Summary:

On 11-6-14, at about 1508 hours, Taco's Cancun server Janessa Estella Ruf furnished an alcoholic beverage to a person under the age of 21 (Underage Buyer 13-011; age 19). When asked to provide proof of server education, she stated she has been an employee of 3 to 4 months but has not attended server education. Ruf further stated her employer, Gerardo Tafo Ramos, has told her several times she needed to get one. Charges of furnishing alcohol to a person under 21 and failing to obtain server education are being referred to the DAO for prosecution. The licensee on file for license # 5102 is Taco's Cancun, Inc. This organization is owned by Ramos. Ramos was present on the premises and asked to provide proof of attending server education. Ramos presented aTAP card which had expired on 7-18-14. Ramos agreed that he has asked Ruf several times to obtain server education and knew she did not have current training but kept her on the schedule. A charge of no server education is being referred for Ramos to the DAO for prosecution. A charge of licensee responsibile for violations is being referred to the DAO on Taco's Cancun, Inc.







This complaint is based upon the statement of Underage Buyer 13-011; age 19, herein referred to as UB. UB was conducting an alcohol compliance check at the Defendant's place of employment, Taco's Cancun, a licensed liquor establishment in Wasilla, where the Defendant furnished UB a glass of Alaskan Amber beer, an alcoholic beverage. When Investigator F.R. Hamilton, Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, asked the Defendant to provide proof of attending formal server education, she stated she has not been to a server class and has been working at the establishment for 3 to 4 months. Finally, UB was a person whose age was verified by Investigator Hamilton prior to the furnishing and UB was working as an undercover operative for the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

This complaint is based upon Investigator F.R. Hamilton, Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABC), who had conducted an underage compliance check at Taco's Cancun, a licensed liquor establishment in Wasilla. According to ABC Board records, the establishment's licensee of record is Taco's Cancun, Inc., which is 100% owned by Gerardo Tafolla Ramos. As a result of that compliance check, on-duty server of 3 to 4 months Janessa E. Ruf was asked to provide proof of attending formal server education. Ruf advised Inv. Hamilton that although she has been told more than five times to obtain server education by Ramos, she has failed to do so. Although she has failed to obtain server education, Ramos continued to put her on the schedule to serve, a violation of AS 04.21.025(c). When Ramos was asked to provide proof of server education, Inv. Hamilton was given an expired TAP card, #104796, expired on 7-18-14, a violation of AS 04.21.025(c).

had offered as a resolution a one-year suspended imposition of sentence with a \$250 fine, same offer that was given to the other server and that case is already closed with that offer.

Then moving to 3880, Taco's Cancun, Mr. Ramos, in his representative capacity, again, I don't see any information about Taco's Cancun having any other prior violations.

However, of course, they're responsible for the violations that do occur at their facility. In this case, it appears that Mr. Ramos, acting as the owner of the company, he was aware that both he and the other server -- looks like both of the -- or, excuse me, his had expired for about three to four months and the other -- the employee, Ms. Ruff, I don't believe that she'd ever acquired the -- that she had had the server education herself and yet both of the individuals were -- they were working in the capacity to serve alcohol.

The state did extend an offer to Taco's Cancun. Of course, corporate comes down to the monetary sanctions. I see this is a Class A (indiscernible) the maximum fine up to \$500,000. I had conferred with the ABC individuals to find out what is typical.

there were two servers who were out of compliance. He thought it might have been towards the higher end. However, in order to resolve the cases and we could see that in this area, Mr. Ramos is -- although he's acting in two capacities, that means he is individually taking both hits --

MR. BEARD: -- for it and he's -- and Taco's Cancun will still have to address the Alcohol Beverage Control for whatever kind of licensing action they may have. So there's probably still a potential for more action that's going to be in the future and, therefore, the state thought the \$1,000 for the initial violation is appropriate, I think something in that range of the 1,000 to 2,500 but the state would certainly be satisfied with anything in that range.

THE COURT: Well, let me -- in trying to just deal with what the real possible penalties are. I have other things for me to look at.

