MEMORANDUM

TO: Chair Klein and Members of the ABC Board DATE: June 30, 2014

RE: Café 817 Lic. # 4449

On January 28, 2014, Mark Novosad, a licensee, entered a plea of guilty during court proceedings in Anchorage District Court on one count of Responsibility of Licensee, a violation of AS 04.16.150. He was given a \$2,500.00 fine and a \$50.00 court surcharge. There was no jail time or probation; fine only.

Basis for this charge stemmed from an October 28, 2013 compliance check where a 19 year old female employee of Café 817 took an alcohol order from an ABC Underage Agent who was under 21 years of age.

The 19 year old employee relayed the alcohol order to another employee who was of age, and who believed the 19 year old employee had checked the Under Age Buyer's ID. As a result, the Underage Buyer was provided with an alcoholic beverage.

Licensee, Mark Novosad, was working in the kitchen and was present. When contacted by and ABC Investigator, Mr. Novosad produced an Alcohol Server Education Card that was expired.

This is a notice to you as licensee that an alleged violation has occurred. If the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board decides to act against your license, under the provisions of AS 44.62.330 - AS 44.62.630 (Administrative Procedures Act) you will received an Accusation and Notice of your right to an Administrative Hearing.

VIOLATION: On 10-28-13, at about 1252 hours, under 21 Elisabeth Swan Siefken; age 19, took an alcoholic beverage order from a person under 21 and relayed the order to waitress Danielle Amiel Severson. Severson believing Siefken checked the underage persons ID, served the drink without checking ID. Cafe 17 owner Mark Steven Novosad was present in the kitchen area. When asked to provide proof of server education, he provided an expired TAM card. The card had expired on 7-15-11. A check of the Alcohol Beverage Control Board (ABCB) records revealed Novosad signed a notarized document on 12-21-12 that he and his employees who are in the service/sale/storage all have server education. Severson could not provide proof of current server training at the time of the incident. This is a violation of Title IV and Title 11.

Your attention is directed to AS 04.16.150: Licensee responsible for violations, AS 04.21.030: Responsibility of licensees, agents and employees, AS 04.16.052: Furnishing of alcoholic beverages to persons under the age of 21 by licensee, AS 04.21.025 & 3AAC304.465: Alcohol server education courses, AS11.56.200: Making a false statement.

You are directed to respond to the Director of the Alcohol Beverage Control Board in writing to this Notice of Violation within 10 days of receipt to explain what action you have taken to prevent a reoccurrence of this violation.

Narrative:

OBSERVATION:

On 10-28-13, at about 1247 hours, Underage Buyer 11-005; age 20, herein referred to as UB, entered Cafe 817. I remained outside. At about 1252 hours, UB sent me a text message essentially relating he had been sold a Winter Ale beer, age and ID were not asked. He paid for the beer with a recorded ten dollar bill.

OFFICER ACTION:

At about 1256 hours, I entered the establishment and located UB seated at a table with a glass of beer in front of him. I took a photo of UB with the beer. UB provided me his ID, identified who he placed the order with and paid, who delivered it to his table and then departed.

I made contact with who took the order; she as identified as Elisabeth S. Siefken, age 19, who served the beer; Danielle A. Severson and licensee Mark S. Novosad. Severson and Novosad were asked to provide server education cards.

INTERVIEW #1, I, E.S. SIEFKEN:

Siefken essentially stated she thought she could relay the order of an alcoholic beverage to someone who is allowed to serve. Siefken stated she has taken previous orders. After UB placed his order of Winter Ale, she related the order to Severson who poured and delivered the beverage to UB. Siefken has been working at Cafe 817 for about two months.

INTERVIEW #2, I, D.A. SEVERSON:

Conducted in a non-custodial manner. Severson essentially related she saw UB come in. Siefken asked a question about which of the beers were Alaskan beer, she told her Winter Ale, then Siefken relayed UB's order of Winter Ale to her. Severson said she was going to ask Siefken if she checked his ID but didn't. When asked why she would do that, she stated to see if he was old enough. Severson later related she didn't check ID because she thought Siefken did. Severson stated she had server education but she could not provide a copy. She has been selling/serving for about 5 years.

