

RE: Enforcement Report, Alcohol

AMCO Enforcement has been extremely busy with investigations, inspections and providing assistance to alcohol and marijuana licensees. We have started our travel to rural areas for the main purpose of inspections and to provide training to local law enforcement in areas that we are not able to frequently visit.

AMCO Enforcement has completed the syllabus for law enforcement and have the alcohol portion of the training material completed. We do need to complete the marijuana training material for the course and then it will be ready to present. When this is completed, the informational presentation for the public will be completed and will be based off of much of the law enforcement presentation.

I will be tracking the statistics for "Public Appearance" and "Law Enforcement Training" in my future reports.

We are continuing to work with Department of Health and Social Services, Tobacco Enforcement to reinstate our compliance/shoulder tap program. The memorandum of understanding between both Departments is still currently under review. We have also started to look at other avenues to move forward at a quicker pace.
