



Disaster Recovery, Resilience and Mitigation Planning Program

Below is an overview of the planning program included in the state's Approved CDBG-DR Action Plan in response to the 2023 Lower Yukon Floods and the 2024 Juneau Flood. This program is intended to help communities plan for future disasters, design strategies and projects to increase resilience, and mitigate against all hazards. Ultimately, the planning program is designed to support long-term recovery while reducing future risks from flooding, erosion, permafrost degradation, and extreme weather.

Eligibility: Must be a unit of local government, such as local municipalities and Tribal governments, or a nonprofit organization with a regional focus.

Planning activities may include:

- The development of recovery, mitigation, and resilience plans
- Building local capacity to respond to and reduce long-term risk and increase local resilience
- Gathering and analyzing local data and studies to enhance community resilience through comprehensive capital improvements
- Advancing Tribal-led protection-in-place and relocation initiatives critical to long-term community sustainability
- Supporting the success of activities under the Housing, Infrastructure, and Mitigation set-aside programs, such as research, planning, and other activities related to determining site selections for potential relocation strategies
- Funding feasibility studies and engineering designs to determine the safest ways to relocate threatened infrastructure or stop riverbank erosion
- Updating local Hazard Mitigation Plans so the community qualifies for future federal grants
