Investigator Hamilton,

This letter is in response to the NOV you sent us on October 13, 2020. As you know, the NOV was originally issued in October of 2019. I responded to it and other NOV's (for license 822) on behalf of my clients on July 27, 2020. You wrote me on August 26, 2020 and informed me that a new premises diagram was not attached to our response to this particular NOV.

The delay in responding between August 26, 2020 and October 13, 2020 is on me. I did reach out to my clients about the diagram but from August 14, 2020-October 3, 2020 I was in Colorado Springs for a family medical emergency and did not adequately follow up.

You reminded me on October 13, 2020 that we needed to provide an amended premises diagram. Between that date and last week, you and I were in good communication about the matter discussing how to resolve it. On October 24, 2020 I drove to Seward and Mr. Jackson gave me a tour of the premises (it is closed for the winter) and discussed its operations with me.

I am now providing our amended premises diagram as you and I discussed on the phone

on October 30, 2020. If you compare this diagram to the diagram submitted by my clients in August of 2017 with the AB-14 filed and approved by the director, you can see the changes we have made to more accurately reflect the premises as they operate.

In 2016-2017 my clients combined three small adjacent restaurants into one large restaurant operated with a "food court" concept. Before my clients completed their plans and the purchase, in late 2016, they reached out to AMCO to ask if they could use one REPL to serve beer and wine for the new large restaurant. Correspondence from January 2017 between Sarah Oates and my client indicates that the AMCO investigators met with Sarah, at that time the Licensing Supervisor, to discuss the concept. The plans were approved conditioned on my clients submitting an AB-14 and DOB name change, which they did. The restaurant has been operating with one REPL using the food court concept ever since the AB-14 was approved by Director McConnell in August of 2017.

When a customer enters the restaurant, they can choose from several outside doors. The consumption area of the restaurant is laid out in roughly an "L" shape with the kitchens nestled inside the "L". There are four counters: one serves pizza, one serves fish, one serves burritos and tacos and one is for beer, wine and ice cream. The service model is to come to a counter to order, sit down at a table and come pick up your food at the counter when your name is called. (On slow days your server might deliver your food to the table).

At each of the food counters, you can order beer or wine and pay for it, but you cannot obtain the beer or wine at any of the food service counters. Instead there is a distinct area where the taps are located behind a counter. When you order beer or wine, you are directed by the staff to take your receipt to the taps area where you obtain your drink. By this method, the restaurant maintains tight control over the service of alcohol.

The difference between the diagram as submitted and what you observed upon inspection

was caused by issues that arose in construction. When my clients planned the food court, they

intended to "blow out" the walls between the three restaurants, making an open concept space just

like you see on HGTV. They drew the diagram with this blueprint in mind, so the three areas where

the dining space converges in the diagram appears fairly open and free-flowing.

Unfortunately, the structural issues prevented my clients from peeling back the walls as far

as they wanted to. There is a large open interior doorway between pizza and fish, and two smaller

interior doorways between fish and tacos (with a hallway holding additional table space between

these two doors). These three interior doorways have framing that intrudes into the room more

than what is represented on the previously approved diagram, although they do not have doors.

My clients have been operating the food court seasonally and safely since 2017. The

concept allows families and tour groups to eat together in one place even if some want pizza or

tacos instead of fish, which is the Seward staple. The beer and wine, a minimal percentage of the

sales of the restaurant, is safely served and handled from one central distribution point, which we

have marked clearly on the revised diagram.

Thank you for working with me on understanding the nature of your issues with the

diagram and for your patience while I got eyes on the issues so that I can assist and explain my

client's operation. As we discussed, it is my hope that this revised diagram closes this NOV.



Dear Director Klinkhart and AMCO Enforcement Team,

I represent the above licensees. I am in receipt of Investigator Hamilton's multiple NOV's issued July 10, 2020 to our establishments in Seward, Alaska. On behalf of my clients, I submit the following responses:

1. AMCO Case Number 20-175 and 20-717

These violations were issued for lack of signage. The NOV numbered 20-175 is for lack of signage at Klondike's Pizzeria (133 4th Ave.) Although 20-717 is titled as a NOV for lack of signage at Gulf of Alaska Food Court (1401 4th Ave), the citation itself states "The establishment was missing the \$1500 civil penalty sign at the entrance/exit to Klondike Pizza".

Regardless of whether the NOVs were duplicitous or a mistake was made in drafting the language of 20-717, the signs have been posted and will remain posted. The signage continues to be confusing to new staff who believe that the signage signals to customers that minors are not allowed on the premises. Staff have been educated by the owners that the signs must remain posted and do not mean that minors are prohibited.

As seasonal businesses, re-education is generally required each year. We will continue to teach returning and new staff regarding signage. Managers and Owners will check each premises at the beginning of each season for required signage.

2. AMCO Case Number 19-1562

This NOV was originally issued on October 14, 2019 and regards a request for an updated premises diagram for License 4915 that more accurately depicts the premises.

The owners thought that they had forwarded this NOV and the other NOV issued the same day (AMCO Case Number 1461) to undersigned counsel for a response. We had very recently been retained by the licensees for several matters (the main matter not being NOVs), and documents were being exchanged in a flurry between the parties. The NOV's did not make it to counsel, while the licensees assumed that counsel had received them and responded to AMCO on their behalf in a timely manner.

Because counsel did not see the NOV regarding the premises diagram until the July 2020 set of NOV's were issued, the diagram was not updated. We will have an updated diagram to AMCO on or before July 31, 2020.

3. AMCO Case Number 19-1562

This NOV was issued for an employee not having a current TAPS card upon inspection. Again, the response was not made because the licensees mistakenly believed counsel had responded on their behalf.

The employee in question has not returned for the 2020 season. All employees have been reminded that they must have and maintain a current TAPS card for the licensed establishment to be compliant.

4. Unnumbered NOV for not responding to October, 2019 NOV's.

An additional NOV is in the packet that references the two 2019 case numbers above. This NOV was issued for failing to respond to the two October 2019 NOV's. Again, the lack of response was due to a miscommunication and mistaken assumption and was not deliberate. Counsel and licensees are in full communication and any future NOV's will be promptly addressed by counsel.

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to these NOV's. Please be assured that these licensed premises will remain in full compliance with all statutes and regulations related to their licenses. Feel free to contact me if you have further questions.
