The security ID check upon entry into the retail store facility will conduct a visual inspection to make sure no alcohol or marijuana purchased or grown elsewhere will be brought into the store or consumption cafe. Only product purchased at our store will be allowed to be consumed in the allowed consumption area as identified by our package and brand labeling. All employees will be trained to be vigilant about no outside products being allowed on our premises, and signs will be posted to state this policy.

Our retail facility will use jewelry store style glass cabinets to display all products and samples available for sale or viewing. The cabinets will also separate the public from access to employee only sales areas. Marijuana products will be prepackaged and sold in different weight increments, and combination packages. Large sample jars to display various marijuana strains may be on display on shelving behind the service counters. Sales will occur at designated POS locations in the store.

All marijuana products received and accepted from a licensed marijuana manufacturing facility will be required to meet the same packaging and labeling requirements in compliance with 3AAC 306.565 and -.570. No marijuana or marijuana products will be accepted that do not meet the requirements of these regulations. In addition, all marijuana and marijuana products sold in our retail store will be labeled with our company name/logo and license number along with the laboratory testing results and consumer warning statements.

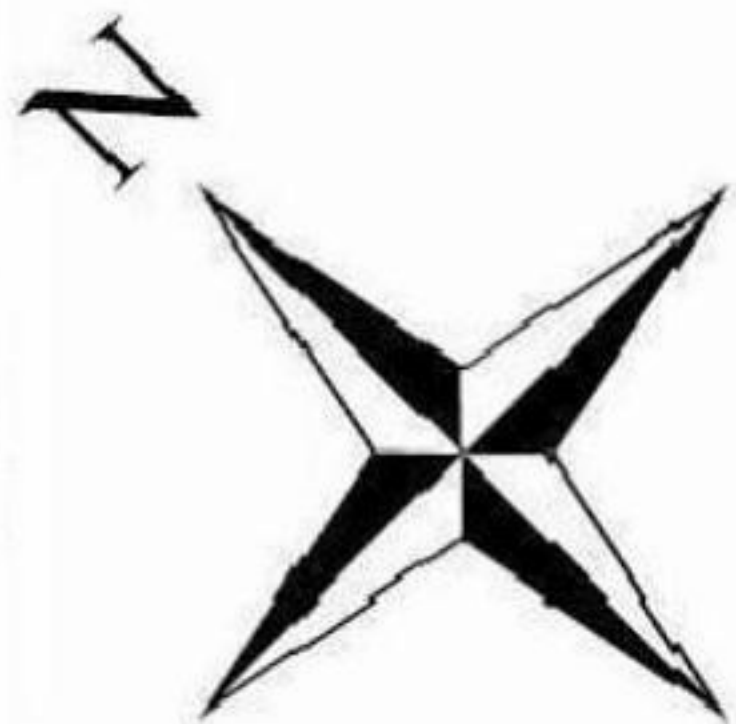


Existing AP&T Equipment

The designated area for consumption, as noted on (Lot Diagram), consist of a small outdoors deck area (Approx. 400sqft) and only four table areas will be allowed. Access to this small area will be carefully controlled to ensure only age appropriate / non-impaired / premise customers are allowed access.

The perimeter of this area will be controlled by a 8ft security fence that will enclose a majority of the property and a100% of the the consumption area. Access to the consumption area will only be possible through the primary building main entrance. Emergency exits will be included in the perimeter fence design but will be "one-way only" and alarmed.

Marijuana products will be maintained in sealed, weighed, labeled, sealed, opaque, resealable, child-resistant bags which will be displayed inside a pull drawer located inside a plexiglass counter that is only accessible by employees.

To ensure no outside marijuana products are used inside the consumption area the following policies will be applied:

Consumption of marijuana products will only be allowed in the area noted in the lot diagram as "Consumption".

Only premise owned marijuana products and usage implements will be allowed.

No outside or private consumption implements (pipes, vaporizers, etc) will be allowed for use inside the consumption area.

Only premise supplied consumption implements will be allowed, this may include, but is not limited to the use of rolled cigarette style implements, sanitary or one use pipes, vaporizers, etc.

Customers will be instructed on this policy by employees and signage. This policy will be enforced by premise employees and CCTV cameras. Any person found in violation of this policy will be removed and banned from the premise. Local law enforcement may be engaged as necessary.

In addition the perimeter of the consumption area will be controlled by a 8ft security fence that will enclose 100% of the the consumption area.

Once this is assured an additional label will be added by a "sticky label" that will note the retail store information with all information required by 3 AAC 306.345 (a)

Marijuana product that is received in bulk form (not to exceed 5lbs) from a cultivation site will be separated into determined amounts/weights for retail sale. Regardless of the amount (not to exceed 1 ounce) the product will be placed into sealed bags and labeled with "sticky labels" that denote all safety and notification requirements set forth in 3 AAC 306.345 (a) and a barcode tracking emblem that will be used to manage internal inventory.

All Marijuana products will be sold inside a opaque plastic bag specifically designed and supplied by the Wholesale Cannabis Packaging Supplies and MMC Depot company. These bags will have a child proof heat seal area, a resealable zipper, and a tear notch. These bags may also be imprinted with the name of store and location of the premise.

MMC Depot's tubes may also be utilized and are opaque, airtight, water resistant, odor proof, child safe, and comply with all AK state marijuana packaging regulations.

In addition, a label will be added to either packaging medium via a "sticky label" that will note the retail's store information and will denote all safety and notification requirements set forth in 3 AAC 306.345 (a).

*It is possible that all required information will be printed directly onto the bags/tubes by the manufacturer.

