CERTIFICATE

I, ROBERT W. WARD, SECRETARY OF STATE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA, DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT, in accordance with the provisions of AS 29.10.022 an election for the incorporation of a fourth class city known as Mekoryuk, Alaska, was held on August 12, 1969, within the boundaries of said proposed area for incorporation and that a majority of votes were cast for incorporation. The vote was 66 for and 3 against.

AND THAT a majority of the votes were cast for enactment of a 1% sales tax. The vote was 60 for and 9 against.

I DO FURTHER CERTIFY THAT the city of Mekoryuk is incorporated as a fourth class city with authority to enact a 1% sales tax;

THAT it possesses all the powers and privileges prescribed for cities of the fourth class by Title 29 of the ALASKA STATUTES;

THAT the boundaries of the said city are:

Starting at the point where the South boundary of Section 7, Township 3 North, Range 98 West, Seward Meridian, Alaska, intersects the meander of the Bering Sea; thence in a north-easterly direction following the meander of the Bering Sea and in a southerly and southwesterly direction following the meander of the West side of the Mekoryuk River to the point where the South boundary of Section 12, intersects the meander of the west side of the Mekoryuk River; thence West to the point of beginning.

AND THAT on August 12, 1969, the following were elected as councilmen on the initial city council:

- Jerry David, Sr.
- George King, Sr.
- Edward Shavings, Sr.
- George Williams, Sr.

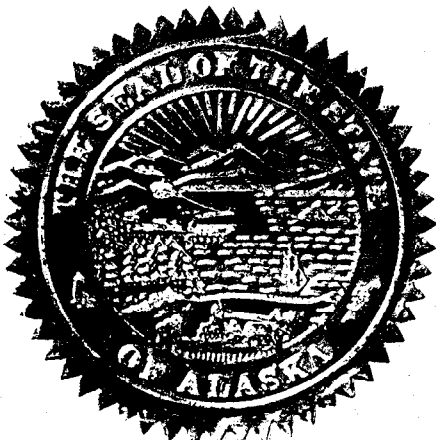
AND THAT Walter Amos and Clarence Kolerk are tied for fifth place on the city council and the successful candidate is to be determined by lot.

THAT the term of office of councilman is to be one year unless determined otherwise by the city council.
