## ACCUSATION AND ORDER OF REVOCATION

1. On or about February 21, 2023, the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Division of Insurance (Division) received a renewal application for an Independent Adjuster license to adjust the business of Casualty, and Property lines of authority insurance for WHITAKER, domiciled in the State of Texas. The initial license was issued May 5, 2017. The license has an expiration date of April $30^{\text {th }}$ on odd numbered years.
2. Upon review of the renewal application, it was discovered WHITAKER responded negatively to background question 1A at initial licensure.

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WHITAKER indicated no criminal conviction to report to the State of Alaska.
3. The Producer Database and the Attachment Warehouse reflects WHITAKER has criminal history a misdemeanor conviction in 2002 which was not disclosed to the Division.
4. WHITAKER submitted a written statement in the National Insurance Producer Registry's Attachment Warehouse in January 9 ${ }^{\text {th }}, 2016$ but responded negatively at initial application and at renewal, which did not prompt review of the Attachment Warehouse.
5. On August $29^{\text {th }}, 2023$, correspondence was provided to WHITAKER informing of incomplete application and for failure to notify the Division of her criminal history. The Division issued a Stipulation Agreement and Order Number SR23-15 imposing a civil penalty of \$250.
6. On September $14^{\text {th }}, 2023$, the Division sent a follow-up correspondence via email. WHITAKER failed to pay the assessed fee and did not respond to the Division.
7. WHITAKER was in violation for failing to report her criminal history to the Division which subjects WHITAKER to civil penalties pursuant to Alaska Statute (AS) 21.27.440(a) "in addition to any other penalties provided by law, a person that the director (director) determines under AS 21.06.170-21.06.240 has violated the provisions of this chapter is subject to (1) a civil penalty equal to the compensation promised, paid, or to be paid, directly or indirectly, to a person in regard to each violation; (2)
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either a civil penalty of not more than $\$ 10,000$ for each violation or a civil penalty of not more than $\$ 25,000$ for each violation if the director determines that the person willfully violated the provisions of this chapter; and (3) denial, nonrenewal, suspension, or revocation of a license." The director has the latitude to impose civil penalties against a person who has violated Alaska's insurance laws.
8. AS 21.27.020(a) provides: "For the protection of the people of this state, the director may not issue or renew a license except in compliance with this chapter and not issue a license to a person, or to be exercised by a person, found by the director to be untrustworthy, incompetent, or who has not established to the satisfaction of the director that the person is qualified under this chapter."
9. AS 21.27.020(b)(4) provides: "To qualify for issuance or renewal of an individual license, an applicant or licensee shall (4) be a trustworthy person."
10. AS 21.27 .025 (a) states that "(a) A licensee shall notify the director in writing not later than 30 days after a change in residence, place of business, legal name, fictitious name or alias, mailing address, electronic mailing address, telephone number, or compliance officer. A licensee shall report to the director in writing any administrative action taken against the licensee by a governmental agency of another state, by a governmental agency of another jurisdiction, or by a financial industry regulatory authority sanction or arbitration proceeding not later than 30 days after the ALICIA WHITAKER
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final disposition of the action. A licensee shall submit to the director the final order and other relevant legal documents in the action. A licensee shall report to the director any criminal prosecution of the licensee in this or another state or jurisdiction not later than 30 days after the date of filing of the criminal complaint, indictment, information, or citation in the prosecution. The licensee shall submit to the director a copy of the criminal complaint, calendaring order, and other relevant legal documents in the prosecution."
11. AS $21.27 .025(\mathrm{~b})$ states that "(b) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a failure to notify the director as required by this section is cause for denial, nonrenewal, suspension, or revocation of a license."

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, under the provisions of AS 21.27.440, that WHITAKER's Independent Adjuster license number 100143672 is REVOKED for a period of one year.