INTERVIEW #3, DI, M.S. NOVOSAD:

Conducted in a non-custodial manner. Novosad provided me with an expired alcohol server card. I asked him for a more current one. After looking around for it, he stated he did have a more current one. Regarding Siefken taking orders, he thought under 21's were allowed to take order but not serve them.

OFFICER ACTION:

Severson and Novosad were advised that they could not serve alcoholic beverages until they could show proof of server education. After discussing consequences of the violations, I departed the establishment.

INFORMATION:

On 10-28-13, at about 1552 hours, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABCB) received a fax from 276-3663 which depicted that Severson had current server education, TAP 104529, exp. 7-7-14, instructor Mulroy.

UB 11-005 completed 14 compliance checks on10-28-13. Three establishments sold/furnished alcohol to UB 11-005.

On 11-15-13, I reviewed the license file for Cafe 817 at the ABCB. On 12-21-12, Novosad signed a notarized document that he is familiar with Title IV laws, and that he and his employees that are in the service/sale/storage of alcoholic beverages, have current server education.

CASE STATUS:





On April 2, 2014, Latin Connection Entertainment, LLC, d/b/a Club Soraya was represented in Anchorage District Court by Hector Ortiz, 100% Shareholder of the Limited Liability Corporation. On behalf of the LLC, Mr. Ortiz entered a plea of guilty to one count of Responsibility of Licensee in violation of AS 04.16.150, resulting from an investigation of Adulteration. The corporation was fine \$3,000.00 and a \$50.00 court surcharge.

Basis for this charge stemmed from a complaint received on October 24, 2013 from a business professional who told investigators the week prior, he had hosted an event at Club Soraya and the mixed drinks that were being served by bar staff appeared to be adulterated.

ABC Investigators subsequently received and executed a search warrant on Club Soraya, seizing several bottles of alcoholic beverages that were present on the licensed premises.

The Department of Public Safety's Scientific Crime Lab determined that two of the samples submitted by ABC for analysis were likely to be adulterated as the bottles indicated a lower ethanol content than the control sample that was provided.

Further comparison with bottles of Peach Ciroc obtained from local liquor stores clearly indicates that the substance within Club Soraya's bottles is different from the commercial product sold as Peach Ciroc. Latin Connection Entertainment, LLC, was subsequently charged with Adulteration / Misbranding / False Advertising.

Narrative:

INFORMATION:

On October 23rd, 2013 at approximately 1113 hours, I received a phone call from Will COWANS (AK 6547821) of LeMak Entertainment. Cowans stated that he wished to make a complaint about Club Soraya, and believes they were serving adulterated liquor during the weekend of October 18th-20th.

CONTACT WITH COWANS:

Cowans explained that he is a club promoter and owns a business called LeMak Entertainment. Cowans stated that he held an event (The Ultimate Male Revue) on October 19th and 20th at Club Soraya and received

multiple complaints from his guests that they were served adulterated liquor by the club staff. Cowans went on to explain that he had knowledge of at least 4 separate incidents over the weekend that led him to believe this had occurred and provided contact information for the people involved in each incident:

- Dewandy Handy Saw bartender watering down grenadine, also ordered Grey Goose and club soda and does not believe it was Grey Goose.
- Jewell Noble Saw another brand of alcohol being poured into a Grey Goose bottle by club staff with a funnel.
- "Titania" Ordered Grey Goose, but doesn't believe she received Grey Goose. Also tasted drink from another customer who ordered Hennessy, but did not receive Hennessy.
- "Stephanie" Ordered Peach Ciroc, but received orange liquor and does not believe it was Ciroc.
- "Edie" Ordered Hennessy, but did not believe it was Hennessy.

Cowans also explained that he had a disagreement with the club's owner, Hector Ortiz, about the cost of him utilizing Club Soraya's facilities that night. Cowans explained that he was upset over the additional expenses and also believed LeMak Entertainment was suffering damages to its business reputation over the drink complaints. Cowans explained that there is a perception from his customers that he is ultimately responsible for all aspects of an event, including beverage service, even when these services are provided by another entity.

