The City of Koyukuk operates the central watering point at the washeteria and residents haul their own water. The City also maintains honeybucket pits and the sewage lagoon. The City Council is the policy making body for the utility. Residents haul treated well water from the washeteria and use honeybuckets or pit privies. Households are not plumbed. The school and washeteria use City water, with sewage disposal into a lagoon. A Master Plan is underway, and preliminary work has begun to upgrade the community to a flush/haul system. There are five households on the honeybucket haul demonstration system, which is paying for itself.

RUBA Activity This Reporting Period

Problems still remain due to not having regular meetings, failure to hold the election, failure to pass the budget and failure to pass the PILT resolution. Both the city administrator and city clerk positions are still temporary. There remains an attendance problem with the operator. Financial records are supposedly up to date, but the city clerk is unable to get the information as the city administrator is out of town. There is a problem with the furnace in the city office. It's not working. Fortunately, there is a wood stove downstairs. Two new washers are on order but have not been delivered yet.

They are still not current with their CCR. This has been brought to OEH's attention and is the reason they are on the SNC list. The washers have been purchased and the freight paid for but they still have not arrived in Koyukuk. This may be due to weather. However, this is resulting in a severe loss of income. People are still able to use the showers. There is a problem with the operator job performance.

RUBA Activities For The Coming Quarter

Continue to provide training and technical assistance. Provide staff training when possible. One of the goals is to meet with the council to see if they will resume their responsibility of having reliable staff on board to do the work. Have tentatively set travel out there for January.