Look at -- one of the things to look at is Chapter 85 in Title XII which says the provisions of this title apply to all criminal actions and proceedings in all courts except where a specific provision is otherwise made which would seem to mean then that that sentencing information also would have -- that sentencing statute would also apply to some -- a crime under 04.

MR. BEARD: And I approached on that same area. I know that Title IV does have some specific penalties but I could not find anything as a specified penalty under the 04.16.150.

THE COURT: Yeah, the default then becomes the A misdemeanor.

MR. BEARD: Yes, Your Honor, and if I recall correctly -and I'm not certain that I do -- when I did call OSPA to find
out if they wanted to handle the case, I did ask about the
sentencing ranges, how do they approach when they're dealing
with the corporate defendants. They were under the same
impression, if I recall correctly, that it does fall under the
default.

THE COURT: Now, the interesting aspect though is that Taco's Cancun is a sole proprietorship and I can't find a definition for organization in Title XII but in Title XI is organization means a legal entity including a corporation, company, association, firm, partnership, joint stock company, foundation, institution, government society, union, club, church or any other group of persons organized for any purpose. That seems to indicate more than a sole proprietorship.

MR. BEARD: Yes, Your Honor, and I believe in this case, Taco's Cancun is a corporation.

MR. PARVIN: They are incorporated.

MR. BEARD: The -- it's listed as Taco's Cancun,

Incorporated, so --

MR. PARVIN: The corporation documents or licensing is provided in discovery incorporated -- duly incorporated in 2007.

THE COURT: Okay. I guess out of abundance of caution,
Mr. Ramos, I'm going to say as far as the case against Taco's
Cancun, if the case could also prove that you fit the
definition of organization, then the maximum fine becomes
\$500,000. If not, then the maximum fine is \$10,000. I'm not
planning on getting anywhere near \$500,000. I'm not planning,
frankly, in getting anywhere near \$10,000. It'll be less than
that but you understand though that that's the possible range
here.

MR. RAMOS: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: If they can prove the organization, it'd be up to -- well, it's a half a million bucks.

MR. RAMOS: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Does that make you change your mind about entering your pleas here today?

MR. RAMOS: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Very good. Thank you. I do accept that now as being fully advised and knowing and voluntary.

Mr. Beard, anything else you wanted to add?

MR. BEARD: Nothing, Your Honor.

MR. PARVIN: Yes, Your Honor, I'd let Mr. Beard know that we were -- the intent -- our intent was to just enter a guilty plea and leave it to Your Honor to set what was an appropriate sentence. There is no minimum sentence for these kinds of crimes and I feel strongly about these cases sometimes. I just do. There is a need, no question about it, to sanction and investigate and prosecute and have convicted irresponsible bar owners or liquor store owners or whomever else and that's necessary and I think it's perfectly appropriate. It should happen. There should be civil liability, there should be criminal liability for people who are bad actors in this context and so don't take my comments that I'm going to make, you know, that we should just turn a blind eye when there have been violations.

That said, when you are setting a sentence, I think it's important to know the facts of the case. This is a corporation that we're talking about but that corporation is Gerry Ramos. In 2007, as a young guy, he figured he would give a try of opening up his own business so in the strip mall, he opened Taco's Cancun and it's been going pretty well. I think it has a much bigger -- it's a lunch place, primarily. People go there for dinner but he's -- as he's working the place 12, 15 hours a day, seven days a week for that long, people go there for lunch. It's not a bar and I'll get to that in a minute.

