Anchorage (Tanaina: Dgheyay Kaq'; Dgheyaytnu) is the largest city in the U.S. state of Alaska by population. With a population of 291,247 at the 2020 census, it contains nearly 40% of the state's population. At 1,706 sq mi (4,420 sq km) of land area, the city is the fourth-largest by area in the United States and larger than the smallest state, Rhode Island, which has 1,212 sq mi (3,140 sq km).

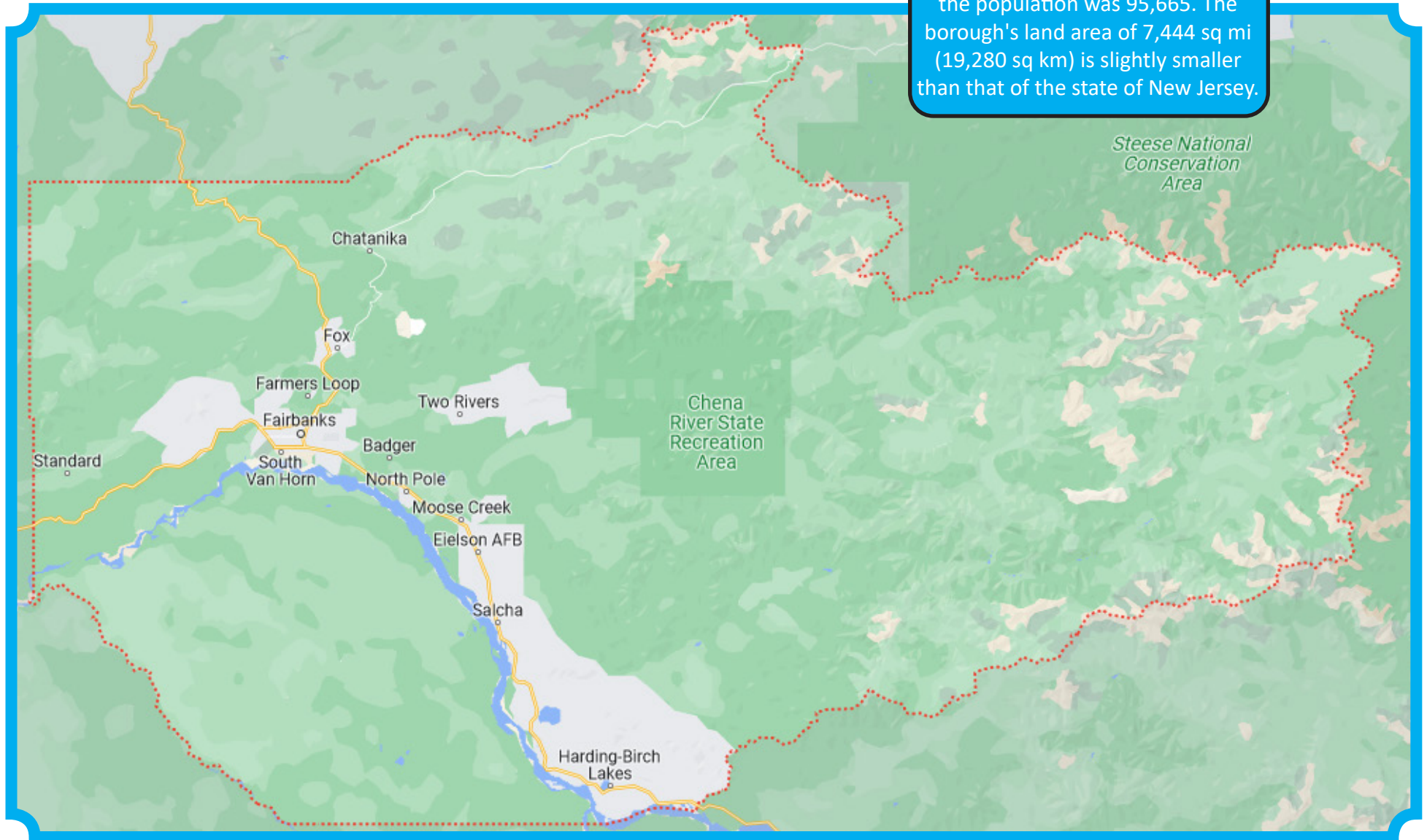

