23	• License issued through the compact are issued under the member state board and subject to					
24	that state's practice of medicine requirements					
25	• Entering into the Compact requires an act from the state legislature					
26	• Member states are reimbursed weekly from the ILMCC, the full amount of their application and					
27	license fees

29	because it may help with the current barriers to recruiting physicians to work in Alaska and it promises

30 37	9. DEA Update, Katherine Brown, Diversion Unit Regional Manager					
38	Chair Wein invited Ms. Brown to address the Board. Ms. Brown shared recently released data from the					
39	Dept. of Health indicating overdose deaths in Alaska decreased in 2022 compared to 2021. The DEA has					
40	begun to shift from an almost exclusive focus on law enforcement and illegal drug interception to					
41	supporting more enhancements to substance abuse treatment options. The DEA recently lifted the					
42	requirement for providers to obtain a special "waiver" to prescribe Medication Assisted Treatment					
43	(MAT), such a buprenorphine for the treatment of opioid addiction. Instead, effective June 2023, all					
44	practitioners who hold a DEA number will have the ability to prescribe MAT with no limit to the number					
45	of patients they may serve. MAT prescribers will be subject to completing an online training, the					
46	training is still in the process of being developed. Physicians who are board certified in Addiction or					
47 48	graduated from medical school within the last five years will be exempt from the training. Public awareness about the dangers of illicit drugs remains critical. The DEA continues to track and intercept					

1 highly lethal forms of synthetic opioids being smuggled into the country from Mexico and China. Users

- 2 are often able to access these drugs off of the internet.

4 10. Citizen Concern – Limitations in New Telemedicine Legislation

5 Alaska resident, Ms. Debbie Penrose-Fisher was invited to address the Board regarding her barrier to

6 accessing much needed telemedicine services due to the limited criteria set forth in the new

7 telemedicine law enacted last year. According to AS 08.01.085(b), to qualify for telemedicine encounters

8 with a physician not licensed in Alaska, an Alaska patient must have a pre-existing relationship with the

9 physician practicing by telemedicine or the patient must be experiencing a life-threatening condition. AS

10 08.01.085 (j) (3), defines "life threatening" as "any disease or condition from which the likelihood of

- 11 death is probable unless the course of the disease or condition is interrupted."
- 12

13 In her testimony, Ms. Penrose-Fisher disclosed that she suffers from severe co-morbid chronic health

- 14 conditions. Ms. Penrose-Fisher's primary care provider has recommended she be evaluated and treated
- by medical specialists not available within a reasonable travel distance from her home. Her primary
- 16 physician is uncomfortable / unwilling to classify her conditions as "life threatening" at this time,
- 17 therefore Ms. Penrose-Fisher does not meet the criteria to be treated through telemedicine by a
- 18 physician not licensed in Alaska.

6	patient needing a physical exam prior to a patient being administered services by a pharmacist. The					
7	Board of Pharmacy is also requesting the repeal of the term "Cooperative," and instead adopt the term					
8	"Collaborative" in reference to Practice Agreements. It was noted by Natalie Norberg and Sarah					
9	Bigelow-Hood that "Collaborative Agreements" is the term already in use in regulation and in the health					
10	care industry to describe the formal practice agreement between physician assistants and physicians.
