36 **Agenda Item - Public Comment**

37 There is no public comment on applications. Continuing education applications are discussed later in the
38 meeting but there is no public comment during this time. If the person is online during application
39 review and the questions about their application come up, we can then ask that individual for
40 clarification or needed information.

42 Lucia Roncalli – Discussed Somatic Experiencing training in Anchorage February 2024, and the need for it
43 in Alaska. Expressed the need for continuing education for this topic. This is a three-year cycle. We have
44 trainers that are Reiker Practitioner, LPC, LCSW, SW, LMFT, and me, Medical Doctor. Trainers must have
45 equivalent experience to a master’s degree, but not necessarily a master’s degree. If the Board wants
46 further discussion at the review period this afternoon, I’d be glad to come in at that time.

47 Regarding this continuing education, licensed professional counselors is aware. It is best to start with
48 licensed marital and family therapists and then discuss this with social work. Several OT and PT are
49 aware and intrigued by this. DVR loves this, contacted me years ago and made presentations to them on
50 this topic.

51 Renee Carabajal – If this Board approves this CE because it is a multi-disciplinary course it would be
52 accepted by the other Boards, you will not have to seek individual support from the other Boards.

53 **Agenda Item - Regulations Review**

54 Review and update jurisprudence exam. It’s 10 years old and needs to be made current.

55

56 Graduate Educational Experience (Associates) - For Marital and Family Therapy Theory and Marital and
57 Family Studies, there isn’t a space for how many credits those courses are worth. The Marital and Family
58 Therapy application was updated in 2023 where the associate’s application has not been updated since
59 2019. The publications team is working on updating the associate’s application.

60

61 Associate License Under Statutes - License for supervised practice. It is a 4-year associate license. There
62 is no renewal. The individual has no ability to practice under this license once the 4-year time limit is up.
63 Does the Board want to recommend any changes to this? AAMFT what are their recommendations?

64 What does California do? California does not have an associate license. Because of the remote nature, it
65 would be great to provide some way to extend based on extenuating circumstances and then the Board
66 can decide on whether circumstances are appropriate. What did you find in states that do have this in
67 their statutes? Alabama has it being able to be able to renew; licensees must complete continuing
68 education to be able to renew. Arizona did not have a specific time limit on theirs. Section 08.63.110c
69 language states may not be renewed. Are you proposing to change language? Yes, to read may be
70 renewed with approval from the Board based off hardship.

71 LMFTA application and Section 08.63.110b2 has a discrepancy. There is nowhere in the application
 72 where the applicant must list where the practice is going to occur. The application should be congruent
 73 with the statute. This also needs to be added to the plan of supervision and verification of clinical
 74 experience. There is an incongruency with Section 08.63.120(2) and the LMFTA application for a different
 75 person to be the group supervisor. Renee to get with publication specialist to look at LMFTA what
 76 changes can be made to meet need of applicant, supervisors, and Board. Renee to email applications to
 77 board so the Board can review and make sure all necessary changes are made.

78 Renee recommended to the Board that the division seek that this be a department sponsored change.

79 "Instead of changing to 'may be renewed,' the better language for Section 08.63.110c may be 'a license
 80 for supervised practice expires 4 years from the date of issuance but may be extended at the discretion
 81 of the Board for extenuating circumstances.'"

82 **In a motion duly made by Richard Clampitt, seconded by Kayla Green with unanimous consent, the**
 83 **Board would like to request that the division seek a statutory change to Section 08.63.110c to amend**
 84 **the language to read a license for supervised practice expires (4) four years from date of issuance and**
 85 **may be extended at the discretion of the Board for extenuating circumstances.**

Regulation Recommendations Proposed Legislation for FY 2024

12 AAC 19.320.(b)(10) Training may be synchronous method or by individual study.

(A) Individual study may fulfill up to one-half of the requirements for renewal and can be conducted through completion of a formal correspondence program, non-synchronous video or streaming, or other individual study program. Individual study programs will only be accepted if;

1. the program requires registration and provides evidence of successful completion; or
2. the licensee submits a signed statement verifying that the licensee has successfully completed the program from a licensee who is a supervisor approved under 12 AAC 19.210 and has supervised the licensee’s study program under this paragraph.

12 AAC 19.990. (4) "one year of supervised clinical practice" means one academic year consisting of minimum of 12 months of active clinical practice;

12 AAC 19.990. (5) "asynchronous/non-synchronous," means no real-time communication is present or utilized;

12 AAC 19.990 (9) "synchronous" means a real-time interaction in person or by live-streaming.

12 AAC 19.990(10) "Another jurisdiction" means another state or district licensing Marital and Family Therapists that has similar requirements to the state of Alaska according to the Alaska Board of Marital and Family Therapists.

