The board reviewed 12 AAC 48.035, expanded procedures regulation received from the reviewing attorney in the AAG's office. Initial discussion centered on the accrediting organization of the course that would be required. The Accreditation Council on Optometric Education (ACOE) is the accrediting agency for all of the Colleges of Optometry, they are recognized by both the Council for Higher Education Accreditation and The Higher Learning Commission in the US Department of Education. The ACOE is also overseen by The Council for Higher Education Accreditation. There are a couple of different recognized accreditation sources. The board agreed that Dr. Barney will clarify, and check with the AOA to confirm the exact name of the accrediting organization, and that would be added to 12 AAC 48.305(b) without changing any of the other verbiage in the regulation.

The board then discussed at what point a licensee would be able to perform the expanded procedures. Discussion concluded that the intent of the board is that the licensee must have a current license in this state and must have completed the educational requirements outlined in the regulation prior to being able to perform the expanded procedures.

The board assessed the intent on reviewing and approving the acceptable educational courses. The board would like to make it clear that the course of instruction may be considered for approval rather than indicate if certain requirements are met the course is approved. The board wants to maintain the authority to approve educational courses.

The board then evaluated the intent of providing an affidavit of active clinical practice in performing advanced procedures since the completion of the educational course for those applying for an Alaska license by credential. The board wants to ensure that the licensee has engaged in active clinical practice performing advanced procedures a minimum of 1040 hours for each year since the completion of the approved educational course.

The board discussed the question posed from the reviewing attorney, inquiring if pre and post-operative care is now provided in the current course of practice. The board confirmed that pre and post-operative care is currently being provided in the normal course of practice by licensees, a licensed optometrist would not need the expanded procedures training to provide pre and post-operative care.

Staff reviewed with the board that the regulations specialist would review the meeting minutes and make the necessary changes based on what the board has discussed during this conference call, and, determine if they needed to be reviewed again by the department of law. Once completed the regulations specialist would send the regulation out for public comment.

On a motion duly made by Dr. Erik Christiansen, seconded by Mr. Eric Lingle and approved, it was:

RESOLVED to move forward 12 AAC 48.305 to the regulations specialist for public comment as amended.
