- 0100-02-5 Allegation that an architect provided false information on a renewal application. (Referred 012/26/02)
- 0104-96-1 Allegation that a registered land surveyor's work was below the minimum professional standards for a land surveyor. (Referred 08/21/98)
- 0104-98-2 Allegation that a registered land surveyor did not provide services in a timely manner. (Referred 08/21/98)

#### **ACCUSATION FILED**

- 0103-95-10 Patrick W. Moore, Professional Civil Engineer License 5327, did not renew his license to practice engineering on December 31, 1993, therefore his license lapsed on January 1, 1994. Moore continued to practice engineering but he did not renew his license to practice engineering until January 28, 1996. Moore also continued to advertise in telephone yellow pages under the heading "Engineers-Consulting" as "AM Engineering, Lucas Road, Wasilla.....376-1090" during the period his license lapsed. (Accusation filed 06/21/01)
- Moore again allowed his license to practice engineering to lapse on December 31, 1997. On October 21, 1998, and while his license to practice engineering was lapsed, Moore submitted signed and sealed structural engineering plans and calculations to the Department of Public Work, Municipality of Anchorage that concerned an addition to the Fish & Wildlife Building, 1011 East Tudor road, Anchorage, Alaska. (Accusation filed 06/21/01)

### **LICENSING ACTION TAKEN**

- O104-96-2 Allegation that Douglas Stark, a registered land surveyor, did not accurately depict the lot sizes in a 1986 plat map. Investigation revealed that Stark's work as a land surveyor was below the minimum professional standards for a land surveyor in the State of Alaska. On December 10, 2002, Stark signed an agreement to surrender his land surveyor license. On December 16, 2002, the Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors voted to accept Stark's surrender of his land surveyor license. (Closed December 19, 2002)
- O104-99-3 Allegation that Douglas Stark, a registered land surveyor, did very poor work on a project. The allegation was substantiated in conjunction with the above investigation. (Closed December 17, 2002)
