4. Ethics Disclosures

Ethics reporting by board members is done on a quarterly basis and is a standing item on the quarterly meeting agenda. The Chair requested Ms. Norberg query each board member.

There were no ethic disclosures reported.

5. Physicians Health Committee Update

Per the Chair's invitation to address the Board, Dr. Maria Foland, Medical Director for the Physician's Health Committee highlighted the following:

- The PHC continues to assist numerous physicians in Alaska to be "repaired, not impaired" due to substance abuse and mental health issues. The PHC is currently monitoring 15-19 people.
- The PHC supports changes to professional fitness questions on the physician license and renewal applications as recommended by the AMA aimed at promoting truthful self-disclosure related to personal health history.
Chair Wein invited David Wilson to discuss the parallels in quality standards/zero tolerance and failure to disclose within the aviation industry amongst commercial airline pilots.
- The PHC is aware of recent instances with physicians being charged with DUI's or other criminal offenses and their attorneys have recommended that the physician not contact the Medical Board to self-disclose the charge – in violation of Board regulations. It appears there is confusion as to whether an offense needs to be reported during the charging phase or after a conviction is made. The PHC has provided information in its quarterly newsletter and sent a letter to the Bar Association to address the confusion. This revelation prompted a Board discussion regarding whether the statues and regulations pertaining to this matter are too vague. The Board chair suggested that this be a subject for further exploration at a future meeting.

6. DEA Update, Cheryl Macaraeg & Lynette Eingert – Seattle Based Diversion Unit

Per the Chair's invitation to address the Board, Cheryl Macaraeg, DEA Regional Diversion Program Manager provided an overview of how the DEA interfaces with Medical Boards and answered questions from Board members:

- Upon establishing a formal case collaboration agreement, DEA Diversion Units work primarily with Medical Board Investigators to collaborate on information sharing and the sharing of other resources including experts. Medical Boards tend to benefit from the DEA's expanded ability to obtain information across jurisdictions.
- The threshold for DEA registration surrenders and permanent suspensions was explained.

1 grounds for sanctions pursuant to AS 08.64.326(a)(1)(7) - (The board may impose a sanction
2 if the board finds after a hearing that a licensee (1) secured a license through deceit, fraud, or
3 intentional misrepresentation; and (7) failed to comply with this chapter, a regulation
4 adopted under this chapter, or an order of the board; and 12 AAC 40.967(24)(failing to
5 cooperate with an official investigation by the board or the board's representatives, including
6 failing to timely provide requested information).

36 **have a proper foundation of chronic pain diagnosis to support level of pain management for**
37 **patients, failing to properly document and monitor pain management patients, prescribing**
38 **dangerous combinations of medication and without proper documentation of patient**
39 **education on associated risk, prescribing opioid medications to patients with known overdose**
40 **history and addiction issues, prescribing opioid medications to pregnant women, and**
41 **improperly disposing of patient medications.**

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47 An overview of the quarterly Medical Board Probation Report was provided by Karina Medina, Probation
48 Monitor. Eight practitioners are currently being monitored.

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2 An overview of the quarterly Medical Board Investigative Report was provided by Angel Romero,
3 Investigator. The report covered the period of May 12, 2022 through August 04, 2022. There are 124
4 open matters and 28 matters were closed during this time frame.
5

6 **9. Division Update**

7 Chair Wein introduced and invited Director Chambers to present to the Board. Director Chambers
8 provided an overview of new telehealth legislation, effective July 14, 2022. This legislation is the result
9 of HB 265 which passed during the 2022 Legislative session. Of particular interest to the Medical board
10 are new provisions that allow: 1) physicians who are licensed in another state but not licensed in Alaska
11 to provide telehealth services to Alaskans under certain defined criteria; 2) the Medical Board to impose
12 sanctions on providers who practice telehealth in Alaska without a license and violate the law, and to
13 recover the cost of proceedings that result in sanctions. The Medical Board will need to revise existing
14 regulation to conform with the new legislation.
15

16 **10. Regulation Projects**

17 • **Draft Telehealth Regulation Changes**

18 Proposed changes that would conform 12 AAC 40.993 (Standards of practice for telemedicine) to the
19 new law were presented to the Board for review and consideration. The Board will address adopting
20 the proposed changes at a later date.
21

22 • **Expedited Licensing Changes**

23 The final version of the proposed changes to 12 AAC 40.010 and 12 AAC 40.035 related to expediting
24 the processes for physician licensure was presented to the Board.
25

