## Agenda Item 2 Business Items

12:00 <u>Financials / Fee Assessment</u> – The Board reviewed their Schedule of Revenues and Expenditures recorded as of March 17, 2011.

16:00 Correspondence – Captain Arzt asked for clarification to correspondence from ASA to the San Francisco Board of Pilot Commissioners, as included in the meeting packet. Ms. Tesar explained to her knowledge that a bonus period had precluded a request for a rate increase by the San Francisco Bay Pilots.

<u>Drug and Alcohol Report</u> – The MPC explained the requirement for random drug and alcohol testing under AS 08.62.040 with Board oversight. The Board reviewed the MPC's 2010 audit of random samplings to determine compliance. The Board accepted the audit.

<u>Investigations</u> – The Chairman read for the Board the Division policy for closing complaints and investigations. The MPC presented an updated Investigation Report reflecting one additional complaint closed. The Board accepted the report.

<u>Tentative Meeting & Exam Dates</u> – The Board agreed to leave the July meeting tentative to exams and the October meeting either in Anchorage or Seward on October 19, 2011.

## Agenda Item 4 FPC Nav-Safety Information

27:28

The Chairman introduced revisions to current criteria for navigational and safety information as provided by registered agents to foreign pleasure craft in receipt of an exemption from pilotage as required by AS 08.62.180. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Arts commented to the proprietary nature of information provided by the agent.

Mr. Paul Axelson, representing North Pacific Maritime, objected to including COTP (USCG Captain of the Port) requirements for anchoring or transiting restricted areas.

Captain Arzt reminded the Board that the criteria applied to all regions.

Mr. Schrock asked for clarification of proprietary information. Mr. Erickson explained the agent intent for a 'one-stop shop.'

Mr. Erickson motioned to adopt the Chairman's recommendation for nine deletions. Mr. Arts seconded. Discussion followed.

Captain Collins expressed the need for safety when an exemption was issued. He offered an amendment to the motion for four deletions. Captain Arzt seconded.

Discussion continued.

Captain Arzt offered a fifth deletion to the amendment. Captain Collins accepted the amendment and offered a sixth.

The MPC gave a summary for the criteria as recommended by the committee per AS 08.62.180(c).

Mr. Schrock offered a seventh deletion to the amendment. Captain Collins accepted the amendment.

Mr. Schrock offered an eighth deletion to the amendment. Discussion ensued. Mr. Schrock deferred his deletion.

Captain Arzt offered an eighth deletion. Captain Collins accepted the amendment.

On Captain Collin's motion, seconded by Captain Arzt, by a roll call vote, it was

RESOLVED to accept the amendment for revision of the criteria by eight deletions.

- Customs and Immigration rules and regulations
- Forest Service regulations for Tongass National Forest
- Port information with phone numbers for harbors, repair facilities, medical facilities, pump facilities, fuel availability, air charter services in each area
- Suggestions for commercial cruising guides
- Adobe reader or Adobe website
- Pilot association web addresses and phone numbers
- Alaska hunting and fishing regulations
- Reminder for current passport

The MPC requested guidance for the form used to approve the information distributed by the registered agent. The Chairman directed the MPC to add a revision date and remove the reference to certification.

# Agenda Item 5 <u>Kodiak Port Parameters</u>

Captain Jeff Pierce, President of Southwest Alaska Pilots Association, explained the FAA and USCG had contacted his association to work through a safety issue for height of vessels in an overlapping flight pattern with the Kodiak airport. He identified cruise ships and tall sailing ships as most at risk and the method of notification appeared to be the challenge.

Mr. Mark Blair, representing the FAA, explained federal regulations held a height restriction of 137' in the glide slope to Kodiak Runway 25 while an aircraft is on approach. In coordination with SWAPA and USCG, a calling

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system had been established through the Marine Exchange of Alaska because ships and aircraft did not carry mutual communication equipment.

Mr. David Seris, USCG Office of Aids to Navigation, explained the Coast Guard would move to notify mariners through an update to the light list, charts and Local Notice to Mariners. He clarified that this was a voluntary system because they could not base a regulation on a carriage requirement that did not exist, specifically cell phones.

Mr. Blair clarified the airport would be shut down for an aircraft instrument approach when notified that a vessel with more than 137' in air draft intended to transit the flight pattern. He added that Dutch Harbor would be looked at next.

Discussion followed.

The MPC requested clarification for vessels in receipt of an exemption from pilotage to receive instruction for notification. The Chairman instructed it to be referenced in the letter transmitting the exemption certificate.

#### Agenda Item 6

#### **Pilot Fitness**

The Chairman summarized the Board's request to pilot associations that they address return-to-work requirements under 90 days through their in-house procedures to ensure the fitness of each association member while actively providing pilot service. He pronounced AMP and SEAPA as compliant, with a question for SWAPA's format.

The MPC gave clarification to the Board's authority under AS 08.62.040(a)(6) to approve articles, bylaws and rules of pilot organizations. She explained the question of SWAPA's proposal was if it was part of any of those documents.

Captain Pierce, representing SWAPA, explained their submission was a policy voted on by 2/3 of SWAPA's membership and required the member to self-certify that they would be fit when reporting for duty. He reminded the Board that the licensees were subcontractors and the associations only served to provide dispatch and economic distribution.

Discussion followed.

On a motion by Mr. Schrock, seconded by Mr. Arts, on a 6-1 vote, it was

RESOLVED to approve the amendment for pilot fitness to AMP's Operating Rules as presented.