CONTACT WITH DEWANDA HANDY (AK 6393156):

On October 23, I contacted Dewanda Handy by telephone and spoke with her about this matter. Handy explained that she is a friend of Cowans and was assisting with the show this past Friday and Saturday night. Handy explained that she saw a female bartender pouring water into a bottle of grenadine (a non-alcoholic flavored syrup) and noted that the red liquid inside appeared to be substantially watered down as a result. Handy also explained that between 2030 and 2100 hours on Saturday night, she ordered a Grey Goose and club soda, and believes that the liquor within did not taste right and she did not believe it to be Grey Goose. Handy stated that this has become a regular drink for her and she is familiar with the taste.

While on the phone with Handy she provided me with her Alaska ID and stated that she would be willing to testify further about this matter if required.

CONTACT WITH JEWELL NOBLE (NC 23920372):

On October 23, I contacted Jewell Noble by telephone and spoke with him about this matter. Noble explained that he has worked with Cowans for 4-5 years and was performing in the shows this past Friday and Saturday night. On Saturday night, at approximately 2000-2100 hours, Noble stated that he saw a man whom he recognized as the owner of the club, "Hector" (Hector J Ortiz), approach a short Latina or Native American bartender and engage her in some sort of verbal discussion. Noble explained that he couldn't overhear the conversation from his position at the bar, but believes, based on the bartender's body language, that Ortiz was instructing her to do something she did not want to do. Noble stated that he then saw the bartender grab a funnel and an empty bottle of Grey Goose, and begin pouring liquid from another "off-brand" bottle of vodka into the Grey Goose bottle. Noble described the "off-brand" bottle of vodka as a tall glass bottle with an X on the label. Noble stated that he had heard of bartenders adultering alcohol in the past; but was shocked to see this done out in the open in an occupied bar.

Noble also stated that as he was passing through the crowd in the bar later in the evening he overheard another patron confronting a waitress about her drink being incorrect. Noble stated that this woman, whom he described as an older African American woman in her 40s with dyed blonde hair (later identified as Edith Burden, 4/18/1955), told the waitress that she had ordered a Hennessy (Cognac) and that the liquid contained in her drink was not Hennessy. Noble stated that another patron (later identified as Titania Harris, 12/10/1975) also tasted the drink and stated that she did not believe it was Hennessy. Noble overheard the waitress offer to refund Burden's money, but thought it was odd that she did not offer to replace the beverage.

While on the phone with Noble he provided me with his North Carolina ID and stated that he would be willing to testify further about this matter if required.

CONTACT WITH EDITH BURDEN (AK 0342653):

On October 24, I contacted Edith Burden by telephone and spoke with her about this matter. Burden stated that while at Club Soraya this past Saturday, a waitress came to her table to take her order and she ordered Hennessy. The waitress did not initially know if they had this beverage, left to check, then came back and told Burden they had the beverage. Burden then ordered a Hennessy in a brandy snifter, was brought the beverage, and paid and tipped the server. Burden stated that when she tasted the beverage she tasted it and didn't believe it was Hennessy. Burden added that it did not taste like any cognac that she was familiar with and told Cowans that she had been served something else. Cowans brought the error to the server's attention, who insisted that it was Hennessy. Burden stated that Cowans then asked a bartender friend of his (Harris) to taste the beverage. Burden explained that Harris smelled her beverage, asked her if she could taste it, then stated that she also did not believe it to be Hennessy.

While on the phone with Burden, she provided me with her Alaska ID and stated that she would be willing to testify further about this matter if required.

CONTACT WITH TITANIA HARRIS (AK 6680153):

On October 24, I contacted Titania Harris by telephone and spoke with her about this matter. Harris is employed by the Alaska Court System and also works part-time as a bartender at the Frontier Club. Harris stated that on Saturday she was asked by Cowans to taste Burden's's drink and share her opinion on whether or not she believed it to be Hennessy. Harris explained that she first smelled, then tasted the beverage. Harris explained that based on her experience as a bartender, she is familiar with the distinctive flavor of Hennessy and does not believe that Burden's drink was Hennessy.

