Your attention is directed to 3AAC 306.430(c)(2) which reads in part (c) A marijuana cultivation facility shall ensure that any marijuana at the marijuana cultivation facility (2) does not emit an odor that is detectable by the public from outside the cultivation facility except as specifically allowed by a local government approval.

3 AAC 306.805 provides that upon receipt of a Notice of Violation, a licensee may request to appear before the board and be heard regarding the Notice of Violation. The request must be made within ten days after receipt of the Notice of Violation. A licensee may respond, either orally or in writing to the Notice. 3 AAC 306.810 (2)(A)(B)(C) failed, within a reasonable time after receiving a notice of violation, to correct any defect that is the subject of the notice of violation of AS 17.8 or this chapter.

Dear AMCO Enforcement:

Great Northern Cannabis, Inc. (“Great Northern”) is writing in response to the Notice of a violation of 3 AAC 306.430(c)(2) received from the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office, Enforcement Division by email on November 12, 2021. We appreciate your efforts and for bringing this matter to our attention. Great Northern takes regulatory compliance seriously and takes pride in being a good neighbor.

Factual Circumstance

The Notice states, “On 11-11-21, 1555 hours, I was travelling south on King St from 76th Ave. As I approached Blinds Unlimited, I began to smell the distinct odor of unburnt marijuana emanating from R.C. Tinderbox. I continued south on King St. and turned east on Calista Ct. The odor was still very noticeable. I then turned north on to Schoon St. I could still smell the marijuana. As I was passing AK Joint, I could not detect the odor. From Schoon St. I turned west onto 77th St. and (*sic*) departed the area. The wind was blowing from the north.”

Actions Taken

At the time the Notice was issued, Great Northern had already engaged Jernstrom Engineering to assist with improving the building’s mechanical equipment and odor mitigation capabilities in accord with our continued improvement and maintenance of the 7801 King St. facility. In August 2021, we ordered a larger, more advanced Camfil industrial carbon air filter to scrub exhaust of cannabis odor. On December 7, 2021, the unit was installed; we believe this fully addresses the facility’s odor shortcomings. (See Attachment A, photos of the filter.)

Conclusion

We encourage AMCO Enforcement to re-inspect the premises and to share their findings with Great Northern. If AMCO finds evidence of marijuana odor at the lot line, we request that AMCO inform us immediately, so that we can reassess the situation and take additional corrective measures. However, we are confident that marijuana odor is no longer an issue and, in that case, respectfully request that no further action be taken with respect to this Notice.

Alaska Cannabis Exchange received the above referenced NOV dated January 3rd, 2022, via email on Wednesday January 5th. On January 3rd we began harvesting one of our rooms. We followed our strict policy of procedures which includes turning our exhaust fan to the off position during handling and processing of harvests. We use these protocols after determining their efficacies through our neighbor's responses on whether they can detect the smell of marijuana while we are harvesting when there is no air being exhausted. While this has resolved most of the issues concerning complaints, we continue our research and development to ensure that everything that can be mitigated is performed.

Did AMCO Enforcement receive a complaint which prompted Investigators to drive by? Did Investigators notice anyone entering or exiting the front door? It was indicated in the NOV that Investigators were around W. 47th Avenue near our location at 12:47pm but after review of our camera footage we could not find evidence given the scope of coverage that consists of just the corner of Harding Drive and the first 400 feet of W. 47th Avenue. For us to continue mitigating any issues in the future it is imperative that we have every detail surrounding any complaint so that we may target specific actions that we may or may not have taken during these processes.

Alaska Cannabis Exchange works closely with our neighbors and is diligently striving for a "no complaint policy". In fact, Alaska Cannabis Exchange received no complaints or NOV's for 2 years between July 1st, 2019, and June 30th, 2021. We will continue addressing these issues moving forward and kindly ask Enforcement and/or Investigators to please inform us immediately (either by phone or in person) upon any findings of fact so that we may address in real time to determine any circumstances that we may or may not have performed in our processes and in our continued mitigation of any issues in the future.

Dear MCB and Enforcement Team:

This letter is in response to the *Notice of Violation* (NOV), dated **February 15th, 2022**, in regard to odor, under 3 AAC 306.430(c)(2), against AlaskaSense, LLC. We respectfully request that this NOV be dismissed by either Enforcement or the MCB as it is deficient and lacks the requirements to be a valid NOV.

The NOV, which has been attached for ease of reference, lists the “Issuing Investigator” in this case (AM#220257) as J. Rukes, with a date of **February 15th, 2022**. In the body of the NOV, where the alleged account of the violation is detailed, it states “*Chief Investigator Hoelscher smelled a strong marijuana smell coming from Alaskasense located at 521 W Tudor Rd Unit 202, Anchorage Alaska on 2/14/22 at 15:15 hrs.*” There are no other facts – it does not indicate where Chief Hoelscher was at when he smelled the odor, what direction the wind was blowing, what details lead him to believe it was being omitted from the AlaskaSense facility. These details are important to whether the NOV has the required elements to be imposed against the licensed facility.

