

Subject: Hooligans NOV

To the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board,

I am writing on behalf of Molly Poland regarding the NOV issued to Hooligans Lodging & Saloon, Inc. (license #3134) on March 2, 2016. As you are aware, Hooligans' alcohol license was also indefinitely suspended on March 2. Thus Ms. Poland does not expect that this response to the NOV will "undo" any suspension. Rather, she hopes that this response will be taken into consideration when the Board decides whether to grant or renew any future license application, and what action to take on the NOV itself.

Per the call from Ms. Franklin to me on March 3, I relayed to Ms. Poland the Director's message that the most direct path to an alcohol license for Hooligans will be for Ms. Poland to apply for a new license in her own name (instead of pursuing any transfer of the former license). I am pleased to report that she immediately engaged my office to help accomplish that goal. Last Friday, March 4, she posted a public copy of her license application at the Soldotna post office and at Hooligans itself. On Wednesday, March 9 she published her first notice of the application in the Peninsula Clarion. Her state corporate license is currently in good standing. She is also on a payment plan with her borough taxes, thus we do not expect any protest of the license from either Soldotna or the borough. Ms. Poland will tender her application to the Board as soon the publication period is complete.

We are hopeful that Hooligans will be eligible for a temporary license prior to the Board's April 26 meeting in Anchorage, which we plan to attend. We are also hopeful that Ms. Poland's efforts to become compliant with all ABC licensing requirements will permit the Board to consider some clemency when it decides what action to take upon the NOV. Thank you all for your attention in this matter, and for your continued guidance in helping this business come into compliance.

VIOLATION: As a result of an inspection on 12-4-15, two employees were found to have expired server education. This is not only a violation of Title IV, but a violation of a municipal ordinance requiring server education. On 12-7-15, it was learned that you have sold the business 3 years ago to Jose Diaz and you no longer have a lease for the property. After selling, you completed the renewal process with whom you sold the business to but failed to notify the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of your intention. These are violations of Title 04.

It was later learned that the clerk had failed her tips class and the store had been notified by TIPS instructor Keri Rochon of the failure. This employee was also allowed to sell alcoholic beverages. These are violations of Title IV.

Dear Ms. Franklin,

This letter is Carr-Gottstein Foods' response to the Notice of Violation addressed to Carr-Gottstein Foods Co. DBA Oaken Keg #2728 located at 1907 Seward Hwy, Seward, AK. As part of a compliance check inspection, employees Doris Paul, Steven Brown and Sharyll Higbee were found to be working/scheduled to work without current TIPS cards. Subsequent investigation was conducted by Safeway's Asset Protection Department.

In order to prevent future violations, the following steps will be taken:

- Increased number of certified trainers across the state – we currently have six and will look to add more this year.
- A review of cards and expiration dates monthly by the Liquor Managers with written verification to the Store Director and Keri Rochon (Training Specialist) going forward.
- Request for training to occur within 60 days of expiry from 90 days.
- An in-house Master Trainer (Keri Rochon) will be able to train other facilitators in the TIPS program.

Store management will coordinate with Safeway's training department for any additional retraining needed.