While on the phone with Harris, she provided me with her Alaska ID and stated that she would be willing to testify further about this matter if required.

CONTACT WITH STEPHANIE SANDERS (AK 6900036):

On October 24, I contacted Stephanie Sanders and spoke with her about this matter. Sanders stated that she had also been at Club Soraya this past Saturday. Sanders stated that she ordered a peach Ciroc at the bar, and was given a beverage with an orange tint to it. Sanders stated that she is familiar with Ciroc and knows this beverage to be clear in color without a peach hue. Sanders stated that she confronted the bartender, who showed her the peach Ciroc bottle and told her it was Ciroc.

While on the phone with Sanders, she provided me with her Alaska ID and stated that she would be willing to testify further about this matter if required.

APPLICATION FOR SEARCH WARRANT:

Based on the information obtained from Cowans, Handy, Noble, Burden, Harris, and Sanders I applied for and was granted Search Warrant 3AN-13-1814SW, authorizing a search of the premises of Club Soraya and the seizure of opened or empty bottles of Grey Goose, Hennessy and Peach Ciroc.

CONTACT WITH HECTOR ORTIZ (AK 5459201)

I contacted Ortiz by telephone on October 25th and spoke with him briefly about events over the past weekend. During this conversation, Ortiz confirmed that both he and "Gabby" were working as the only bartenders this weekend. Ortiz then provided me with contact information for "Gabby" (whom I later identified as Marjorie Gabriela Sandoval).

CONTACT WITH MARJORIE "GABBY" SANDOVAL (AK 7117568):

At approximately 1409 hours, I contacted Sandoval via telephone and asked to speak with her about the events over this past weekend. I learned that Sandoval was at the premises of Club Soraya, and Investigator Hamilton and I entered the club to speak with her in person.

Sandoval denied any knowledge of adulteration, either by other employees of the Club or herself. Sandoval stated that she did see another employee pouring Monarch vodka into a Grey Goose bottle, but stated that this

was a mistake and did not believe any alcohol was served from that bottle. Sandoval explained that they frequently pour from 1.75L bottles of Monarch into smaller bottles of Monarch, but it is always the same alcohol in both, properly marked bottles. Sandoval added that this other employee was not a bartender and would not have been making drinks, but was working as a barback. Sandoval stated that just she and Ortiz were tending the bar this past weekend.

SERVICE OF SEARCH WARRANT 3AN-13-1814SW:

After speaking with Sandoval, Investigator Hamilton began serving our search warrant while I spoke with Ortiz. While Investigator Hamilton was serving the warrant, I noticed that he located several bottles of Peach Ciroc which were tinted orange, and did not appear to be consistantly colored amongst the three bottles. This inconsistancy suggested that these bottles had been adultered and did not contain the original spirit.

CONTACT WITH ORTIZ:

I contacted Ortiz and informed him that we were at Club Soraya to investigate multiple complaints of adultered alcoholic beverages. Ortiz initially appeared surprised, but after explaining the nature of the complaints, Ortiz understood and we spoke further about these matters.

As Investigator Hamilton located several bottles of Peach Ciroc which were not consistantly colored, I confronted Ortiz about these bottles being adultered. Ortiz readily agreed that the bottles were not the same and stated that he didn't recall adulterating the bottles himself, but would accept responsibility for it. Ortiz had no explanation for how the alcohol came to be adultered; other than he did not do it himself, and did not instruct anyone else to do it. Ortiz assurred me that it would never happen again, and that he would be much more vigilant in the management of his business. Ortiz also mentioned several times that he had an idea about how the adulteration may have occurred, but would not share this information with investigators.

Ortiz admitted that he may have served someone a differerent liquor other than Hennessy over the weekend, and would have done so intentionally. When asked to explain this a bit more, Ortiz stated that he may have grabbed the wrong bottle in a rush, poured the wrong drink, and served it to the customer anyway. Ortiz denied this being a regular practice at his bar.

