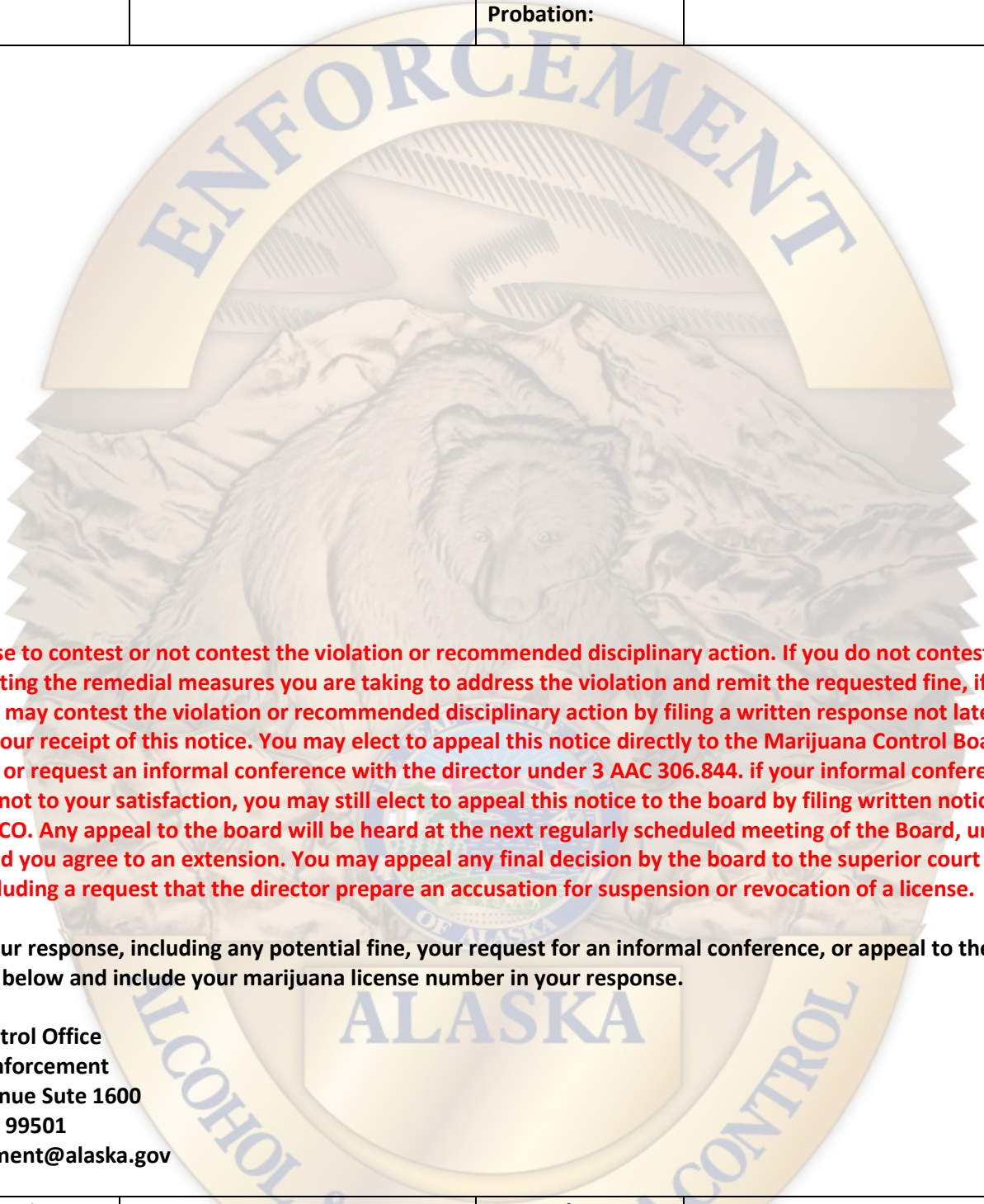

**This is a notice to you as a licensee that you are being issued a notice of violation for the purposes described in 3 AAC 306.806(e). A description of the violation is as follows, NOTE: This is not an accusation or criminal complaint.**

On 01/11/2024 at approx. 1115 hours, Investigators Hamilton and Linger conducted a walk through of AK Kush located at 1055 N Helen Lane, Wasilla. Investigators noticed there were no tracking tags on any plants or finished product in the facility. Licensee Lloyd Stanfield stated he fell behind and had no way of tracking the current product, and couldn't identify what strain it came from. Investigators located 41 mature plants, 66 baggies containing marijuana (quart, 1 gallon, and 2 gallon size bags), and 153 quart jars containing marijuana. Five-hundred twenty violations of 3AAC 306.405(a)(5) and 3AAC 306.435(a); 260 each respectively.