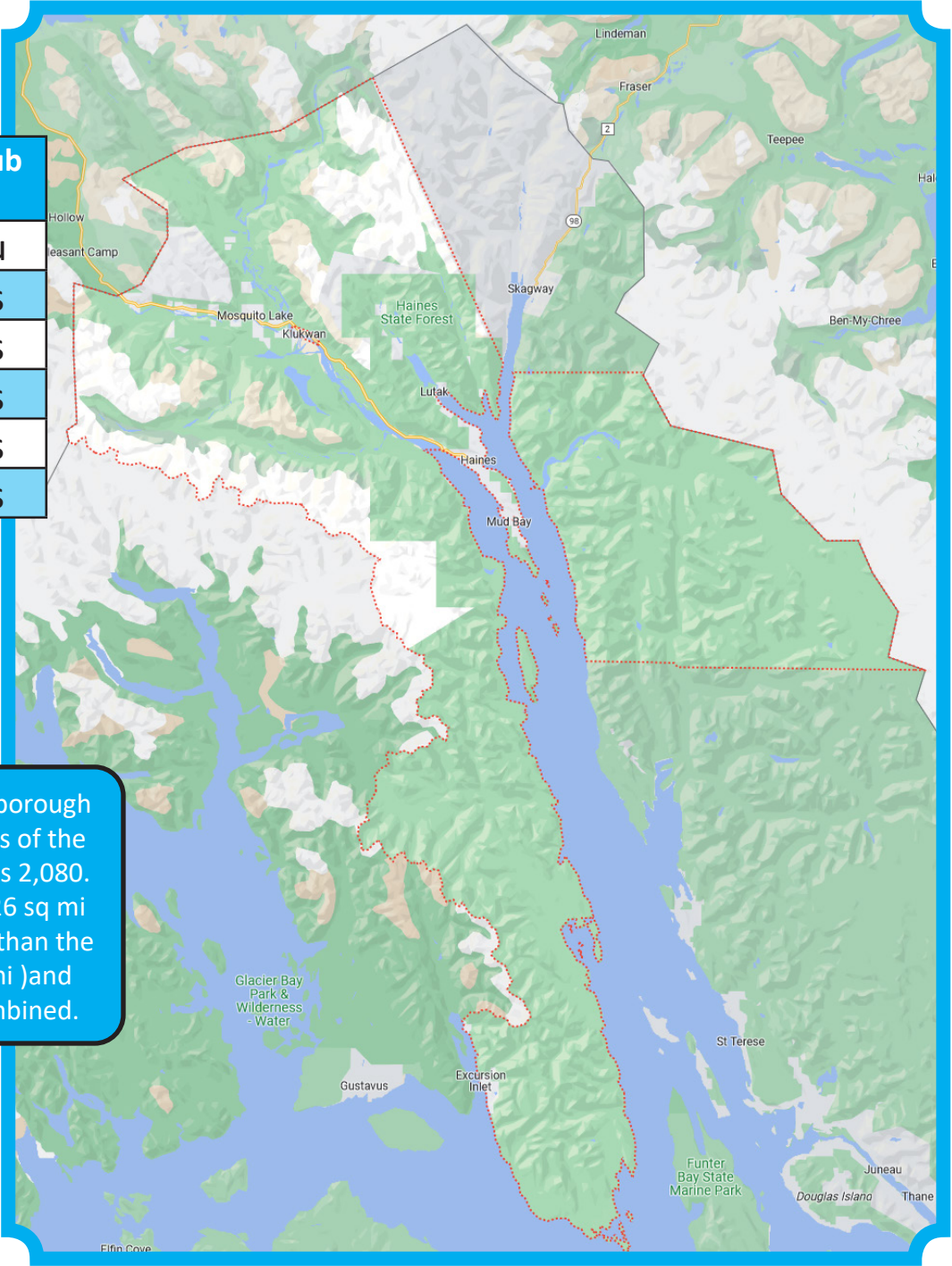

The City and Borough of Juneau, more commonly known simply as Juneau (/ˈdʒuːnoʊ/ JOO-noh; Tlingit: Dzánti K'ihéeni Athabaskan pronunciation: [ˈtsáɫtʰi k'ì hì:nì]), is the capital city of the U.S. state of Alaska. As of the 2020 census, the City and Borough had a population of 32,255, making it the third-most populous city in Alaska after Anchorage and Fairbanks. The borough's land area is 3,254.70 sq mi (8,429.64 sq km).