As -- in terms of the facts of this case, he told this 1 2 young employee who had been working for him -- she had told 3 the police officers as he had told --- he told her five -- at least five times you got to get your card, you got to get your 4 card. I'm doing it next week, I'm a -- got -- we're going to do it and she didn't do it. By the same token, he thought he 6 7 had his card and it expired. He went down the next day, got it renewed and it was back up and running. I asked him if he 8 9 fired the girl and he said -- and he looked at me like I --10 like why would I fire her for that. You know, it was a -- she 11 got the card and we sell so little beer, so little alcohol 12 that he wouldn't have fired her even if it was, as I've come 13 to know Gerry. 14 15

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In terms of the alcohol and the sales and all of that,

I'd asked him about it and he said, frankly, the licensing,

the insurance costs, all of the things that are associated

with the almost non-existent beer sales that he has, says it's

almost not worth it. Well, why even bother and he says so

it's a -- because one of his customers might want a beer with

their lunch or some -- a customer might want a beer. I asked

him how many cases of beer he goes through and he said I don't

think it's cases and I think he's talking about annually.

Maybe not but I didn't go that far into it.

He's a small business owner. He employs a very few people. We had to miss last week because he has one relief

cook who couldn't get in so he couldn't come to court because he does the cooking, he does the waiting the tables, he does the bussing, he does the whole works. He's rightfully proud of the little business that he's built and he's also fully aware of the mistake that he made both with not having his license -- or having his expire and then -- but then what does he do, fire her? And I guess that -- I mean, maybe that's the answer.

It -- the thing that kind of doesn't -- I used to smoke. I walked into a smoking -- to a store and I saw this girl just bawling her eyes out. She'd been looking for a job for months and months and months but she'd just been fired because she sold a undercover guy in one of these operations a pack of cigarettes. Yes, we should not be selling cigarettes to minors. Yes, Gerry should not be -- he should have fired her when she didn't have her card or he should have fired her when she didn't catch the light -- the police reports are clear. The girl picked up the license. She looked at the license but they got the math wrong and sold him the beer anyway.

The Board had gone out with this 19-year-old and had gone to 24 establishments. Twenty percent of them had sold alcohol to a minor that night and it's commendable that they're going out and doing that kind of work. I'm not suggesting that it's not but at the same time, the consequences are serious. What I would -- in terms of sentencing, either -- a sanction needs

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myself, that I lost track of -- you know, of that, to making sure, you know, she had it and myself, as well, for that TAM card that I -- that had expired. I did not -- was aware of it. It's one of those things our -- if it's -- doesn't get posted or it doesn't -- a reminder to get it renewed, you know, with that being a -- of a -- being a self-employed owner in a small place, I mean, you really keep track of that really easy. It doesn't pop out your mind that you have to go renew it. So it was one of those things that I wasn't aware of that until the -- that investigator actually asked me for it that I knew when I went and grab it from the office, it was expired already and that was when I noticed that it was expired but other than that, I don't got much to say. I did talk to Greg and -- you know, after the incidence and I really was really not even thinking of having alcohol and beverages there anymore because of the fees that I pay to that ABC Board. I nearly -- I have to pay insurance for alcohol as well and I have to hire people that are over 21 and it's always a -- you know it's not a full-service place so it's harder for them to make their money off the tips or, you know -- so it came to a point that, you know, I was also thinking about it. I don't really make money off of this and my business is not really supporting itself or -- from alcohol. Most of our income that we do it is from food and it's -- you know, and it got to a point it got me thinking about that and --

THE COURT: Are you still serving alcohol there now or --

MR. RAMOS: I still am and the thing that I still -- I am serving alcohol because I just renewed the license this year. I mean, so I already paid all the fees and everything all so I really -- you know, with all this trouble you know, if it is too much, you know, that -- trouble for, you know, having this -- situations like this, you know, it -- I don't know if I'm going to be able to -- I mean, I'm going to serve any alcohol and, you know, once it expires, the license.

THE COURT: Mm-hmm. Well, I mean, a lot of people do like having a beer with Mexican food and --

MR. RAMOS: Yeah.

THE COURT: -- so it's not much of a surprise there.

MR. RAMOS: And I do have customers, they do, you know, like have a Mexican beer, a draft beer, you know, while they're --

THE COURT: Right.

MR. RAMOS: -- having a dinner or, you know, before going to the movies or something but it's not that people go and have drinks. It's not a --

THE COURT: Right, it's not like the Mug Shot or something.
