Requested Action:

License renewal

Statutory Authority:

AS 04.06.090(b): "The board shall review all applications for licenses made under this title and may order the director to issue, renew, revoke, transfer, or suspend licenses and permits authorized under this title."

AS 04.11.480(a): "A local governing body may protest the issuance, renewal, relocation, or transfer to another person of a license by sending the board and the applicant a protest and the reasons for the protest within 60 days of receipt from the board of notice of filing of the application... The board shall consider a protest and testimony received at a hearing conducted under AS 04.11.510(b)(2) or (4) when it considers the application... If an application or continued operation is protested, the board shall deny the application or continued operation unless the board finds that the protest is arbitrary, capricious, and unreasonable."

AS 04.11.510(b)(2): "The board may review an application for the issuance, renewal, transfer of location, or transfer to another person of a license without affording the applicant notice or hearing, except...(2) the board may, on its own initiative or in response to an objection or protest, hold a hearing to ascertain the reaction of the public or a local governing body to an application if a hearing is not required under this subsection;"

Staff Rec.: Hold a public hearing; deny the application with a 180 day abeyance.

Background: Municipality of Anchorage protests due to violations to the conditions set forth by the Municipality. Public objection received.

The licensee should be notified that under 3 AAC 304.145(h), this abeyance period may not be extended or renewed.

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37 38 A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE STATE OF ALASKA APPLICATION FOR THE RENEWAL OF PACKAGE STORE LIQUOR LICENSE #3219, FOR LEEFAMILY CORPORATION, DBA MOM & POP'S GROCERY & LIQUOR LOCATED AT 601 W 36TH AVE., STE. 3-4, ANCHORAGE, AK 99503 AND AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL CLERK TO TAKE CERTAIN ACTION.

(Midtown Community Council)

WHEREAS, LeeFamily Corporation has made an application with the Alaska Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO), for consideration by the Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board, and has paid the required fee for the renewal of package store liquor license. #3219, doing business as Mom & Pop's Grocery & Liquor, located at 601 W 36th Ave., Ste. 3-4, Anchorage, Alaska, 99503; and

WHEREAS, on October 15, 2019, the Clerk's Office received from the Midtown Community Council, a request in a timely manner for a legislative public hearing before the Assembly regarding the renewal of liquor license #3219 for Mom & Pop's as authorized by AMC 2.30.120C.; and

WHEREAS, 10 day notice of the public hearing has been given to the applicant and the Midtown Community Council as required by AMC 2.30.120, and AS 04.21.010(d); and

WHEREAS, the Assembly must enter any protest to AMCO within 60 days following receipt of the application; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) 2.30.120 and 3 AAC 304.145(d) require the Assembly to hold a public hearing to provide the applicant an opportunity to defend their application prior to exercising or waiving the right to protest; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Municipal Clerk received a copy of this application on January 15, 2020 and has determined that the last day for the Assembly to file a protest is March 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly Meeting on March 10, 2020 is the last scheduled regular meeting of the Anchorage Assembly prior to the expiration of the protest period; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Clerk reports the following status concerning this location:

- 1. Any ABC Board violations and/or incidents on file that would lead to an ABC Board violation are attached; and
- 2. There are no taxes owing to the Municipality of Anchorage; and
- 3. Special Land Use Permit, required by AMC 21.03.040C4.a., has been approved; and
- 4. Certifications from the Anchorage Health Department, the Building Safety Official and the Anchorage Fire Department have been received; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, the Midtown Community Council submitted a timely request for a public hearing on the renewal of Mom & Pop's liquor license regarding concerns about public safety and operations; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly passed AR 2018-134, As Amended which requested conditions to be placed on the license and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board upheld the Assembly's request and placed 7 conditions listed under Section 1. of AR 2018-134, As Amended on the license; and

WHEREAS, on August 20, 2019, a representative of the Midtown Community Council made an appearance at the Regular Assembly Meeting to report on Mom & Pop's non-compliance with the conditions placed on the license; and

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2019, the Assembly Public Safety Committee invited the Midtown Community Council and the owners of Mom & Pop's to attend and discuss issues brought up at the August 20, 2019 Regular Assembly Meeting; and

WHEREAS, on January 10, 2020 and January 31, 2020, the Assembly held worksessions and invited the Midtown Community Council and the owners of Mom & Pop's to discuss the Mom & Pop's liquor license renewal process; and

WHEREAS, this resolution sets the public hearing on the protest of the renewal of liquor license #3219 for February 25, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has provided the liquor licensee the opportunity to defend the renewal application, has considered the testimony and evidence relevant to this liquor license, and has considered the options of either protesting or waiving protest and requesting the ABC Board impose conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Anchorage Assembly finds the applicant and the Midtown Community Council were given notice and a hearing was properly held February 25, 2020 for purposes stated herein with relevant evidence presented as indicated in the public records maintained by the Municipal Clerk.

