ACCUSATION AND ORDER OF REVOCATION

- On March 9th, 2021, the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Division of Insurance (Division) issued
 KELLY S WILLIAMS (WILLIAMS), domiciled in the State of South
 Carolina an Insurance Producer license number 3001211883 to transact
 the business of Property and Casualty insurance. The license has an expiration date of April 30th on odd numbered years.
- 2. On or about April 12th, 2023, WILLIAMS applied to renew the insurance producer license. Upon review of the renewal application, WILLIAMS responded negatively to background question 1A. WILLIAMS has indicated no misdemeanor conviction to report to the State of Alaska.

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- 3. The Producer Database and the Attachment Warehouse reflects that WILLIAMS has a misdemeanor conviction effective June 9th, 2009. The said conviction was not disclosed to the Division at initial application.
- 4. The Producer Database further reflects administrative actions taken against WILLIAMS by the State of Louisiana and Washington in 2021, and by the State of Washington, South Carolina, Delaware, Louisiana, and South Dakota all in 2022. All said administrative actions were not disclosed timely to the Division.
- On April 14th, 2023, correspondence was provided to WILLIAMS
 informing of its incomplete application and assessing \$400 for late
 disclosure. WILLIAMS failed to pay the assessed fee and did not respond
 to the Division.
- On May 3rd and June 3rd, 2023, expiration notices were provided to
 WILLIAMS informing that the license had expired for failure to renew.
- 7. WILLIAMS was in violation for failing to report its administrative actions to the Division which subjects WILLIAMS to civil penalties pursuant to Alaska Statute (AS) 21.27.440(a) "in addition to any other penalties provided by law, a person that the director (director) determines under AS 21.06.170-21.06.240 has violated the provisions of this chapter is subject to (1) a civil penalty equal to the compensation promised, paid, or to be paid, directly or indirectly, to a person in regard to each violation; (2) either a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000 for each violation or a civil penalty of not more than \$25,000 for each violation if the director

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determines that the person willfully violated the provisions of this chapter; and (3) denial, nonrenewal, suspension, or revocation of a license." The director has the latitude to impose civil penalties against a person who has violated Alaska's insurance laws.

- 8. AS 21.27.020(a) provides: "For the protection of the people of this state, the director may not issue or renew a license except in compliance with this chapter and not issue a license to a person, or to be exercised by a person, found by the director to be untrustworthy, incompetent, or who has not established to the satisfaction of the director that the person is qualified under this chapter."
- AS 21.27.020(b)(4) provides: "To qualify for issuance or renewal of an individual license, an applicant or licensee shall (4) be a trustworthy person."
- 10. AS 21.27.025(a) states that "(a) A licensee shall notify the director in writing not later than 30 days after a change in residence, place of business, legal name, fictitious name or alias, mailing address, electronic mailing address, telephone number, or compliance officer. A licensee shall report to the director in writing any administrative action taken against the licensee by a governmental agency of another state, by a governmental agency of another jurisdiction, or by a financial industry regulatory authority sanction or arbitration proceeding not later than 30 days after the final disposition of the action. A licensee shall submit to the director the final order and other relevant legal documents in the action. A licensee

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