This is in violation of:  
3 AAC 306.405 A licensed standard marijuana cultivation facility: privileges and prohibited acts (a)(5), A licensed standard marijuana cultivation facility is authorized to store inventory on the licensed premises; any stored inventory must be secured in a restricted access area and accounted for in the marijuana cultivation facility's marijuana inventory tracking system as required under 3 AAC 306.730

3 AAC 306.435 Marijuana inventory tracking system (a), A marijuana cultivation facility shall use a marijuana inventory tracking system in compliance with 3 AAC 306.730 to ensure all marijuana propagated, grown, or cultivated on the marijuana cultivation facility's premises is identified and tracked from the time the marijuana is propagated through transfer to another licensed marijuana establishment, including when marijuana or marijuana product is relocated to the new licensed premises in the case of a transfer of a marijuana establishment license to another location approved by the board, or destruction. The marijuana cultivation facility shall assign a tracking number to each plant over eight inches tall and each package of marijuana to be transferred to another facility. A package of marijuana may not exceed 10 pounds. The marijuana cultivation facility shall also assign a plant batch name or number to each batch of clones or cuttings. A batch may not consist of more than 50 clones or cuttings.

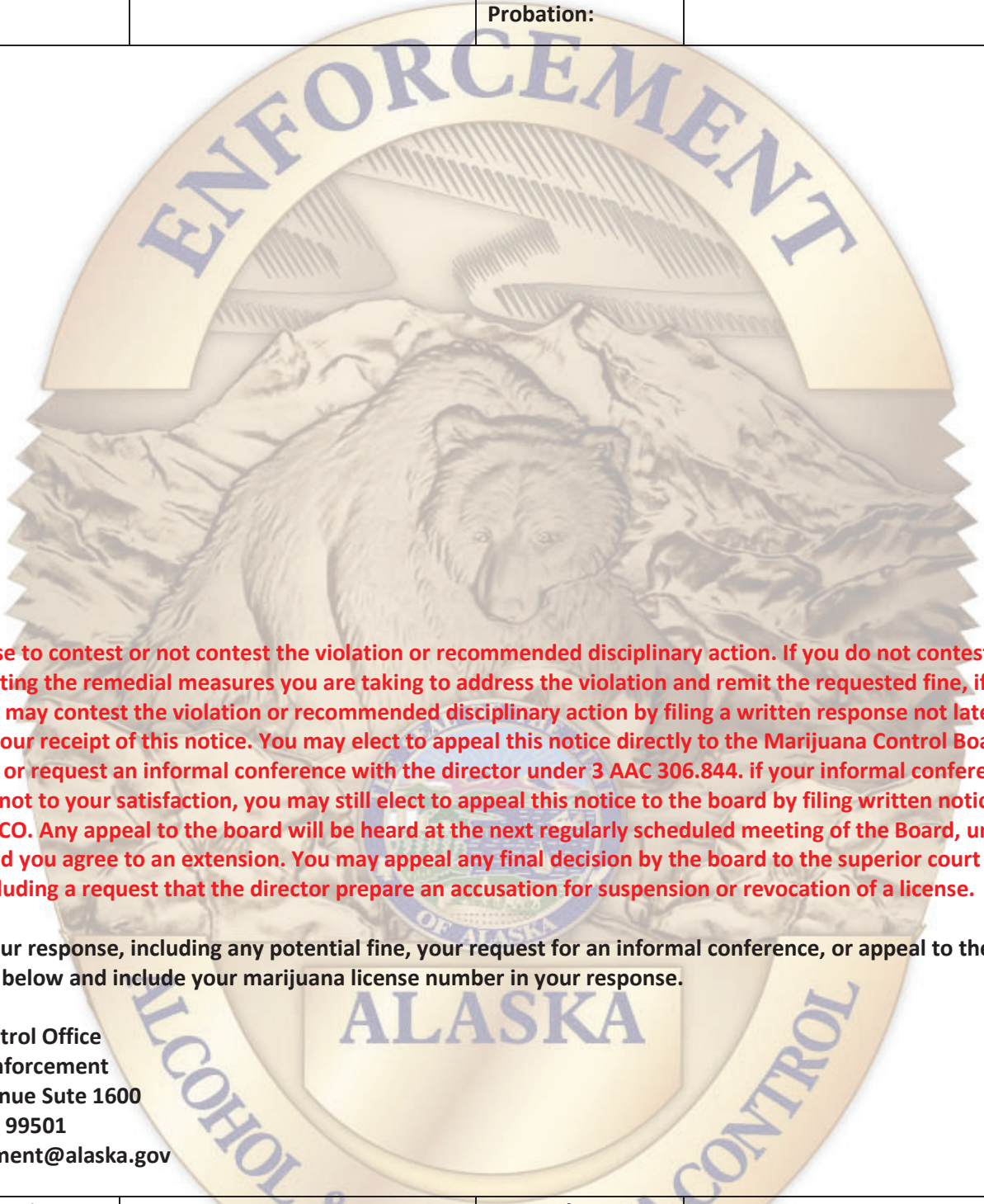