Ortiz was informed of the possible penalties for adulteration and advised that he would most likely be receiving a summons in the next few days. Ortiz stated that he understood.

CONTACT AT BROWN JUG LIQUOR STORE:

After

serving Search Warrant 3AN-13-1814SW, Investigator Hamilton and I responded to the downtown location of Brown Jug Liquor to confirm our suspicions that the seized Peach Ciroc had been tampered with. I asked the clerk for permission to handle an unopened bottle of Peach Ciroc from the store shelf. I observed that while the bottle's base itself is tinted orange, the liquid within is clear. I then compared this bottle to our seized bottle (P13041896) under a variety of lighting conditions and angles and confirmed that the seized bottle contains an obviously orange tinted liquid, while the store's bottle does not.

PURCHASE OF CONTROL SAMPLES:

On October 28th, Investigator Beasley and I went to Gold Rush Liquors and purchased bottles of Grey Goose, Grey Goose L'Orange, Hennessy VS, Monarch Vodka and Peach Ciroc to be provided as control samples to the State Crime Lab. These items have the original factory seal intact and were entered, unopened, into evidence.

CONTACT WITH ORTIZ AT THE ABC OFFICES:

I spoke with Ortiz again on October 28th and asked him to come to the ABC Board offices so that I could issue a summons to him. Ortiz stated he would do so, but was uncertain if he would be able to make it that day.

Ortiz came to the ABC Office at approximately 1502 hours on October 29th. I spoke with Ortiz in the conference room and reminded him that he was free to leave at any time. Ortiz emphatically stated that he wanted to speak with me and intended to cooperate with our investigation to the greatest extent possible. I spoke with Ortiz at length about this investigation, and confronted him with the incongruous statements that he and Sandoval had made. Ortiz agreed with me that he was the only one who stood to profit from the adulterated liquor, agreed that the liquor was obviously adultered, agreed that the adulteration occurred on his premises, and repeatedly stated that he accepted responsibility (as the licensee) for the adulteration occurring. Ortiz, however, stopped short of admitting any role in adulterating the alcohol himself, or having any knowledge of who did.

I issued a summons to Ortiz as the agent of Latin Connection Entertainment LLC (Ortiz is the 100% owner) and explained the requirement to appear on November 20th, 2013. Ortiz signed the summons stating that he understood. Ortiz also had many questions about the process forward, which I explained to him. Ortiz expressed a desire to accept the consequences and move foward, and I suggested that he consult with an attorney further before making any decisions.

SUBMISSION OF EVIDENCE TO STATE CRIME LAB:

Evidence items in this case were forwarded to the State of Alaska Scientific Detection Laboratory on November 6th for further analysis. Specifically, Investigators have requested that control samples of each brand of alcohol be compared with the seized items and that a chemical analysis be performed to indiciate whether or not these substances are similar.

CONTACT WITH DIAGEO PLC:

On November 5th, I contacted Diageo, the parent company for Ciroc brand Vodka. On November 7th I received an e-mail from Pete Ruiz, Regional Director of Corporate Security for Diageo. Ruiz stated that they have not had any reports of browning in Ciroc Peach vodka, even after prolonged heat tests where the beverage was subjected to high temperatures for three months at a time. Ruiz added that it was highly unlikely that Peach Ciroc would change color.

CASE STATUS:

Based on the obvious tampering present in two of the three seized bottles of Peach Ciroc (P13041893 and P13041896), a single charge of Adulteration/Misbranding/False Advertising has been filed against Latin Connection entertainment, LLC. Additional charges are pending results from the Crime Lab indicating whether or not the seized bottles of Grey Goose or Herinessy have been tampered with.

This case has been forwarded to the Anchorage District Attorney's Office for further consideration.

