

Piped utility services have been available in Tanacross since 1976. Water is treated, stored in a 25,000-gal. tank, and piped to most homes. Some residents have individual wells. A piped sewage and septic system serve approximately half of the community; individual septic tanks are also used. Funds have been requested to replace seven failing individual septic tanks with a piped central septic system. The landfill is not permitted. Electricity is provided by Alaska Power and Telephone from Tok.

RUBA Activity This Quarter

RUBA contact with Tanacross was by telephone, fax, e-mail and a field visit this quarter. A RUBA Assessment was performed on 9/29/06 and the tribe passed all the essential and sustainable indicators. The office has been operating more efficiently and is trying to coordinate meetings to get funding for the multi-purpose building.

Finances Comments:

The tribe utilizes the QuickBooks accounting system for governmental accounting. This program sets out the accounts, funds, budgets, grants, check writing, customers and vendor jobs, payroll records, invoices, customer statements, reconciles bank accounts, purchase orders and the chart of accounts. Fuel is purchased from Northern Energy at \$2.59 gallon once a month.
