Meeting Purpose

- Prioritization - Identify critical projects that, if not completed in 5 years, will negatively impact community safety.

Alaska Community Coastal Protection Project

- **Objective**
 - To increase community sustainability and resilience to the impacts of natural hazards.
- **Essential Components**
 - Strong community leadership
 - Agency support and collaboration
 - Careful, effective planning

Importance of Inter-Agency Working Group

- Coordinated assistance to community to identify and achieve resilience actions, based on conventional funding channels of agencies
- Benefits include:
 - leveraging of resources
 - better coordination of work
 - reduced conflicts in project timelines and construction windows
- Help with identifying policy/funding obstacles to a smooth efficient process (*i.e. disinvestment due to relocation*)

Work Breakdown Structure

- used to break down a project into manageable sections.
- Assists with:
 - Project organization,
 - Assigning responsibilities,
 - Estimation of cost and scheduling,
 - Communicating further definition and detail of each task.

Priorities – Hazard Resiliency Top 5

- Identify critical projects that, if not completed in 5 years, will negatively impact community safety.
- Criteria:
 - Save lives
 - Save property
 - Can it be reused or re-purposed in another location
- Consider:
 - Does it address immediate priorities - Food, water, energy, shelter
 - How does it reflect community priorities – “Shelter in Place”
 - Is there funding available
 - Can it be fully implemented within 5 years
