## 4 15. Chair Updates

- Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Work Group: Chair Wein invited Ms. Norberg to provide the
   following update: The first work group is scheduled for September 1, 2023, from 1:00 4:00. The
   purpose of the work session is to begin an in-depth analysis into the language and requirements of
   the compact. The meeting is open to the public, and any board members who wish to attend.
- 9 Holding Hospitals Accountable for reporting: According to statute (08.64.336), hospitals must 10 report certain issues (if the hospital revokes, suspends, conditions, restricts or refuses to grant 11 privileges, a licensee – or if the licensee resigns privileges while under investigation and the result of 12 the investigation could result in the privileges being revoked, suspended, conditioned or restricted). 13 Chair Wein advised that a facility's failure to make such a report may result in a \$5000 fine. 14 Conversely, a licensee subject to disciplinary sanctions may be fined up to \$25,000.00. It was made 15 known in documents secured through the Board's investigative processes in the last year, that at 16 least one facility may have intentionally avoided taking disciplinary action against a physician to 17 avoid having to report to the licensing board, while another facility was delayed in reporting. By not 18 taking actions against physicians, Chair Wein suggested facilities have become "defacto" medical 19 boards and the public is put at risk. It was suggested the Medical Board may need to approach the 20 legislature to request an increase in the fines for hospitals who fail to report.

 Medical Board should stay apprised. Chair Wein suggested the Board may want to consider issuing
 a statement, recognizing that Artificial Intelligence (AI) is being inserted into medical practice
 however decisions made with the assistance of AI are still the physician's responsibility.

Chair Wein opened the floor for board members to provide feedback or other items for consideration.
Dr. Heilala responded with a list of items for which he believes the Board needs to get legislators
involved, First, he supports taking follow up action against facilities in Alaska who foil to report.

including imploring the legislature to impose greater fines. Dr. Heilala cited a recent case in the national

- 42 media that revealed facilities avoided reporting a practitioner to licensing boards to protect the facility's
- 43 reputation. Second, it was suggested to seek clarity from the legislature with respect to the designation
- 44 of the Medical Board as an adjudicatory body and not a deliberative body. With this designation, the