The NOV states the regulation that was violated as 3 AAC 306.430(c)(2), which states in relevant part: *a marijuana cultivation facility shall ensure that any marijuana at the marijuana cultivation facility ..(2)does not emit an odor that is detectable by the public from outside the cultivation facility except as specifically allowed by a local government approval.* *Emphasis added.* In Anchorage, Title 21 at 21.05.055(6) provides that a licensed facility be required to not allow marijuana smell to be detected at the lot line of the property on which the licensed facility sits:

The premises shall be ventilated so that the odor of marijuana cannot be detected by a person with a normal sense of smell at any lot line of the subject property.

Id. Because the NOV lacks any information as to where Chief Hoelscher was when he smelled the odor (i.e. he could have been right outside of the facility but within the property lines, which per local code is not a violation of the odor rules) the NOV fails to establish any facts that actually show an alleged violation. The key fact as to where Chief Hoelscher smelled the odor is needed to assess whether 3 AAC 306.430(c)(2) was violated because the regulation allows for the local government to set a different standard than the state. And the local government has indeed set a different standard, the smell cannot go over the property lines, which is different from the state


regulations, which is more stringent and states that the smell cannot be detected outside of the licensed cultivation facility.

With the fine chart coming online soon and the fact there will soon be real penalties incurred for smell violations, we felt it was important to take a stand on this NOV and request it be dismissed and removed from AlaskaSense's license file because it is deficient in regards to setting forth the factual basis of the NOV. We know Enforcement is working hard, we thank them for their ongoing commitment to ensuring the sustainability of our industry with proper enforcement. We also know that sometimes there's just not enough time to document all the details, but with that said, AMCO is moving towards a model where these types of violations are going to cost Licensees real money and therefore the expectation is there be a solid factual basis to bring forth a NOV against the license.

AlaskaSense, LLC (AlaskaSense) has been continuously working to improve on their facility's odor control methods with regular maintenance, upgrades, and additions in their air filtration systems, as well as being overly cautious and changing out *all* of the systems' filters every 90 days, which is far more often than the manufacturer's recommendations call for of once per year. As of January, 2022, there are now eight (8) HVAC systems, four (4) carbon filtration systems and fans, and two (2) 12 inch by 48 inch CanLite charcoal filters with 1800 cfm fans. AlaskaSense appreciates Enforcement and wants to make clear to the MCB that Enforcement has been and continues to do an excellent job for our industry and this request is meant as no disrespect to the Enforcement team – but this particular NOV is deficient and AlaskaSense is concerned that it is receiving odor complaints that are in fact actually not attributable to their facility and may be coming from a personal use garden in the area. AlaskaSense continues to be fully committed in their upgrades and improvements to ensure they are in compliance.

This memo is provided as a supplement to Investigator Rukes NOV, AM220257.

On 2-14-2022 at approximately 1515 hours, I was traveling westbound on Tudor Road. My windows were rolled up, but my vehicle was pulling in outside air.

As I passed Cannabaska/AlaskaSense, my vehicle was overwhelmed by an extremely powerful odor of marijuana. I could smell the marijuana from the point I passed Cannabaska/AlaskaSense and when I was at the intersection of Tudor Road and Arctic. While at the intersection, I rolled down my window, observed a steady wind from the North - Northeast, also verified by observing smoke exit vehicle exhaust from in front of me. There was a fog and high humidity when I passed, I know from personal experience and my Investigative experience that when there is a temperature inversion and higher humidity, the odor of marijuana is more prevalent and tends to be stronger.

The wind direction was NNE, approximately 5 mph during this, verified by www.wunderground.com.

I contacted Jason Davies at AMCO and requested he send a second Investigator to verify odor was originating from AlaskaSense.

