394 WREB – email from Beth Cole of WREB to Cheryl Fellenberg in response to the
395 Board's request to WREB to consider changes to scheduling policies for dental hygiene
396 and local anesthetic exams due to Alaska's geographic challenges. WREB is willing to
397 make accommodations for Alaska as a valued member state with unique geographical
398 challenges, and will try changes in the schedule as a pilot in 2013. The Board directed
399 Ms. Donohue to reply to Kristi Moorehead with the Univ. of AK-Anchorage, who
400 initially asked for the Board to check with WREB about the scheduling hardships. They
401 asked that Univ. of AK-Fairbanks be copied on the correspondence.

402
403 Ms. Fellenberg will thank Beth Cole for the decision by WREB to make accommodations
404 to help meet Alaska's needs.

410 **Agenda Item 12 – Regulations**

411
412 Ms. Donohue included in the Board packet a copy of the Board's regulation project
413 dealing with requirements for administration of anesthetics and sedation, restorative
414 function and courses for dental hygienists and dental assistants, and collaborative
415 agreements, which the Board adopted on March 13, 2012. This project was signed by the
416 Lt. Governor on May 25, 2012 and became effective June 24, 2012.

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421

422 Next the Board reviewed a letter from Representative David Guttenberg, dated May 31,
423 2012, with questions relating to the qualifications to practice dentistry in Alaska. His
424 interest stems from constituent concern and issues of rural health care. His specific
425 questions are:

426

- 427 • Why does one who passes all the board exams and qualifications, but
428 holds a degree from a school outside the United States still not [be]
429 allowed to practice in Alaska?
- 430 • Why does Alaska not have reciprocal agreements with other nations with
431 comparable programs to help address need in the state?
- 432 • How is the board addressing, if at all, the need to increase access to dental
433 care in rural areas?

434

435 In reference to question 1, on the date of Rep. Guttenberg's letter it was a statutory
436 requirement that only a dentist with a general dentistry degree from a CODA accredited
437 school be licensed in Alaska, in accordance with AS 08.36.110. When SB92 became
438 effective 8/29/2012 the statute language changed to "a program approved" by the Board
439 and "examination approved by the Board". The Board will be reviewing the statutory
440 changes and initiating a regulation project to align the regulations accordingly.

441

442 Stauffer stated that change in SB92 was a mistake. The draft was written so the dental
443 applicants must be graduated from a CODA accredited program, **and** the program be
444 approved by the Board. She added there had been extensive discussion that the dental
445 hygiene and dental licensing requirements should mirror each other as much as possible.
446 The dental hygiene licensing statute, AS 08.32.014 still requires graduation from a
447 program that is, at the time of graduation, accredited by CODA and is approved by the
448 Board.

449

450 White added that he thinks a dentist cannot take the required exams unless they are
451 enrolled in or graduated from a CODA accredited school.

452

453 In reference to question 2, Alaska does have a reciprocal agreement with Canada as their
454 schools have the same academic outcomes as US schools. In fact CODA has a reciprocal
455 agreement with the corresponding Canadian entity, and Alaska honors that agreement.
456 Other nations have not completed agreements with CODA for reciprocation.

457

458 Ms. Donohue noted she had included the information from CA as background
459 information for this discussion, and that it was representative of what she was able to find
460 from the other jurisdictions she researched. Licensing requirements for other states
461 require that foreign-graduated dentists must hold a general dentist degree from a CODA
462 accredited program.

468 In regard to question 3, the Board sees their charge from the Legislature as licensing
469 qualified applicants in the interest of protecting the public in accordance with AS
470 08.36.070. Although the Board is very aware of the issues of access to care in rural
471 areas, there is nothing in the Dental statutes authorizing or directing the Board to address
472 access to care. However, the Board has a Dental Courtesy License that allows volunteers
473 to come into the state to deliver care for a specific time period, and to a specified client
474 group, as specified in a contract with a sponsoring entity.

