As a half time resident and land owner in Tenakee Springs, I have been going to Tenakee Springs since childhood and I concur with the letter by the city of Tenakee opposing the annexation of a good portion of the drainages and waters of Tenakee Inlet into the proposed Xunaa borough. According to regulation we must have some connection to Hoonah. We do not. Even the ferry system does not have a Hoonah to Tenakee route, it either bypasses one or the other. If anything Tenakee has more in common with the residents of Angoon than Hoonah.