Investigator Information:

Investigator Brandon Hunter has been an Investigator with the State of Alaska Alcohol Control Board since December of 2012. Prior to that, Investigator Hunter was a Police Officer with the Unalaska Department of Public Safety from June 2006 through August 2012. Investigator Hunter also served as a Community Service Officer with the University of Alaska Fairbanks Police Department from September 2002 through May 2006. In November of 2005, Investigator Hunter graduated from the Tanana Valley Campus Law Enforcement Academy in Fairbanks, Alaska. In addition to basic police training, Investigator Hunter has completed over 800 hours of specialized law enforcement training. Investigator Hunter's current duties include the investigation of crimes related to alcoholic beverage control within the State of Alaska, specifically, violations of Title 4 and 3 AAC.

Specific Case Information:

On October 23, 2013, Investigator Hunter received a telephonic complaint from Willie

AS 12.35.010-.120 Crim R 37 Cowans (7/19/1968), stating that he believed Club Soraya was serving adulterated liquor this past weekend.

Cowans explained that he is a club promoter, and owns a business called LeMak Entertainment. Cowans stated that he held an event on October 19th and 20th at Club Soraya and received multiple complaints from his guests about them being served adulterated liquor by the club staff. Cowans went on to explain that he had knowledge of at least 4 separate incidents over the weekend that led him to believe this had occurred, and provided contact information for the people involved in each incident.

On October 23, Investigator Hunter spoke with Dewanda Handy (5/27/1969). Handy explained that she is a friend of Cowans and was assisting with the show this past Friday and Saturday night. Handy explained that she saw a female bartender pouring water into a bottle of grenadine (a non-alcoholic flavored syrup) and noted that the red liquid inside appeared to be substantially watered down as a result. Handy also explained that between 2030 and 2100 hours on Saturday night, she ordered a Gray Goose and club soda, and believes that the liquor within did not taste right and she did not believe it to be Gray Goose. Handy stated that this has become a regular drink for her and she is familiar with the taste.

On October 23, Investigator Hunter spoke with Jewell Noble (2/19/1976). Noble explained that he has worked with Cowans for 4-5 years and was performing in the shows this past Friday and Saturday night. On Saturday night, at approximately 2000-2100 hours, Noble stated that he saw a man whom he recognized as the owner of the club, "Hector" (Hector J Ortiz), approach a short Latina or Native American bartender and engage her in some sort of verbal discussion. Noble explained that he couldn't overhear the conversation from his position at the bar, but believes, based on the bartender's body language, that Ortiz was instructing her to do something she did not want to do. Noble stated that he then saw the bartender grab a funnel and an empty bottle of Gray Goose, and begin pouring liquid from another "off-brand" bottle of vodka into the Gray Goose bottle. Noble described the had heard of bartenders adultering alcohol in the past; but was shocked to see this done out in the open in an occupied bar.

Noble also stated that as he was passing through the crowd in the bar later in the evening he overheard another patron confronting a waitress about her drink being incorrect. Noble stated that this woman, whom he described as an older African American woman in her 40s with dyed blonde hair (later identified as Edith Burden, 4/18/1955), told the waitress that she had ordered a Hennessy (Cognac) and that the liquid contained in her drink was not Hennessy. Noble stated that another patron (later identified as Titania Harris, 12/10/1975) also tasted the drink and stated that she did not believe it was Hennessy. Noble overheard the waitress offer to refund Burden's money, but thought it was odd that she did not offer to replace the beverage.

On October 24, Investigator Hunter contacted Edith Burden. Burden stated that while at

Club Soraya this past Saturday, a waitress came to her table to take her order and she ordered Hennessy. The waitress did not initially know if they had this beverage, left to check, then came back and told Burden they had the beverage. Burden then ordered a Hennessy in a brandy snifter, was brought the beverage, and paid and tipped the server. Burden stated that when she tasted the beverage she tasted it and didn't believe it was Hennessy. Burden added that it did not taste like any cognac that she was familiar with and told Cowans that she had been served something else. Cowans brought the error to the server's attention, who insisted that it was Hennessy. Burden stated that Cowans then asked a bartender friend of his (Harris) to taste the beverage. Burden explained that Harris smelled her beverage, asked her if she could taste it, then stated that she also did not believe it to be Hennessy.

