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Alaska Business Opportunities Presented at Summit

(Juneau, AK) — Representatives of Alaska's Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development joined nearly 1,500 government officials and suppliers last week at the Walmart U.S. Manufacturing Summit to advance American renewal in manufacturing and rebuild opportunities for America's middle class. The summit, at the Orlando Convention Center, presented Walmart's recent initiative to purchase an additional \$50 billion in U.S.-made products over the next 10 years.
