#### **Board Travel:**

Board Chair, Miller, and Board members Peirsol, Mills and Brown attended the NCARB annual meeting. Board Chair, Miller, and Board members Gilfilian, Iverson, and Kalen participated at the NCEES annual meeting

As you know, the new administration has been scrutinizing travel and four of my trips have been denied: travel to the Western Zone Meeting in May, and travel to the NCARB annual conference in June for FY03 travel; and the NCEES annual conference and the CLARB annual conference in FY04.

### **Exam Security**

NCEES has had numerous issues with exam security issues ranging from missing exam booklets or answer sheets and shipping irregularities that have resulted in redoing some examinations at costs in excess of \$500,000. Issues discussed at the recent NCEES meeting highlight the responsibilities and the potential financial liability for jurisdictions. As a result, NCEES has looked at exam administration and currently administers 18 jurisdictions with more added in October. These issues were discussed at the recent annual meeting.
