Agenda Item 6 - Regulations Project

 Chair Penwell directed the Board's attention to the Peer Review Regulations Project. She began by introducing what NARM uses as their process for Peer Review and redefine as 'Community Peer Review'. Provide a way to come together and provide routine, confidential, professional, protected, educational, nonpunitive, non-discoverable, a time where midwives come together and discuss cases together. She continued by recommending a definition of: assessment and evaluation of midwifery practice by other midwives to ensure quality of care and uphold the midwives code of ethics found in regulations appendix B. Community Peer Review could be the time to hold each other accountable and continue to improve midwifery care.

Former Chair Deborah Schneider explained Peer Review was written to allow midwives a safe place specifically to come together and discuss cases which fall under 12AAC 14.900(c)(3). She explained she felt the regulation was then added on to by including language to include disciplinary action for things like regulations breaks. Ms. Schneider discussed the Board had set up Peer Review as a way for the Board to remain informed of issues like what's identified in 12AAC 14.900(c)(3) and if there is a threat to public safety, it's identified. She continued to explain that how it is currently written does not fit the idea in which Peer Review was meant.

The Board continued to discussion options for clearly defining Peer Review, the roles in Peer Review, and separating out section 12 AAC 14.900(c)(3) as its own section of Peer Review. The discussion focused on how would the Board be adequately notified of charts which may need review but also keep the Board subjective to all licensees who may have potential investigations brought against them.

## Agenda Item 7 – Regulations Specialist

Regulations Specialist Sher Zinn joined to help the Board to help craft the amendments of the
Peer Review Regulations. Specialist Zinn advised the Board should remove from 12AAC 14.900
what they don't want and amend the sections they do what to keep. Chair Penwell explained
they're running in the issues where they cannot find the current regulation meets the true idea