On October 24, Investigator Hunter contacted Titania Harris. Harris is employed by the Alaska Court System and also works part-time as a bartender at the Frontier Club. Harris stated that on Saturday she was asked by Cowans to taste Burden's's drink and share her opinion on whether or not she believed it to be Hennessy. Harris explained that she first smelled, then tasted the beverage. Harris explained that based on her experience as a bartender, she is familiar with the distinctive flavor of Hennessy and does not believe that Burden's drink was Hennessy.

On October 24, Investigator Hunter contacted Stephanie Sanders (3/29/1983), who stated that she had also been at Club Soraya this past Saturday. Sanders stated that she ordered a peach Ciroc at the bar, and was given a beverage with an orange tint to it. Sanders stated that she is familiar with Ciroc and knows this beverage to be clear in color without a peach hue. Sanders stated that she confronted the bartender, who showed her the peach Ciroc bottle and told her it was Ciroc.

Investigator Hunter is aware that Hennessy, Gray Goose and Ciroc are generally considered call spirits; meaning that they would not be served unless the specific brand is requested by the customer. These spirits in particular are all "premium" spirits, and command a greater price than the typical well (or default) selections for a given spirit.

Based on the information provided by Cowans, Handy, Noble, Burden, Harris and Sanders, Investigators believe that the licensee or agents of Club Soraya placed an inferior spirit into Gray Goose, Ciroc Peach or Hennessy bottles and sold this inferior spirit as if it were the premium spirit. This action would constitute adulteration, misbranding or false advertising of alcoholic beverages, which is an A Misdemeanor offense under 3 AAC 304.405.

Request:

It is respectfully requested that Investigators be permitted to enter the premises described above to search for bottles of Gray Goose Vodka, Ciroc Peach Vodka, and/or Hennessy Cognac and to seize any imopened, empty, or partial bottles as evidence. Any liquid contained within will then be sent to the Alaska Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory and

On 04-10-13 at approximately 2042 hours, Trp. Thad Hamilton and I arrived at the De Canter Inn, an Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) board licensed liquor establishment, which has been issued a beverage dispensary type of liquor license, specifically license # 297. The De Canter Inn is located at mile 107 of the Sterling Highway.

Upon entry, I noted there were 4 persons sitting at the bar with alcoholic beverages placed before them. I asked who the bartender was and an individual by the name of Glenn A. TISDALE, AK6318788, identified himself as the owner of the bar (aka known as "the licensee") and as the acting bartender.

I asked G. Tisdale for his alcohol server education course (ASEC) card and he proceeded to provide me with the card in question (see photo of card). I noted the card was issued card number 69652, the card was signed by G. Tisdale, and the card had expired on 03-18-12. It was evident G. Tisdale was serving alcohol to the public with an ASEC card that had expired over a year ago.

I asked G. Tisdale when was the last time he attended an ASEC training course. G. Tisdale said he took the course in 2011 at Michael's restaurant when Steve Cornish was the cabaret, hotel, and restaurant retailers (CHARR) instructor. I questioned G. Tisdale further about the training and he admitted that he didn't renew his card because Cornish is no longer training the ASEC course and Cornish did not send Tisdale an ASEC renewal reminder card. Tisdale then changed his story to say he took the ASEC class with his wife, Trudy TISDALE, AK6436411.

I asked T. Tisdale if she had a valid ASEC card and she said she did. I examined her ASEC card and I noted it was valid and wasn't due to expire until 06-20-15. I advised G. Tisdale he was to cease serving alcohol and that if he wished to keep the bar open, his wife; T. Tisdale was to assume the responsibilities of the acting bartender. I also told G. Tisdale I would contact the ABC board to determine the status of his ASEC training and verify if he was operating without a valid ASEC card. G. Tisdale agreed to my suggestion and I left the bar thereafter.

On 04-10-13, I contacted ABC board enforcement supervisor, Robert Beasley, and ABC investigator, Joe Hamilton, and requested their assistance with contacting CHARR. On 04-11-13 at approximately 0955 hours, Inv. Hamilton advised me that according to CHARR, G. Tisdale took his last ASEC class on 3-18-09 and his ASEC card expired on 3-18-12.

