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26	2. Military Courtesy License Requirements/Overview
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28	Chair Wein invited Ms. Norberg to provide an overview of a new state law, effective January 1, 2022.
29	The law requires the division and all professional boards to create an expedited process (within 30 days

Chair Wein invited Ms. Norberg to provide an overview of a new state law, effective January 1, 2022. The law requires the division and all professional boards to create an expedited process (within 30 days of application) for active duty military personnel and their spouses the ability to obtain professional licensure for those individuals who hold a "substantially equivalent unencumbered license." This new mandate will require the Board to adopt new regulations and application form and for staff to develop and implement an expedited review process for military personnel. Division staff recommend modifying the existing Emergency Courtesy License application and the process adopted for this application type for the new Military Courtesy Medical License.

Board members were invited to ask questions and discuss any concerns. Dr. Parker inquired about whether it would be possible for the Board to grant full licensure, rather than a 180-day time limited courtesy license to military applicants. The pros and cons of this option were explored. Dr. Wein raised concerns about specific language included in the law that could potentially lead to future legal challenges such as the issue of determining "substantially equivalent" and the requirement that eligible spouses be both "married to and living with" each other. The proposal to modify the existing Emergency Courtesy License application was explored with members reviewing the current ECL application and agreeing that they would like the opportunity to review and provide feedback on the new Military Courtesy Medical License application before it is implemented.

3. Review of Proposed Regulation Change