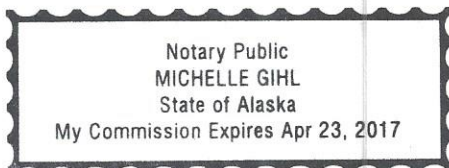

- Slowed reaction times to normal situations, yet quick to laugh at things that may or may not be funny to a sober individual
- Short term forgetfulness and a distorted sense of time
- Difficulty maintaining balance, walking in a straight line
- Other similar issues

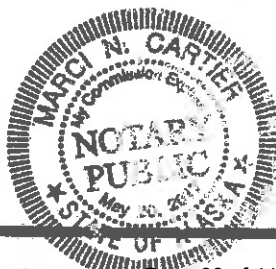

Our plan is to ensure all employees have adequate training to recognize the signs of a person under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, inhalant or controlled substance. This will be added to the initial training newly hired personnel must complete in order to safely join the retail team. If management deems a review is needed to recognize those signs, a staff meeting will be held to reiterate that training.

An employee will be stationed at the entrance door at all times. The primary focus of this employee will be to check proper identifications, and look for any signs that indicate a person(s) is under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, inhalant, or controlled substance. If a client shows signs they are under the influence, they will be denied entrance to the building.

There will also be surveillance cameras strategically placed throughout the internal and external circumference of the building. These will serve as a deterrent for anyone who is under the influence to enter the premises.

We plan to only allow customers to enter the consumption room if they have purchased our marijuana or marijuana product at that time. They will not be allowed to exit the building and return later to use the consumption room. This will help ensure only our products are being used on the premises.

We also plan to have two surveillance cameras located in the consumption room mounted on separate walls to ensure viewing of the entire room.

Lastly, we plan to have an employee monitor the consumption room to discourage visitors from bringing in and using anything not purchased on site.

A call will be made to local law enforcement if any person(s) is caught with substances brought in from external sources. We will provide recorded data from surveillance cameras as evidence to the local authorities.

Section 4 – Displays and Sales

Describe how marijuana and marijuana products at the retail marijuana store will be displayed and sold:

All marijuana and marijuana products will be kept in display cases until they are sold to a customer. These display cases will be situated so that only employees may access them to handle the marijuana or marijuana product. Once a customer decides on the purchase of a product, the employee will package that marijuana or marijuana product in an approved package and seal it with our retail label before handing it to the customer.

Information binders may be used to describe the different marijuana and marijuana products available for purchase, as samples will not be allowed. Employees will have continued training on new products, so they have the ability to answer any questions customers may have.

Non-marijuana products sold in the store (i.e. smoking devices, pipe cleaners, etc.) may either be located in a display case or on a wall accessible to the consumers. If the non-marijuana product is located in a display case or on a wall behind the counters, only an employee will be allowed to access the product until time of purchase. This will ensure that anything in the display cases will not be accessible to a customer.

I believe that Retail Marijuana license 10873 has an onsite consumption plan that has already been approved by the AMCO board.

I base my belief after reading the letter released by Sara Chambers, sent Feb. 3, regarding a clarification of onsite consumption, as well as the AMCO Board discussion that took place regarding the approval of my retail license (10873 - The Stoney Moose) at the Dec. 6, 2016, AMCO Board Meeting.

In the Feb. 3, 2017, letter by Ms. Chambers, there is a sentence that reads: *Retail store licenses that have board-approved onsite consumption operating plans may allow customers to consume products purchased on site per 3 AAC 306.305(a).*

If you look throughout forms MJ-01, MJ-02, and MJ-03 of my retail application, I clearly describe in detail the operating plan of our onsite consumption lounge. Furthermore, I clearly define on form MJ-02 the designated area where consumption would take place; this area was clearly separated from my retail store. Form MJ-03 clearly describes exactly how the Stoney Moose Lounge would work, including the table tracking system.

During my license review at the Dec. 6 AMCO Board Meeting, I (Mark Woodward) was told by the AMCO Board members Mark Springer and Peter Mlynarik about the fact that my application included my onsite consumption plans, including the detailed security plans/counter plans for the onsite consumption areas, and that the board was not "licensing any consumption areas at this time." I replied that I knew the board would soon approve the final onsite regulations. My reply began a discussion started by then-Commissioner Cynthia Franklin asking if the board wanted to just approve my retail area or the entire application that included the onsite consumption operating plans. After some discussion between board members, the next thing I know the board unanimously approved my entire license application. 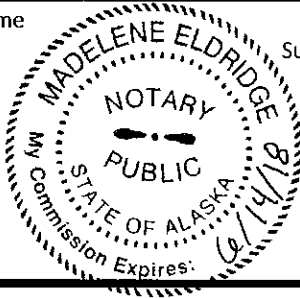

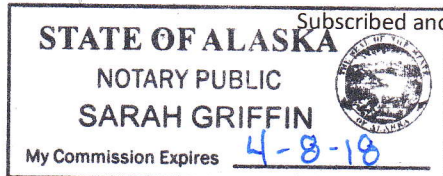

(2) A MARIJUANA PRODUCT MANUFACTURING FACILITY MAY TRANSPORT A MARIJUANA PRODUCT TO ANOTHER MARIJUANA PRODUCT MANUFACTURING FACILITY, A MARIJUANA TESTING FACILITY, OR A MARIJUANA RETAIL STORE;

(3) A MARIJUANA TESTING FACILITY MAY TRANSPORT MARIJUANA OR A MARIJUANA PRODUCT TO THE FACILITY FROM WHICH IT RECEIVED THE MARIJUANA OR ANOTHER MARIJUANA TESTING FACILITY;

(4) A RETAIL MARIJUANA STORE MAY TRANSPORT MARIJUANA OR A MARIJUANA PRODUCT TO ANOTHER RETAIL MARIJUANA STORE.]
