CERTIFICATE
OF
INCORPORATION OF THE
CITY OF EDNA BAY

By the power and duty vested in me under the laws of the State of Alaska,¹ I, Susan K. Bell, Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, hereby certify that the City of Edna Bay, was duly incorporated as a second class city effective October 2, 2014.² The boundaries described below include approximately 27 square miles of land and water.

The corporate boundaries of the City of Edna Bay are described as follows:

Commencing at the Northwest corner of Section 7, Township 68 S, Range 76 E, of the Copper River Meridian, Alaska: the true point of beginning hereof;

Thence east approximately 31,572 feet to the Northeast corner of Section 12;

Thence south approximately 10,570 feet to the Southeast corner of Section 13;

Thence southwest approximately 19,037 feet to the protracted Southeast corner of Section 34

¹ 3 AAC 110.630(d) states "When the requirements in [3 AAC 110.630(a)] have been met, the department shall issue a certificate describing the effective change." In relevant part, 3 AAC 110.630(a) states "[A] final decision of the commission is effective when (1) notification of compliance with 42 U.S.C. 1973c (Voting Rights Act of 1965) is received from the United States Department of Justice [and] (2) certification of the legally required voter approval of the commission's final decision is received from the director of elections . . ." But, per the U.S. Supreme Court's 2013 decision in *Shelby County v. Holder*, preclearance is no longer required.

² The Local Boundary Commission's written decision granting the petition to incorporate a City of Edna Bay was issued on June 4, 2014. On October 2, 2014, the Director of the State of Alaska Division of Elections certified that by a margin of 33 to 6, voters in the proposed City of Edna Bay had approved the proposal to incorporate. The effective date of the incorporation of the City of Edna Bay is October 2, 2014.
