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## 2. COVID - 19 Status Report

The board reviewed the letters from Commissioner Crum, DHSS, and the Alaska State Hospital and Nursing Home Association. The letters concerned the need to expedite licensure for healthcare providers to assist in dealing with the current COVID – 19 pandemic in the state.

## 3. Proposed Solutions

Harriet Milks introduced draft regulations for an emergency courtesy license to meet the needs of a possible shortage of healthcare providers during the pandemic. The regulations allow the board to determine what an "urgent situation" means for purposes of obtaining the courtesy license.

Dr. Daugherty left the meeting at 5:08 p.m.

## 4. Adoption of Emergency Regulations- 12 AAC 40.010, 40.015, 40.035, 40.045, 40.963- Emergency Courtesy License

The board reviewed the draft as presented. The emergency courtesy license regulation language was changed by making the courtesy license valid for six months, with a six-month extension if requested. It was noted the emergency courtesy license holder would be required to obtain a full permanent license if they want to continue working in the state. A letter would be sent with the initial courtesy license notifying the provider of the expiration date and the requirement to obtain a permanent license.

On a motion duly made by Dr. Parker and seconded by Dr. Freeman, the medical board recognized the emergency and declared the emergency, and moves the regulation project forward as an emergency regulation with the intent to make the regulations permanent.

Dr. Wein introduced two letters from The Alaska Hospitalist Group, LLC and Alaska Trauma & Acute Care Surgery, LLC, that were submitted regarding licensing during the COVID – 19 pandemic. The letters requested the board to continue screening applicants with the current "rigorous" process.

## 5. MICP – COVID-19 Scope of Practice

The board reviewed the proposed extended scope of authorized activities of a mobile intensive care paramedic for the current COVID – 19 pandemic, submitted by Dr. Michael Levy.

After allowing Dr. Levy to expound on the letter, and in accordance with 12 AAC 40.370(d), the board voted to authorize mobile intensive care paramedics extended scope of authorized activities.

On a motion duly made by Dr. Parker, seconded by Dr. Freeman, and approved by roll call vote, the board authorizes MICPs to perform the following under 12 AAC 40.370(d),

- 1. Provide services requested by DHSS Public Health Department including but not limited to immunizations, SARS-CoV2 testing, assessment and treatment of patients in accordance to authorized treatment protocols at alternative sites of care during declared disasters;
- 2. Physical assessment of patients at the direction of medical director;

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1 3. Treatment of conditions within the scope of training, education and practice for which the 2 sponsoring physician has credentialed the provider; 3 4. Dispensing of medications at the direction of the sponsoring physician by standing, or direct 4 order; 5 5. Active interventions for high volume users of the 911 system; 6 6. Welfare checks at the request of case management to include patient assessments, dressing 7 changes, medication management for patients waiting for Home Health or Hospice evaluation; 8 9 through March 1, 2021, in response to the COVID - 19 pandemic.