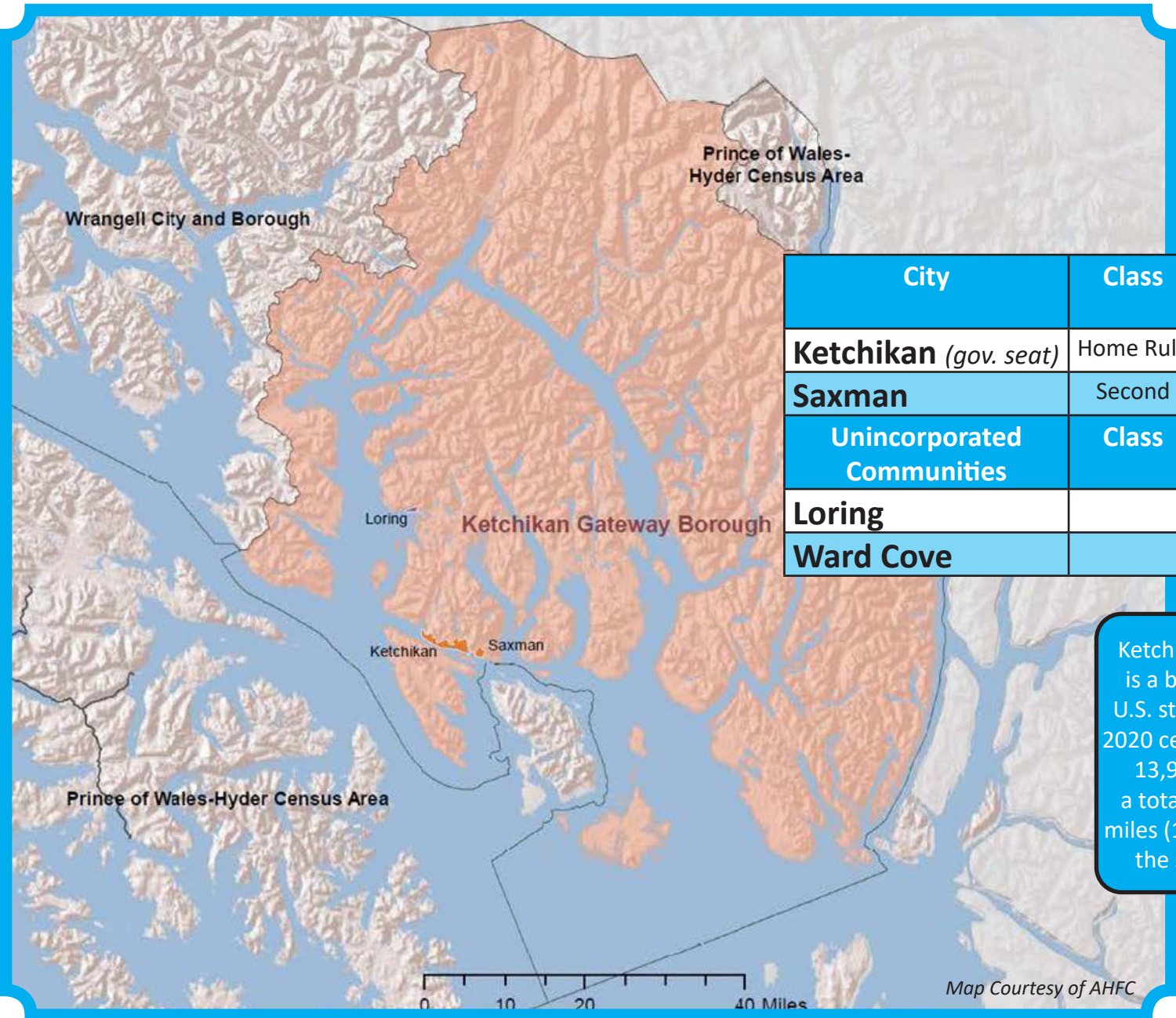

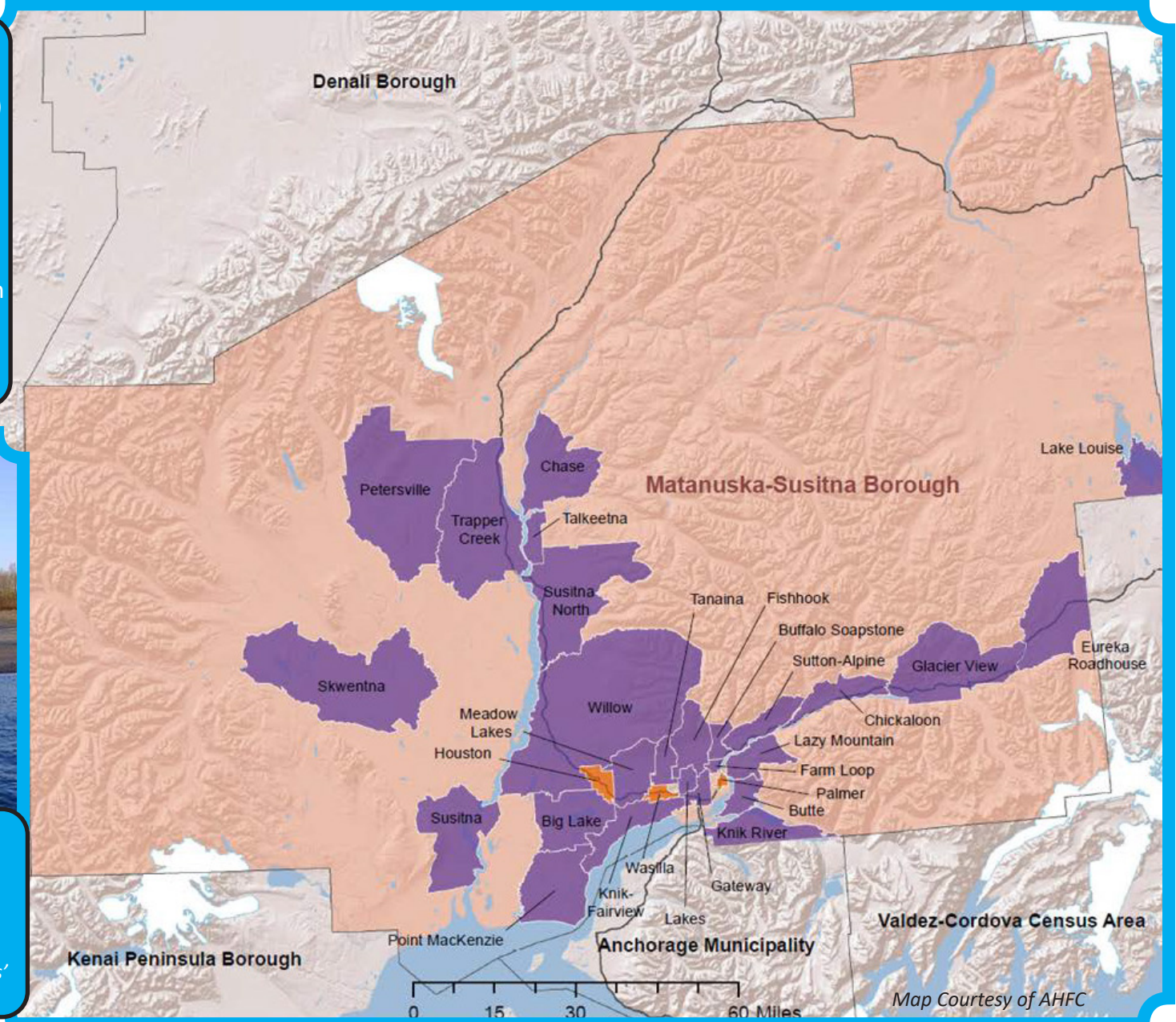
Matanuska-Susitna Borough

Matanuska-Susitna Valley (/mətəˈnuːskə suːˈsɪtnə/) (known locally as the Mat-Su or The Valley) is an area in Southcentral Alaska south of the Alaska Range about 35 miles (56 km) north of Anchorage, Alaska. The 25,258 sq mi (65,420 sq km) Matanuska-Susitna Borough governs the Mat-Su Valley. According to the 2020 Census, the borough's population is 107,081.

