412	Ms. Donohue included in the Board packet a copy of the Board's regulation project
413	dealing with requirements for administration of anesthetics and sedation, restorative
414	function and courses for dental hygienists and dental assistants, and collaborative
415	agreements, which the Board adopted on March 13, 2012. This project was signed by the
416	Lt. Governor on May 25, 2012 and became effective June 24, 2012.

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Next the Board reviewed a letter from Representative David Guttenberg, dated May 31, 2012, with questions relating to the qualifications to practice dentistry in Alaska. His interest stems from constituent concern and issues of rural health care. His specific questions are:

- Why does one who passes all the board exams and qualifications, but holds a degree from a school outside the United States still not [be] allowed to practice in Alaska?
- Why does Alaska not have reciprocal agreements with other nations with comparable programs to help address need in the state?
- How is the board addressing, if at all, the need to increase access to dental care in rural areas?

In reference to question 1, on the date of Rep. Guttenberg's letter it was a statutory requirement that only a dentist with a general dentistry degree from a CODA accredited school be licensed in Alaska, in accordance with AS 08.36.110. When SB92 became effective 8/29/2012 the statute language changed to "a program approved" by the Board and "examination approved by the Board". The Board will be reviewing the statutory changes and initiating a regulation project to align the regulations accordingly.

Stauffer stated that change in SB92 was a mistake. The draft was written so the dental applicants must be graduated from a CODA accredited program, <u>and</u> the program be approved by the Board. She added there had been extensive discussion that the dental hygiene and dental licensing requirements should mirror each other as much as possible. The dental hygiene licensing statute, AS 08.32.014 still requires graduation from a program that is, at the time of graduation, accredited by CODA and is approved by the Board.

White added that he thinks a dentist cannot take the required exams unless they are enrolled in or graduated from a CODA accredited school.

In reference to question 2, Alaska does have a reciprocal agreement with Canada as their schools have the same academic outcomes as US schools. In fact CODA has a reciprocal agreement with the corresponding Canadian entity, and Alaska honors that agreement. Other nations have not completed agreements with CODA for reciprocation.

Ms. Donohue noted she had included the information from CA as background information for this discussion, and that it was representative of what she was able to find from the other jurisdictions she researched. Licensing requirements for other states require that foreign-graduated dentists must hold a general dentist degree from a CODA accredited program.

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In regard to question 3, the Board sees their charge from the Legislature as licensing qualified applicants in the interest of protecting the public in accordance with AS 08.36.070. Although the Board is very aware of the issues of access to care in rural areas, there is nothing in the Dental statutes authorizing or directing the Board to address access to care. However, the Board has a Dental Courtesy License that allows volunteers to come into the state to deliver care for a specific time period, and to a specified client group, as specified in a contract with a sponsoring entity.

The Board is aware of and understands the frustration surrounding access to care in rural areas of Alaska. They are unsure what Rep. Guttenberg means in his statement: "The issue then becomes stressed when otherwise qualified willing dentists who hold international degrees have no other option to practice unless they go back and receive another degree from an American institution." A dentist is not "otherwise" qualified unless they have passed certain examinations and graduated from certain schools, in accordance with Alaska statutes and examination requirements. As he states in his letter, "safety is of course paramount and I understand the need for oversight....." The Board's job is to protect the public by licensing qualified applicants, and to verify "qualified" they require documentation that the applicant meets the minimum qualifications for licensure, in accordance with Dental statutes. The Board agrees their Mission Statement clearly defines their mission of "protecting the health, safety and welfare of Alaskans by ensuring that practitioners possess competency, ethical standards, and integrity necessary to offer or deliver quality services to consumers".

Dr. Kovaleski noted that due to loan-repayment programs, and various other programs designed to attract dentists to rural programs, there are currently less vacancies in the rural areas than ever before.

The Board directed Ms. Donohue to draft a response to Rep. Guttenberg, outlining their discussion, then send to them for review and comments. That draft will then come back to them at the Dec. 7, 2012 meeting for final approval.

Ms. Donohue advised the Board that the inquiry from Sean Halloran with Littler Mendelson, PC asking about provisions for owners of dental offices who are not Alaska licensed dentists, has been referred to Dept. of Law. SB92 enshrined the requirement that dental offices be owned only be Alaska licensed dentists with a few named exceptions.

SB92 was signed by the Governor and became effective August 29, 2012. This will require an extensive review of regulations to assure compliance with the changes enacted in SB92. Dr. Stauffer and Dr. Silveira worked during the summer and have provided a draft of changes, included in the Board packet, for the Board as a whole to review in
