CERTIFICATION OF RECLASSIFICATION OF CITY OF HYDABURG

THIS CERTIFIES that in compliance with the provisions of AS 29.08.050(c) the Local Boundary Commission, Department of Community and Regional Affairs, State of Alaska, has determined that the City of Hydaburg, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of Alaska, should be reclassified as a city of the first class. The Commission's decision to reclassify said city as a city of the first class has been published according to law; there have been no objections thereto to require the Commission to submit its reclassification to the Legislature of the State of Alaska and said decision is final.

THIS FURTHER CERTIFIES that effective September 1, 1973, the City of Hydaburg is reclassified as a city of the first class, with all rights, powers and duties associated therewith.



ORDER.

Now, on this 4th day of October, 1927 the petition of certain residents of the town of Hydaburg, Ketchikan Recording Precinct, Territory of Alaska, for incorporation of that town as a city of the second classs coming on regularly to be heard, having been postponed from the 27th day of September, 1927 to give further time for any person to oppose the petition, if there be such, no one appearing in opposition thereto and William L. Paul, attorney, appearing for the petitioners, and this court being fully satisfied that it is to the best interests of the community that the petition be granted and that the town of Hydaburg be so incorporated; now therefore.

IT IS ORDERED that the town of Hydaburg may be incorporated as a city of the second class, and that the name of such city of the second class shall be Hydaburg.

IT IS ORDERED that the boundaries of the proposed incorporation shall be as follows:

(Survey made with Forest Service Standard Compass and 100 steel tape; variation used, 29 degrees, 30' east from U.S.C. & G.S.)

Corner 1 of the survey, a cedar post set in the ground and surrounded with stoles, at the approximate line of mean high tide on the easterly shore of Sukwan Strait, at the head of the small cove north of Hydaburg Village, and at the mouth of the small stream flowing into this cove. From which corner an 18" cedar tree bears true N 66 links distant, and a 28" cedar tree bears \$ 63 degrees 30' E 32 links distant, both trees scribed "Cor. 1, B.T."

Then meander the shore line of Sukwan Strait at the approximate line of mean high tide, as follows:

To Corner No. 2 of the survey, a hemlock post 3½ inches square, 3 feet high set in the ground and a mound of stones at the head of a small bay, at mouth of stream, approximately at line of mean high tide. From which corher a 12 inch hemlock bears N 10 degrees E 34 links distant and an 8-inch spruce hears N 45 degrees W 39 links distant. Both trees blazed and scribed "Corner B.T. No. 2."

From which corner the back boundary of survey, projected, bears N 37 degrees W 78 chains to Corner No. I, containing an area of 189 acres, more or less.

This order of incorporation shall be subject to ratification as provided by law, towit:

An election to determine the desires of the residents of the town of Hydaburg on the matter of incorporation shall be held in the said town of Hydaburg at the usual polling place in the store of