196 **Agenda Item - License Portability/Compact Work-Group Discussion**

197 Seventeen individuals are interested in participating as part of a work group. Use criteria as fully licensed
198 as first cut off for work group. Consider geography as part of cut off. Concern discussed about each state
199 getting only one vote towards their license requirements and this could pose a real issue for Alaska. One
200 aspect of the work group can be to answer some of the specific questions the Board has regarding the
201 compact. Another aspect of the work group could be to answer questions as to why the Board is not in
202 support of a compact. AAMFT has done a lot of research on compacts, the group could look at what
203 other states are doing regarding compacts for LMFTs. From a division standpoint the work group should
204 look at the legislative hurdles surrounding compacts. The list of seventeen individuals will be sent to the
205 Board for review with recommendation of who should sit on the work group. Shawnmarie Carpenter has
206 one 30-minute timeframe available to spend time with the work group.

207

208 Some of the things we would like the work group to focus on are legislative hurdles, limited voice in
209 compact, uniqueness of Alaska, financial impact on licensed MFT's, pay on insurance, specifically cost of
210 being a part of the compact, how many licensees would we need in the compact to make it feasible for
211 Alaska, what are some of the benefits to be a part of a compact.

212 Have one member of the work group give an update at the next Board meeting.

213 **Agenda Item - Future Meeting Dates**

214 We looked at meeting in Juneau on January 18th to discuss recommendations for proposed legislation.
215 Also looked at having in-person meetings in Anchorage in April or May. Recommendation is to meet with
216 local legislators first and to hold off meeting in Juneau for the time being. Next meeting will be in
217 Anchorage January 18th in-person meeting. Board meetings are required to be public noticed 20 days
218 prior to the Board meeting. The agenda is available two weeks prior to the Board meeting. Tentative
219 Board meeting date set for April 11th in-person or via Zoom to be determined.

220 Need to look at technological loop being closed. We may not need to meet as much if the technological
221 loop of voting is closed. Communication of whether our vote is being received or not would be great. If
222 you are voting anything other than yes, then please email vote to Renee or Jeanne as well as voting in
223 Onboard.

224 **Agenda Item - New Business**

225 The annual report is the best way to present proposed legislation to the local legislators via emails,
226 letters, and phone calls.

During the coming fiscal year (FY24), the board will pursue amendments to legislation and statutes, specifically:

Sec. 08.63.100. Qualifications for license to practice. (a) (B) (i) nine semester or twelve quarter hours of course work in marital and family therapy; (ii) nine semester or twelve quarter hours of course work in marital and family studies; (iii) nine semester or twelve quarter hours of course work in human development; (iv) three semester or four quarter hours of course work in professional studies or professional ethics and law; (v) three semester or four quarter hours of course work in research; and (vi) nine semester or twelve quarter hours of supervised clinical practice in marital and family therapy; (C) after receiving a degree described in (B) of this paragraph, has practiced supervised marital and family therapy in Alaska or another jurisdiction, including 1,700 hours of clinical contact with couples, individuals, and families; the 1,700 hours of clinical contact must include at least 200 hours of individual or group supervision approved by the board, at least 100 hours of which must be individual supervision;

Sec. 08.63.120. (b)(2) (D) Delete an advanced practice registered nurse under AS 08.68 who is certified to provide psychiatric or mental health services by an entity recognized by the Board of Nursing;

Sec. 08.63.130. Delete Temporary license for the practice of marital and family therapy. (a) The board shall issue a temporary license for the practice of marital and family therapy to an applicant who satisfies the requirements of AS 08.63.100(a)(1), (2), and (3)(A), (B), and (C) and has been approved by the board to take the marital and family therapy examination. (b) A person may practice under a temporary license until the board issues the results of the first marital and family therapy examination given after issuance of the person's temporary license and either issues or denies a license under AS 08.63.100 to the person. (c) If a licensee under this section fails the marital and family therapy examination, the board may not renew the person's temporary license.

Add, Senior license for the practice of marital and family therapy. (a) The board shall issue a senior license for the practice of marital and family therapy to an applicant who has been licensed in the state of Alaska under this chapter for over 10 years and is collecting Social Security benefits due to reaching retirement age.

Sec. 08.63.900. Definitions. Delete (3) "course" means a class in a graduate program at an accredited educational institution or an institution approved by the board;

Sec 08.63.900 (5) (b) (6) "supervision" means synchronous consultation, direction, review, evaluation, and assessment of the practice of the person being supervised, including direct observation and the review of case presentations, audio recordings, and video recordings

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The value with compact is the ability to support our members in Alaska as they travel or transition to a new state.

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Discussed possibility of changing statute so travelers can continue seeing their therapists without threat of criminal offense. Agenda item for next meeting to look at language allowing for grace period or courtesy licensure. Renee to propose this to law about amending the statute regarding this. Scope of teletherapy practice may be a good place to put this language. We can look at limiters next meeting.

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In a motion duly made by Shawnmarie Carpenter, seconded by Richard Clampitt with unanimous consent, to amend 12 AAC 19.400 Scope of Teletherapy Practice to add (b) provisions for traveling/transitioning clients to maintain continuity of care with established provider within limited parameters. Specific language for parameters to be determined by board following department of law review for statutory authority prior to public comment period.