The North Slope Borough is the northernmost borough in the US state of Alaska and thus, the northernmost county or equivalent of the United States as a whole. As of the 2020 census, the population was 11,031. The borough seat and largest city is Utqiagvik (known as Barrow from 1901 to 2016), which is also the northernmost settlement in the United States. According to the United States Census Bureau, the borough has a total area of 94,796 square miles (245,520 km²). The borough is larger than 39 states.

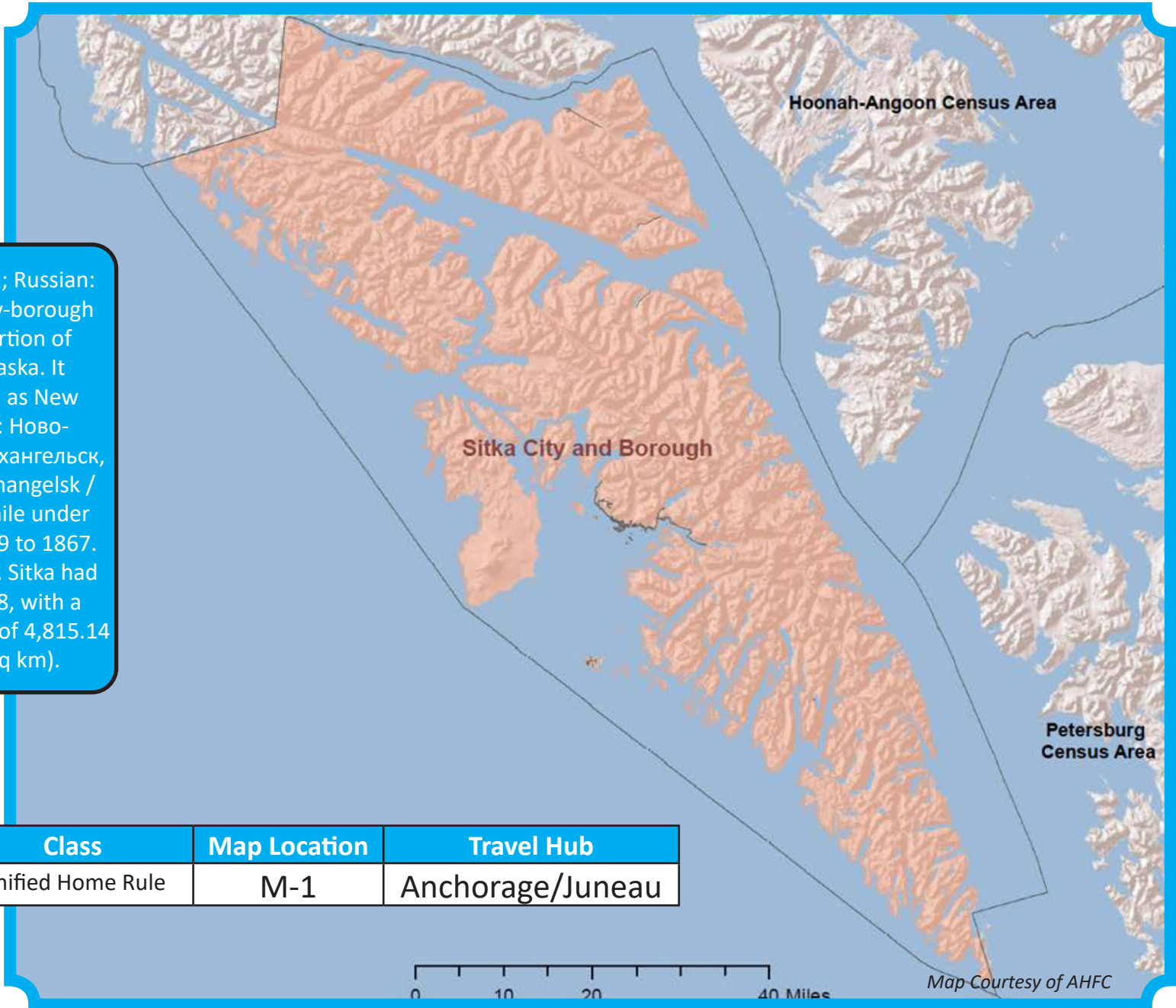

Sitka (Tlingit: Sheet'ká; Russian: Ситка) is a unified city-borough in the southeast portion of the U.S. state of Alaska. It was formerly known as New Archangel (Russian: Ново-Архангельск / Новоархангельск, romanized: Novo-Arkhangelsk / Novoarkhangelsk) while under Russian rule from 1799 to 1867. As of the 2020 census, Sitka had a population of 8,458, with a consolidated land area of 4,815.14 sq mi (12,471.16 sq km).