475

476 The Board is aware of and understands the frustration surrounding access to care in rural
477 areas of Alaska. They are unsure what Rep. Guttenberg means in his statement: "The
478 issue then becomes stressed when otherwise qualified willing dentists who hold
479 international degrees have no other option to practice unless they go back and receive
480 another degree from an American institution." A dentist is not "otherwise" qualified
481 unless they have passed certain examinations and graduated from certain schools, in
482 accordance with Alaska statutes and examination requirements. As he states in his letter,
483 "safety is of course paramount and I understand the need for oversight...." The Board's
484 job is to protect the public by licensing qualified applicants, and to verify "qualified" they
485 require documentation that the applicant meets the minimum qualifications for licensure,
486 in accordance with Dental statutes. The Board agrees their Mission Statement clearly
487 defines their mission of "protecting the health, safety and welfare of Alaskans by
488 ensuring that practitioners possess competency, ethical standards, and integrity necessary
489 to offer or deliver quality services to consumers".

490

491 Dr. Kovaleski noted that due to loan-repayment programs, and various other programs
492 designed to attract dentists to rural programs, there are currently less vacancies in the
493 rural areas than ever before.

494

495 The Board directed Ms. Donohue to draft a response to Rep. Guttenberg, outlining their
496 discussion, then send to them for review and comments. That draft will then come back
497 to them at the Dec. 7, 2012 meeting for final approval.

498

499 Ms. Donohue advised the Board that the inquiry from Sean Halloran with Littler
500 Mendelson, PC asking about provisions for owners of dental offices who are not Alaska
501 licensed dentists, has been referred to Dept. of Law. SB92 enshrined the requirement that
502 dental offices be owned only be Alaska licensed dentists with a few named exceptions.

503

504 SB92 was signed by the Governor and became effective August 29, 2012. This will
505 require an extensive review of regulations to assure compliance with the changes enacted
506 in SB92. Dr. Stauffer and Dr. Silveira worked during the summer and have provided a
507 draft of changes, included in the Board packet, for the Board as a whole to review in

514 preparation for initiating a regulation project. All Board members are tasked with
515 reviewing the draft and be prepared to discuss at the Dec. 7, 2012 Board meeting.

540

541 Dan Branch from Dept. of Law rejoined the meeting and provided for the Board's
542 consideration a draft of a change to regulation 12 AAC 28.940 adding a subsection to
543 accommodate the specialty license holders.

544

545 Following extensive discussion and with the assistance of Dept. of Law the Board
546 initiated the following regulation change to accommodate the dental specialty license
547 holders who held a specialty license in 2012 and whose license will expire 12/31/2012.
548 This license type was repealed with the Legislatures passage of SB92 and cannot be
549 renewed.

561 **approved unanimously, it was**

565 **(f) Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, the board will**
566 **issue a license to practice dentistry to an applicant who (1) held an**
567 **active Alaska Dental Specialty license in 2012; (2) meets the**
568 **requirements of AS 08.36.110 and paragraphs (1) – (7) of (b) of this**
569 **section; and (3) provides a copy of the applicant’s certificate of**
570 **examination from the American Dental Association Joint Commission**
571 **on National Dental Examinations that the applicant has successfully**
572 **passed the written examinations given by the Commission.**

573
574 Chaney accepted a friendly amendment from Kovaleski to accept the abbreviation of
575 American Dental Association Joint Commission examination (NBDE).

576
577 Before Dan Branch left the meeting Sara Chambers asked for his direction regarding
578 refunds for specialty licensees who had been licensed for less than a year. Branch replied
579 that issue needed to be determined in the Department.

580
581 Mr. Branch left the meeting.

585 Stauffer asked if the Board needs to approve continuing education courses from a
586 program already approved by the Board. In accordance with 12 AAC 28.410(a)(4) the
587 continuing education courses must be approved by the Board.

591 Dr. Rios Anderson expressed his concern regarding the requirements to apply for a dental
592 license for the specialty license holders, specifically the requirement to obtain a license
593 verification from other jurisdictions. He holds a license in Puerto Rico, and it is
594 extremely difficult to get this documentation, unless you present personally to obtain it.
595 The Board expressed their understanding of Dr. Rios Anderson’s concerns, and are
596 hopeful the regulation change they just adopted will address the issue.

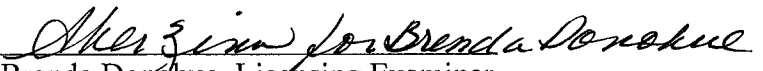

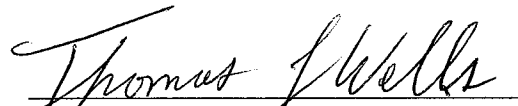
