Since 2016, AlaSkins has been manufacturing high-quality pet treats using wild Alaskan fish skins that would otherwise go to waste. AlaSkins has demonstrated a

commitment to innovation in their efficient use of fish byproducts and their development of a variety of treats for dogs and cats. AlaSkins products include dried fish skin treats, canned fish, and CBD "calming" pet snacks. There are separate product lines for both dogs and cats.

AlaSkins has overcome significant challenges as a small business in its seven years of operation. During the COVID pandemic years, AlaSkins persevered and managed to grow from an in-home operation to a full-scale production facility with a storefront. AlaSkins products are now sold in 72 stores throughout the state and can be ordered online to ship anywhere in the U.S.

AlaSkins has been a proud sponsor of a variety of organizations, including Kenai Peninsula Animals Lovers Rescue (KPAL) and Kenai Animal Shelter, as well as local 4H clubs and events, high school sports teams, the Kenai River Brown Bears hockey games, the Copper Basin 300 Sled Dog Race, individual Iditarod mushers, community senior centers, and the Kenai Watershed Forum. They are heavily involved in the local community and were recognized as the Soldotna Business of the Year for 2022.

From AlaSkins founder and owner Sara Erickson: "I am thrilled to be recognized by the State of Alaska and given the award of Manufacturer of the Year. Exploring new ways to eliminate waste, specifically by turning what was once considered commercial fish waste into a valuable resource, and generating new revenue and economic growth for the State of Alaska is my continued vision and mission of AlaSkins. The recognizable mother bear and cub symbol assure consumers that a product was produced in Alaska by local manufacturers and artisans.

The Made in Alaska program is used to identify and promote the purchase of products manufactured or crafted in Alaska, ranging from small gift items to large industrial products.