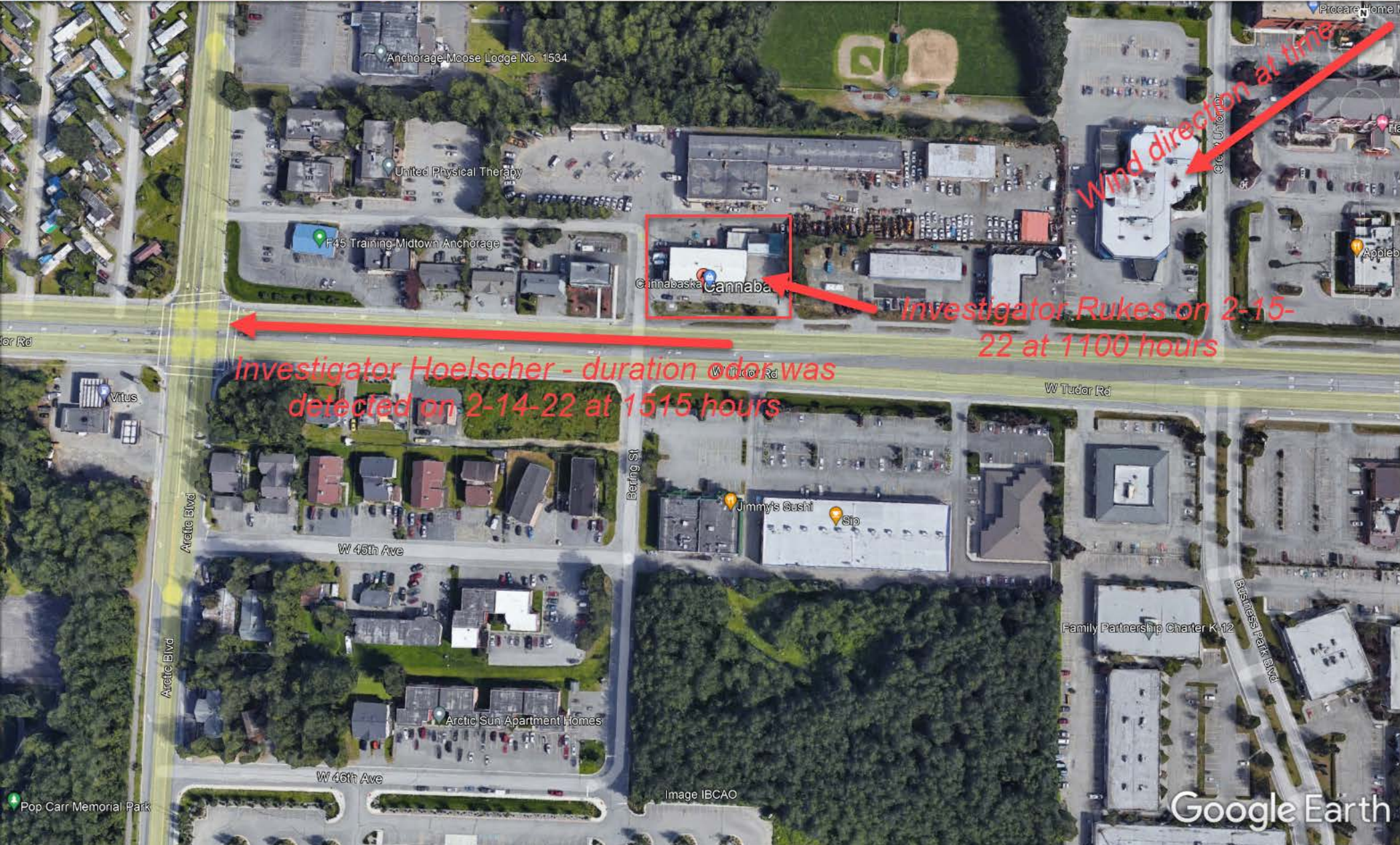
I was informed that Investigator Rukes verified odor of marijuana on 2-15-22, he stated that he could not smell it from the road, however, he detected the odor of marijuana blowing from the East side of building towards West portion of the parking lot.

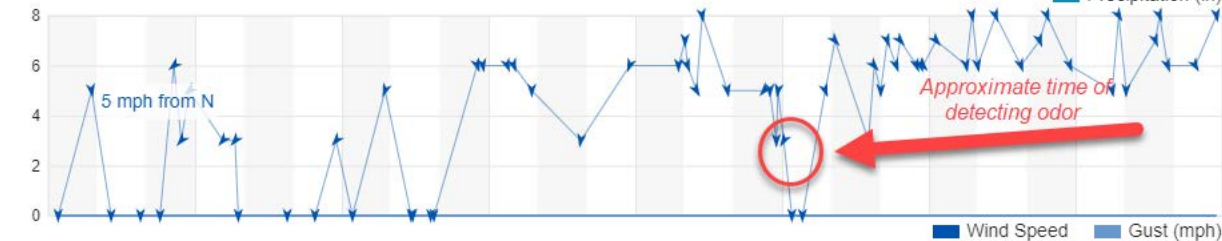
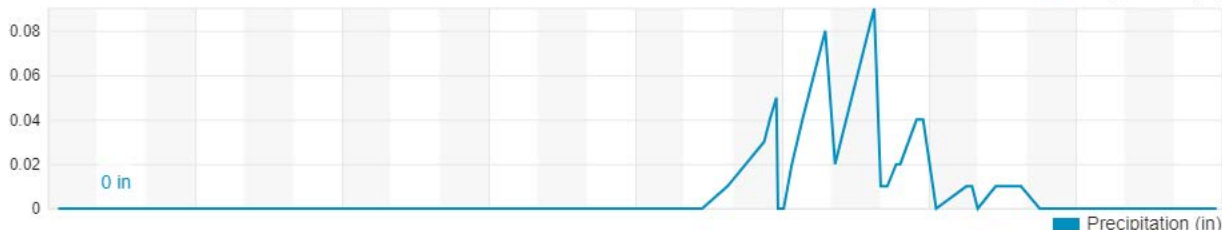