<u>Section 2.</u> Per Anchorage Municipal Code section 2.30.125, in the exercise of its powers and under AS 04.11.480 and 3 AAC 304.145 to protest issue, renewal and transfer of alcoholic beverage licenses within the Municipality, the Assembly shall consider whether the proposed license meets the factors and standards set forth in that section, and those potentially relevant, pending the public hearing, to the renewal application for license #3219 are listed below.

- A. After review of the application and all relevant information, the Assembly finds that (only check items that apply):
 - ☐ Concentration and land use. The transfer of location or issuance of the requested license will negatively impact the community through an increase in the concentration of uses involving the sale or service of alcoholic beverages within the area affected and will conform to the separate standards of section 21.03.080D.
 - ☐ Training. The applicant cannot demonstrate prospective or continued compliance with a liquor server awareness training program approved by the state alcoholic beverage control board, such as or similar to the program for techniques in alcohol management (T.A.M.). Until such plan is approved, training by a licensee's employees in the T.A.M. shall constitute compliance with this section. (This subsection is effective December 1, 1985.)
 - ☐ Operations procedures. The applicant cannot demonstrate prospective or continued compliance with operations procedures for licensed premises set forth in section 10.50.035.
 - Public safety. The operator cannot demonstrate the ability to maintain order and prevent unlawful conduct in licensed premises. In determining the operator's demonstrated ability to maintain order and prevent unlawful conduct, the assembly has considered police reports, testimony presented before the assembly, written comments submitted prior to or during the public hearing, and other evidence deemed to be reliable and relevant to the purpose of this subsection and in the record for AR 2018-134, As Amended, and this resolution. For purposes of this section and section 10.50.035 the term "licensed premises" shall include any adjacent area under the control or management of the licensee.
 - 1. Licensee acknowledged awareness of the conditions imposed on the license by the ABC Board in September of 2018, as requested by the Assembly in AR 2018-34, As Amended, and that licensee complied with the conditions for several months following their imposition. Licensee testified he consciously disregarded conditions after several months generally because he felt they were unfair since he learned other operators in the vicinity were not restricted by the same or similar restrictions and requirements. The Assembly finds that noncompliance for those reasons is not justified.

- 2. On many occasions throughout 2019, sales of products at Mom & Pop's Grocery & Liquor violated conditions imposed on the license. Credible photographic evidence and an attestation was provided by Timothy Potter showing shooter size liquor bottles with receipts sold for less than the minimum price required by ABC conditions, and in quantities to a person in a day exceeding the number allowed by conditions. Conditions were imposed by legal process and compliance is required by law. The Assembly acknowledges that the alleged violations have not been adjudicated, including an ABC Notice of Violation dated 2/8/2020, but the totality of the allegations and admission of the licensee to sales practices in violation make them trustworthy and reliable for purposes of a protest to license renewal.
- 3. The Anchorage Police Department Calls for Service report (AIM 32-2020) for calendar year 2019 are voluminous to the extent the licensed premises appear to be a magnet for unlawful conduct and the number of calls for police service are significant in relationship to other package stores in the Municipality. The Assembly recognizes that liquor licensees should not be discouraged from calling for police assistance when needed, but they also have a responsibility to implement operations and practices that mitigate the need for frequent police assistance. The conditions imposed on the license are one of the measures the licensee could have implemented but admitted in testimony he does not comply with. The Assembly finds the licensee's pattern of practices contributed to unlawful conduct and public safety concerns at the licensee premises.
- ☐ Payment of taxes and debts. Pursuant to AS 04.11.330, the applicant is delinquent in payment of taxes owed to the municipality for the payment of any debts or taxes, including any estimated taxes for the current year arising from the conduct of the licensed business.
- Public health. The operator has engaged in a pattern of practices injurious to public health or safety, such as providing alcohol to minors or intoxicated persons, committing serious violations of state law relevant to public health or safety, or other actions within the knowledge and control of the operator which place the public health or safety at risk. The assembly has considered criminal convictions, credible proof of illegal activity even if not prosecuted, police reports, testimony presented before the assembly, written comments submitted prior to or during the public hearing, and other evidence deemed to be reliable and relevant to the purpose of this subsection and this resolution.
- 1. The record of this location demonstrates to the Anchorage Assembly as a matter of general public policy there is a negative impact greater than that anticipated from permitted package stores generally, on the neighboring properties and parks, to the sense of safety and welfare to

