CERTIFICATION OF BOUNDARIES
CITY OF SEWARD

I, Lee McAnerney, Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, do hereby certify that the attached recommendation for a local government boundary change entitled

"Recommendation for annexation of
territory to the City of Seward"

became effective on February 27, 1977.

A PETITION requesting the annexation of territory south and west of the corporate boundaries was submitted by the City of Seward and received by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs on September 6, 1976. After an investigation of the petition by the Department, the Local Boundary Commission called for and held a public hearing in Seward on May 21, 1976. Immediately following the public hearing, the commission held a decisional meeting at which time it voted to accept the petition and to recommend to the legislature the boundary change presented therein.

THE COMMISSION's recommendation was presented to the State legislature pursuant to Section 12, Article 10, of the Constitution of the State of Alaska:

Section 12. A local boundary commission or board shall be established by law in the executive branch of the state government. The commission or board may consider any proposed local government boundary change. It may present proposed changes to the legislature during the

first ten days of any regular session. The change shall become effective forty-five days after presentation or at the end of the session, whichever is earlier, unless disapproved by a resolution concurred in by a majority of the members of each house. The commission or board, subject to law, may establish procedures whereby boundaries may be adjusted by local action.

THE FIRST SESSION of the Tenth State Legislature received the Commission recommendations on January 14, 1977, the fifth day of the legislative session. A House and a Senate joint resolution were introduced requesting legislative disapproval of the Commission's recommendation but were not adopted. The Local Boundary Commission's "Recommendation for annexation of territory to the City of Seward" became effective on February 27, 1977. The boundaries of the City of Seward are now, therefore, as described in the Local Boundary Commission recommendation, to wit:

Beginning at the NE Corner of Sec. 28, T1N,R1W (projected), Seward Meridian, State of Alaska; thence S45°00'00"East to the NW Corner of Sec. 1, T1S,R1W; thence East to the NE Corner of Sec. 1, T1S,R1W; thence South to the SE Corner of Sec. 1, T1S,R1W; thence East to the NE Corner of Sec. 9, T1S,R1E (projected); thence South to the SE Corner of Sec. 16, T1S,R1E (projected); thence West to the SW Corner of Sec. 16, T1S,R1W (projected); thence North to the NW Corner of Sec. 28, T1N,R1W (projected); thence East to the NE Corner of Sec. 28, T1N,R1W (projected), being the place of beginning, containing 22 square miles more or less.
