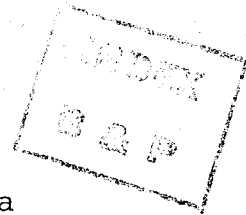

I, LEE McANERNEY, COMMISSIONER of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, do hereby certify that the Local Boundary Commission recommendation entitled:

Recommendation to Correct Errors in the
Boundary Description of the City of Chuathbaluk, Alaska



became effective on March 4, 1976.

A certificate of incorporation for the City of Chuathbaluk, a city of the second class, was issued by the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to AS 29.18.120 on May 9, 1975. In transcribing the boundary description of the City of Chuathbaluk from the Local Boundary Commission's order, an administrative error was made to wit: reference to the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 13, T17N, R55W rather than the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 13, T17N, R55W;

The Local Boundary Commission has determined that the error is of a ministerial rather than of a decisional nature.

A majority of the members of the Commission voted to recommend to the Legislature the corrected boundary description.

THE COMMISSION'S recommendation was presented to the State Legislature pursuant to Article X Section 12 of the Constitution of the State of Alaska.

THE SECOND SESSION of the Ninth State Legislature received the Commission's recommendation on January 19, 1976, the second

day of the legislative session. No resolution of disapproval was introduced.

THEREFORE, the Local Boundary Commission's "Recommendation to Correct Errors in the Boundary Description of the City of Chuathbaluk, Alaska" became effective on March 4, 1976, the forty-sixth day after presentation to the Legislature. The boundary description of the City of Chuathbaluk is as described in the Local Boundary Commission's recommendation to wit:

City of Chuathbaluk

Beginning at the NE corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5, unsurveyed T17N, R55W, Seward Meridian, Alaska; thence Southwesterly to the NE corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 7, T17N, R55W; thence Southeasterly to the NW corner of Section 23, T17N, R55W; thence Northeasterly to the NW corner of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 13, T17N, R55W; thence Northwesterly to the point of beginning, containing 5.8 square miles, more or less.

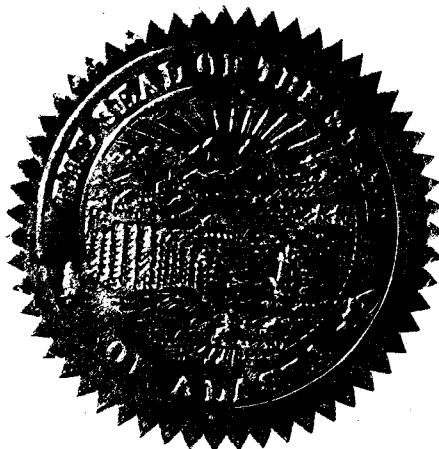

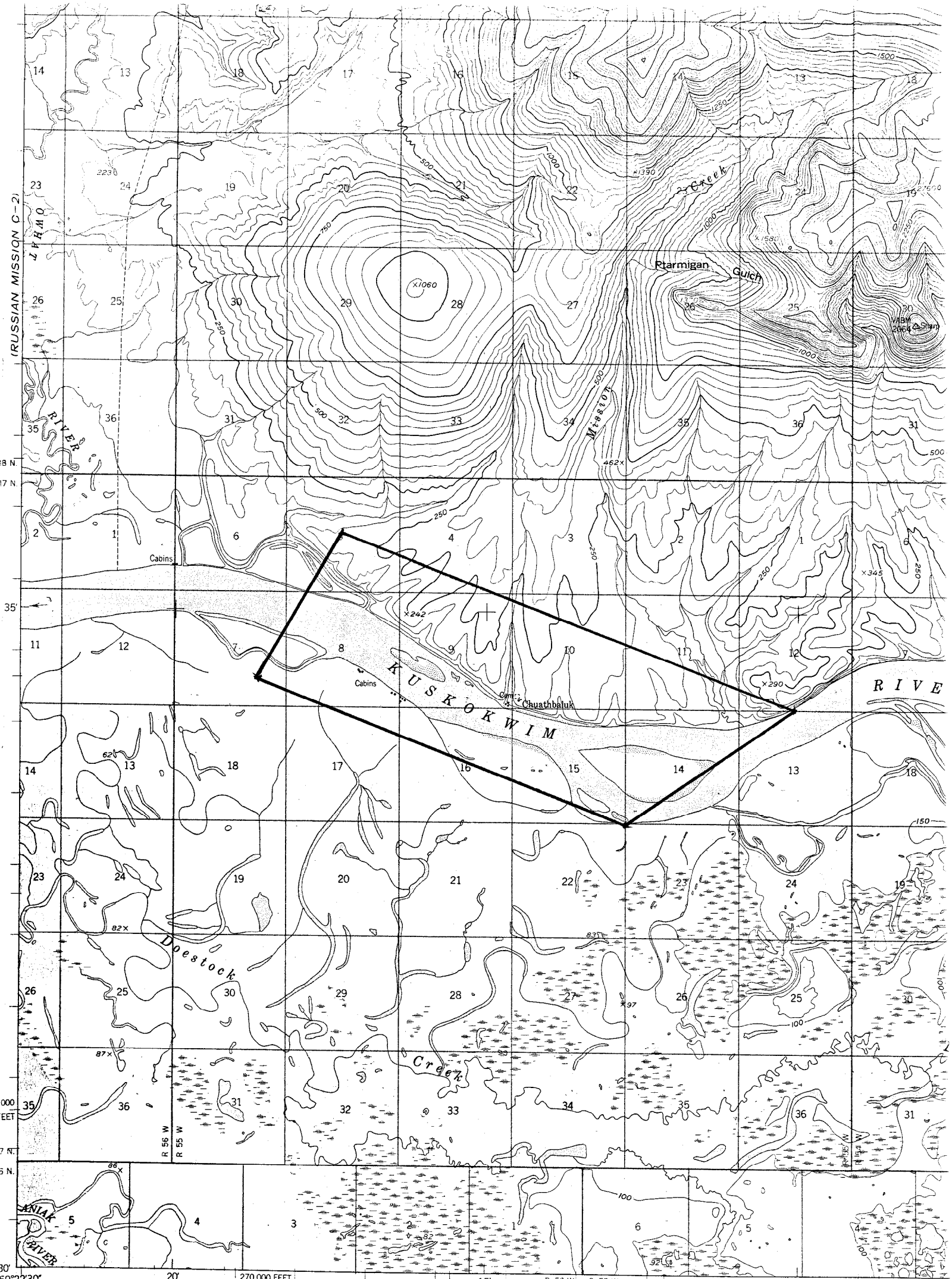

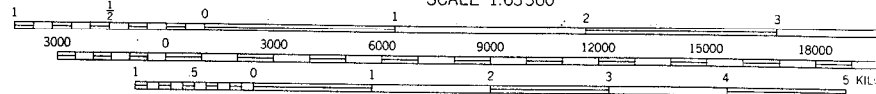
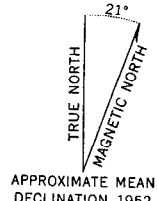