nearby residents, and on health and safety of customers the licensee caters to, as a result of the licensee's pattern of practices and operations procedures.

- 2. The licensee's practices and catering to chronic inebriate customers, including selling shooter size bottles of hard alcohol for low prices that are below the \$1.70 minimum price condition for shooters, evidenced by pictures and testimony of at least two individuals, substantially contributed to negative impacts on the area, including,
 - a. increased costs to nearby property owners in damages and loss, and increased costs for security and security improvements, particularly Mallory Place apartments, and concerns for safety of tenants and security of their buildings. Denali Commercial Property Management provided credible photographic evidence and testimony of empty liquor containers littered on its properties on various dates, persons incapacitated on its property and inside its laundry facilities and a vacant apartment unit. While each instance cannot demonstrate conclusively the customers or product litter was purchased at licensee's store, in the totality of the circumstances it is sufficient to show many product purchases from the licensee significantly contributed to these impacts to the area.
 - b. <u>being a significant contributing factor to chronic inebriates littering,</u> <u>trespassing and becoming publicly incapacitated (passing out) in the</u> area.
- 3. The licensee failed to mark containers as a litter prevention and identification measure. Photos provided the Assembly credibly demonstrate shooters purchased at licensee's store were not marked or labeled as required so they could be identified as originating from that store when discovered as litter. Compliance with that condition could have exonerated or implicated licensee of responsibility of litter of empty shooter bottles in the area.
- 4. The practices have continued after the State ABC Board imposed conditions on the license September 4, 2018. The Assembly finds by a preponderance of the evidence submitted that such practices violating conditions imposed on the license occurred in June, July, August, November, December of 2019, and January of 2020. The Assembly concludes the foregoing practices and violations of conditions are known

Dear ABC Board:

I am writing to add additional, very current information to the Anchorage Municipal Assembly's Protest of the renewal of Liquor License #3219 for Mom & Pop's Grocery & Liquor. I am copying this email to the Manager of the family business, Eddy Lee. I understand that this renewal will be on your next meeting agenda, March 31 and April 1, 2020 in Anchorage.

I have been talking with Mr. Lee since 2016, attempting to get him to operate his business in a responsible manner by being a good neighbor to those of us who live within a few blocks of his store. We contend with many empty shooters and fortified and cheap beer containers tossed on the street and our property between his store and Arctic Benson Park, where public drinking happens daily through the warmer months of the year. Working through Midtown Community Council, we developed an MOU that he agreed to in 2018, which limited the

number of shooters to sell to two per day per person and to mark his store initials, MP, on the bottom of these targeted containers, among other restrictions. These restrictions were also imposed by your body at the September 2018 meeting. At Assembly testimony regarding this renewal last month, multiple instances of violations of this agreement were reported. At the Assembly Meeting on March 10, 2020, Mr. Lee admitted that he did not abide by the two shooter limit if the person didn't appear to be drunk. He did say, though, that they always marked the bottoms of the containers with MP.

On March 11, a friend of mine stopped by the store and purchased four shooters, which were not marked with MP on their bottoms. Below is a photo of them and the receipt.

So, not only is Mr. Lee's store in violation of the MOU and conditions placed upon his license, he also lied directly to the Assembly about the marking of the containers.

This operator has shown his intent over the last years to not follow conditions he agreed to, that were placed on him by the ABC Board, to lie about his business practices regarding these conditions, and to not be concerned about the impact of his business practices on the neighborhood. For those reasons, I urge you to not renew this license, but allow the owners to sell it to a responsible operator.
