The City operates the water and wastewater system. More than half of the community is served by a piped water and sewer system, completed in 1973 by PHS, and are fully plumbed. 27 homes currently haul treated well water and honeybuckets. All the residential units in the community are planned for connection to the system by end of FY2003. Major infrastructure improvements are underway, to expand the piped system to 27 residential homes, Head Start, City and Tribal offices and other community buildings. Relocation of the landfill/lagoon, and water and sewer main repairs are under construction.

RUBA Activity This Reporting Period

After the RUBA Assessment, there was no RUBA assistance, as the community is self-sufficient. A recent copy was sent upon the City’s request.
