

Tuntutuliak Activity Report

Community Overview

Tuntutuliak Community Services Association (Utility Organization) operates the electrical services, washeteria, water treatment plant, flush tank haul system, landfill/lagoon site, and garbage collection services. A flush/haul system was completed for 68 homes in 2000, including bathroom plumbing. The utility organization received additional funding in FY 01 to complete installation to those interested in the flush haul system, but is on hold until the engineering and environmental reports are done. The community received BIA Funds to renovate the community boardwalk system. Kuskokwim Architect Services is designing the renovation plan for the community. The school has its own well and sewage lagoon and is currently planning to upgrade their sewage disposal system.

RUBA Activity This Reporting Period

RUBA staff from Bethel and Anchorage accompanied the VSW Engineer to Tuntutuliak to meet with the local utility board and tribal council regarding the water/sewer project. At present, Tuntutuliak has many deficiencies noted upon completion of an assessment and these assessment recommendations have not yet been addressed. The summer subsistence and commercial fishing activities are slowing this utility from meeting the essentials. However, the Utility ordinance was completed in draft form and sent to the Anchorage RUBA office for review. Once received back by the organization and adopted, a copy will be provided to RUBA in Bethel. The temporary Utility Manager, Gabe Olick has encouraged the Utility board to hire a Utility manager. He wants his original job back as the operator.

Filing (FUTA) 940 form. Judy Pearson has completed her research and since this entity has it's own by-laws, constitution, they are considered a separate entity. Recommended to the acting manager call Judy and work with her in resolving this. Recommended that he brings this to the Utility Board's attention and put together a repayment plan if this is the request from Judy.