26 **After taking into consideration that no public comments were received and there will be no**
27 **additional cost to private persons; on a motion duly made by Ms. Mielke, seconded by Mr.**
28 **Wilson and approved by a roll call vote, the Board approved the adoption of the emergency**
29 **regulation changes to 12 AAC 40.010 and 12 AAC 40.035 as proposed, and publicly noticed, to**
30 **be made permanent.**

40 **12. Public Comments**

41 Jeannie Monk, Senior Vice President for the Alaska Hospital and Health Care Association (AHHA)
42 provided the following comments:

- 43 • The pandemic caused many health care practitioners to experience intense anxiety, stress,
44 trauma and burnout. AHHA has been working to address these issues. One important strategy
45 is to reduce barriers for clinicians to seek mental health services. Many clinicians fear stigma,
46 discrimination, loss of privacy and losing their license if they seek support services.
- 47 • Certain questions on Alaska's licensing applications may unintentionally stigmatize chronic
48 health or mental health conditions. AHHA supports the AMA and FSMB recommendation to

1 eliminate questions that ask applicants to disclose past history of illness, treatment and
2 diagnosis of impairing conditions. There is no data that supports that asking these questions
3 protects the public and it is well documented that asking such questions discourages clinicians
4 from seeking help.

5
6 Chair Wein provided a summary of written public comments received by the Board during the last
7 quarter.

9 **13. Chair Updates**

10 • **CME Requirements – Time for Change**

11 Dr. Wein introduced the notion that it may be time for the Board to consider changing the requirements
12 for continuing education. Several Board members voiced support in recognizing Specialty Board
13 Certification in lieu of the current 25 credits per year requirement. Mr. Wilson reiterated the
14 importance of setting high standards for continuing education. Dr. Wein also suggested that the Board
15 adopt an Alaska-specific opioid education curriculum/list of learning objectives.

17 • **Draft Annual Report**

18 The Board reviewed and discussed the draft annual report. It was suggested and agreed that the report
19 be amended to reflect the specific locations for where board members reside. Board members
20 discussed and voiced general support for increasing the size of the Board to include an additional
21 appointed physician(s) and possibly a paid physician position to assist with the heavy physician-specific
22 workload that must be distributed among the four licensed physicians on the Board.

36 The report is not yet available for public consumption, however Chair Wein revealed that overall the
37 findings of the report were affirming and reflective of the hard work taken on by the Board throughout
38 the pandemic. The negative findings are minimal and in general this audit process was a positive
39 experience.

41 • **Physician Assistant Modernization project update**

42
43 Chair Wein noted that the Alaska Physician Assistant Academy submitted thorough written answers to
44 the questions posed by the Board during the special meeting on Physician Assistant licensure held on
45 June 23. Dr. Wein encouraged Board members to review this document and promised another detailed
46 discussion on this matter during the next special meeting on the topic, to be scheduled at a later date.
47 The Division has also requested an opinion from the Dept. of Law regarding questions raised during the
48 June meeting.

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2 Related to a separate question raised by Board Member, Ms. Bigelow Hood, it was clarified that Board
3 staff must enforce the requirements outlined in regulation 12 AAC 40.415 (Remote Practice Location)
4 for Alaska licensed physician assistants providing telemedicine services to Alaskans from an out of state
5 location.

Dr. Ahmad’s license was suspended by the Board in 2016 based on the substantiated findings that Dr. Ahmad prescribed high doses of opioids and other controlled substance to patients without demonstrating medical necessity, without reviewing records and diagnostic tests, without taking into account individual risk, without close monitoring of adverse effects, without due regard to the health of his patients, Ahmad violated AS 08.64.326(a)(2)(engaged in deceit, fraud, or intentional misrepresentation while providing professional services, (7) failed to comply with AS 08.64 or 12 AAC 40), (8)(A) (demonstrated professional incompetence, gross negligence or repeated negligent conduct), (9) engaged in unprofessional conduct) 12 AAC 40.967 (defining unprofessional conduct to include an act or omission that does not conform to the generally accepted standards of practice), 12 AAC 40.970 (defining professional incompetence as lacking sufficient knowledge, skills or professional judgment in the physicians field of practice, to a degree likely to endanger the health of his patients) and 12 AAC 40.975 (requiring the creation and maintenance of a written record of care when prescribing controlled substances), which is grounds for discipline pursuant to AS 08.64.331, which constitute grounds for denial of a license pursuant to 08.64.240(a) (3) and (b).