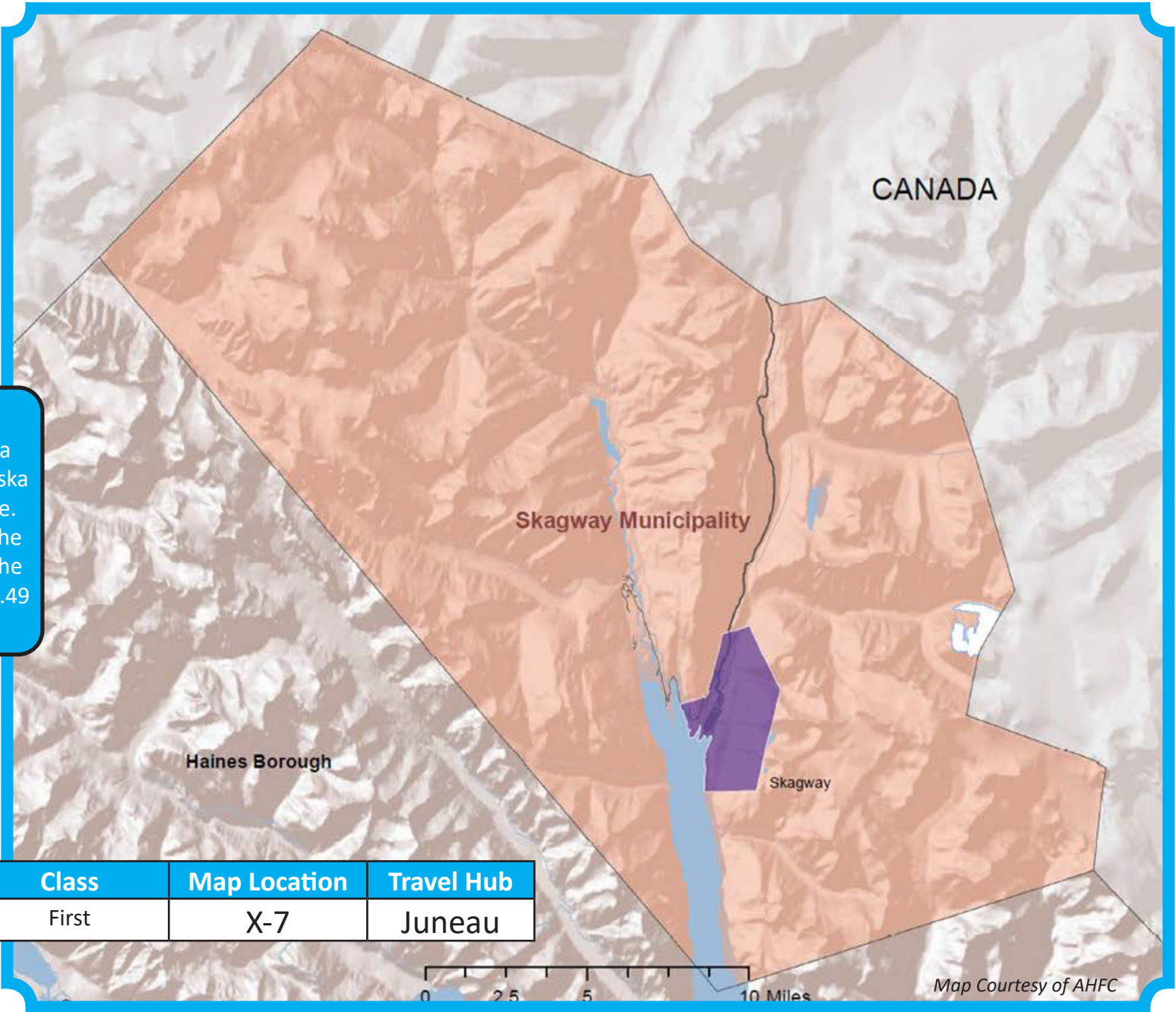