On 04-16-13, I met with and I advised G. Tisdale of my investigation. G. Tisdale stated after he spoke with me, he renewed his ASEC card and was issued a new card (see attached photo). G. Tisdale also said he did not take the ASEC renewal class with his wife as previously stated. After speaking with G. Tisdale, I issued him a summons to appear in court regarding the charge of AS 04.21.025(c), failure to maintain an alcohol server education course card; which is a class A misdemeanor charge.

On 04-17-13, ABC board investigator, Joe Hamilton, provided me with a Notice of Violation (NOV) that was issued to the De Canter Inn regarding the violation of G. Tisdale's failure to possess a valid alcohol server education course card. The NOV also documents that G. Tisdale, as the licensee, signed a notarized document on or about 12-20-11 stating that he and his employees have their current ASEC training.

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

OBSERVATION:

On 3-22-14, at about 1822 hours, Underage Buyer 13-012; age 18, herein referred to as UB, entered Nikko Garden. I remained outside. At about 1827 hours, UB sent me a text message essentially relating she had been furnished a Budweiser beer, ID was checked, age was not asked. The ID presented was a valid military dependent card which has the date of birth on the back of the card in the upper left corner. It reads, "1995AUG16". UB later advised me that she told the server where the DOB was on the ID. The server then read the correct DOB out loud. UB said a person behind the sushi bar said UB was only 19. The sever apologized for trying to figure out the math from the card and stated something to the effect her mind calculator was all weird and that she had a problem with getting caught selling to a minor before. She laughed and gave UB the beer. The person behind the sushi bar opened the beer for UB.

OFFICER ACTION:

At about 1831 hours, I entered the establishment and located UB seated at the sushi bar. Off to her left on the counter was an opened Budweiser beer. I took a photo of UB with the beer. UB provided me with her ID, identified her server and exited the establishment. I made contact with the server whom I know from a previous contact. Her name was Si Cha Sin, licensee. I advised Sin that UB was 18.

INTERVIEW #1, DI, S.C. SIN:

Conducted in a non-custodial manner. I showed Sin the ID. I told her she looked at the ID and she replied, "1995". I asked if she just went the wrong way and she agreed (Referencing the on or before date to be sold to). Sin then said that she denied the sale but UB told her it was okay. She then talked about confusing 2014 and 2015. Even if she had the year 2015, UB still would not be old enough. Sin said that someone told her before lunch that she better be careful that a 19 year old girl with long hair was trying to get alcohol. Not even four hours ago she said she was advised. Sin has been serving about 29 years and has received alcohol server training, TAP 120182, exp. 8-5-16.

OFFICER ACTION:

Sin was issued a summons for furnishing alcohol to a person under 21. A mandatory court date of 4-18-14, 0830 hours, Kenai District Court was assigned. While completing the summons, Sin asked if she could just pay a fine and not go to court. After issuing the summons, I departed the establishment.

NOTE:

UB completed 12 compliance checks on 3-22-14. Four establishments sold/furnished UB an alcoholic beverage.

EVIDENCE:

Digital audio and photos. The Budweiser beer was left at the establishment.

CASE STATUS:

Closed by issuance of summons. Referred to the DAO for prosecution.



Hickel Investment Company acquired the Voyager Inn in July, 2013. The hotel is a 40-room boutique hotel that appeals to principally European tourists. All but 1 room contain kitchenettes, so a guest can dine in his or her room without leaving the property. The hotel formerly housed the Corsair Restaurant in the basement of the building. That restaurant was destroyed by flood damage, which has been fully remediated.

The Voyager Inn encourages tourism as it is an attractive property that appeals to a specific market niche. Hickel Investment Company is currently investing in excess of \$400,000 to upgrade the room furnishings and amenities to increase that appeal.

The Voyager offers tourism information to guests in the lobby, including an extensive guide to dining and beverage outlets in the downtown area, which is maintained by the front desk.
