35	On a motion duly made by Ms. Mielke and seconded by Ms. Bigelow-Hood, the Board approved by

42	3. Introduction to special topic: Interstate Licensing Medical Compact (ILMC)		
43	Chair Wein identified the purpose of this meeting as beginning an in-depth exploration into the policies,		
44	articles, sample legislation, and implications for Alaska of the Interstate Medical Compact; and		
45	acknowledging that this process will likely require a task force and additional meetings. Mr. Smith was		
46	invited to introduce himself to the board, reiterating that his role is to provide information and technical		
47	support to state boards who are contemplating or in the implementation phase of the ILMC. Mr. Smith		
48	provided an overview of the governing and financial structure of the compact, and the nine standards		
49	that are used as the criteria for licensure. According to Mr. Smith, the compact creates a new expedited		
50	license type for Alaska (hence the need for legislative approval) for which Alaska maintains full		

authority. Mr. Smith answered questions from board members related to the advantages for joining the compact; the FBI background check process; how licensee investigative/disciplinary matters are addressed within the compact; the ability for states to retain their traditional method of licensure; whether facility verifications are conducted as part of the criteria; and implications on telehealth. Mr. Smith clarified that the compact does not function as a clearinghouse or storage space for non-dynamic credentialing information (other entities such as the FCVS perform this function); instead, the compact is based on the legal understanding that another state has verified the credentialing information – so that other states in the compact may accept this verified information (through an agreement of reciprocity) without duplicating it. It was determined that more meetings and conversations are needed to continue the exploration of the medical compact for Alaska.

On a motion duly made by Ms. Mielke and seconded by Ms. Bigelow-Hood, the Board approved by roll call vote to request the Executive Administrator to work with the Chair to create a work group to further explore the ILMC and to develop a work plan to pursue the compact for Alaska.
