Dear Commission,

I currently own my home located within the Soldotna city limits. My home has been within city limits since it was built, over 20 years. At this time, the city of Soldotna is unable to offer ANY city services other than police protection, which would be covered as quickly by troopers in the event of an emergency. If we actually see a patrol car here it is a rare occasion, perhaps once a year. The city offers no sewer, or water services here, and cable company will not cover this area of the "city". So my purpose of this email is to ask, if the city can't provide services to a 20 year residence, how in the world do they intend to offer those same services to newly annexed, even more remote properties? Especially since the sewage treatment plant here is already almost to capacity? The city council here has admitted that these services will not be offered "in your lifetime" to those folks in proposed annexation area. So if THAT can't be done, why should we be taxing a whole bunch of new folks and offering them nothing?
