



Public Service Programs

Below is an overview of the public service programs included in the state's approved CDBG-DR Action Plan in response to the 2023 Lower Yukon Flood and the 2024 Juneau Flood. These programs are designed to assist eligible residents with tools and resources to recover from the impacts of the disaster and to help them become more resilient and better prepared for future disasters.

Eligibility: Households must have been directly impacted by the 2023 Lower Yukon Flood or the 2024 Juneau Flood. Assistance is primarily limited to households with an income at or below 80% Area Median Income, with priority given to renters and homeowners actively participating in the CDBG-DR Housing Program.

Priority for Public Service Programs

Public services will first fund legal services to help resolve title issues for applicants engaged in the CDBG-DR housing program.

Legal Services

- Assistance in resolving title or heirship issues needed to maintain or restore eligibility under the CDBG-DR Homeowner Disaster Recovery Housing Program
- Disaster-related landlord-tenant legal support
- Help to prepare or review documentation needed for disaster recovery programs
- Support for homeowners facing fraud, contractor disputes, or predatory practices
- Assistance in navigating insurance and FEMA processes that affect rehousing

Additional Public Service Programs

The remaining funds will provide additional public services such as:

Education

- Education for homeowners, property owners, and businesses on the benefits of participating in the National Flood Insurance Program
- Workshops, online modules, and coaching focused on disaster preparedness

Housing Support

- Assistance with shelter, relocation, and moving needs
- Support completing disaster-related applications, documentation, and damage assessments
- Fair housing counseling

Disaster Case Management

- Connecting families to disaster-related resources, grants, and technical assistance
- Assistance navigating repairs, insurance, FEMA, and other disaster-related housing impacts
- Financial planning support to help families transition to permanent housing
