Agenda item – Public Comment

Brittany Pope –Spoke in support of defining telehealth. There are still areas we need to address in rural Alaska where tele-supervision is pretty much the only option. Encouraged the board to continue exploration of distance supervision, so we can still serve rural communities in rural villages.

Eric Boyer – Spoke to the importance of removing barriers preventing access to behavioral healthcare, or that might hinder the development of competent and capable behavioral health providers in the Alaska workforce. Discussed growing the behavioral health workforce and supporting expanding courtesy licensing requirements. In one-time CE classes surrounding cross-cultural studies relating to Alaska natives, teletherapy practices, suicide, prevention, substance use disorder, and professional ethics, the Trust supports the CE educational requirements through funding at the University of Alaska Anchorage training Cooperative and the Family Services training Center. They support the inclusion of proposed regulations for teletherapy practice in Alaska. A potential area to improve in the proposed teletherapy practice regulations would be to expand or to clarify the guidelines around the use of telehealth technology in the supervision of providers seeking licensure as psychologists.

Malan Paquette – Spoke regarding support of expanding the vocabulary to include distance professionals. Continually concerned about the lack of internship sites and the distance supervision opportunities. Hopes the board will consider expanding distance supervision and working more with rural clinics and semi-rural clinics where they can take on interns.

Paul Craig – Spoke in support of the board's intentions regarding these regulations. Provided a 14-page document for review by the board. Expressed concerns regarding retroactivity of regulation changes. Seventy-five percent of all jurisdictions nationwide require 3-hours of ethics. If he is being asked to dedicate fifteen of those hours during a two-year period to the proposed topics, it puts him in a position of not following the ethics code of the APA.

Dr. Mark Zelig – Agreed with Dr. Craig's position. Spoke to the 14-page document and that it points out some real limitations. Greatest concern is the proposed regulations focus on Native Americans in Alaska. He has never encountered jurisdictions that specify focus on particular ethnic or minority groups. A composition of Alaska shows approximately 14.7 are Alaska Native Americans. Twenty three percent of the population involves other ethnic groups. Why would the focus be on one when awareness of all is important? Expressed concern about how to obtain required hours from a reputable CE source regarding Alaska Native Americans.

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Agenda Items – Schedule Future Meeting Dates

Discussion regarding ASPPB meeting in September took place. All board members had conflicts to attend the ASPPB meeting. Erin is looking to see if she can attend. Monday would be the latest to make that decision to get approval for travel. The January 4th & 5th Board meeting was moved to February 8th& 9th, 2024, with the possibility of the meeting being held in Juneau if needed.

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Agenda Item - Regulations Project

Change the regulations to the current licensing period. Regulations and Law doesn't have any other suggestions for the board. The Board may consider the public comments as they see fit. There are concerns regarding the timeline of the CEUs. Licensees may have completed their CEUs. The goal of the board is to have the required CEUs completed on a person's first renewal period. Suggestion to repeal 12 AAC 60.260(b), for 12 AAC 60.260 (d) make it clearly known that the CEUs are a one-time requirement. Three ethics CEUs will continue to be required. In one area of the statutes and regulations it states an average of 20 hours, and another area reads 20 hours earned each year. The board could consider a 2-year historical period. The board should keep the Alaska Native CE. A lot of damage can be done if people don't understand the culture. We approve a lot of licenses from out of state. These people could be doing telehealth and never step foot in this state. Discussion regarding how the board came up with these core CE topics took place. The board needs an update from investigations with the outcomes of complaints. During the pandemic suicides went up, abuse went up, and these are some of the biggest issues that are faced in Alaska. Requiring these CE topics as a one-time deal is not a big concern. This is relevant to what psychologists will face here in Alaska. Discussion regarding spreading this out over two cycles. Consideration of timing may improve reception of the public. The board's goal is to protect the public. We need a record that shows psychologists and psychological associates have had training in these areas. Cross-cultural CE is in regulation for every mental health program and that has been in play for six years. Other programs have amended their regulations. This needs to be uniform across, so we know everyone has taken the CEUs and no one is falling through the cracks. Discussion regarding waiting to implement this in 2025 took place. The letter that was received and mentioned along with oral comment spoke to sections illegal or unlawful due to retroactivity; however, this would not be retroactive. It is written with certain legalese 12 AAC 60.260 (b) after July 1999 everyone to take ethics this will be repealed because of new (c)(d)(e). For licensing period ending June 2023; it has 20 hours including 2 hours of whatever you want to take. Is there anything in the statutes and regulations regarding proration of CEUs in a situation someone applied a month to 6 months before renewal deadline? Administratively, if you are not licensed for a full calendar year, we don't require 20 CEUs. This is not in regulation so maybe it should be to make things clear for people. Discussion regarding reduction from 6 hours of cross-cultural to 4 took place. This gives people more room to choose CEUs they want. It was determined that teletherapy should be changed to telepsychology, and that the current definition surrounding this will suffice. Discussion regarding bifurcation of the regulations project took place. There is the option to split the CEU part of the regulations project from the telehealth portion. Under number 2 it states Board approved. Stating Board approved CEU means we would have to have a list of preapproved CEU options. Remove Board approved.

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Consent to Electronically Undertake the TRANSACTION
