Package Store

This renewal was brought before the Board in April 2017 for a protest and for lack of minimum operations.

The City of Valdez protested the renewal for the following reasons (3 AAC 304.145(a) and (e)):

- Not open during normal business hours.
- No operational or physical business in Valdez associated with license.
- If this package store license (and Acres Beverage Center #1441) remains unused, there can be no investment or development of a fully functional package store due to population limits. (AS 04.11.400)
- City of Valdez does not support long-term holding of inactive licenses.

However, on April 4, 2017, the Valdez City Council voted to rescind their protest with the condition that Three Bears sell or transfer the license within a period not to exceed six months (by October 4, 2017).

Investigator Hamilton determined that the licensee did not provide sufficient information to show that they met minimum operating requirements found in 3 AAC 304.170(j) for 2015 and 2016. One major problem is that the licensee moved the location of the store but did not apply for or receive board approval for a transfer of location—a violation for which NOV AB16-0628 was issued on December 21, 2016. In the subsequent back and forth between the licensee and various directors, additional information was requested but not provided, and meetings with the director were requested but not accommodated.

At the April 6, 2017, meeting, the Board tabled the item to give time for the licensee and the director to meet.

I met with Three Bears on April 21, 2017. I asked the licensee to provide additional information required to satisfy 3 AAC 304.170(j).

3 AAC 304.170

- (i) If a license is exercised only to satisfy the minimum operating requirement under AS 04.11.330(a)(3) or 3 AAC 304.107(c)(1), a licensee has the burden of proof to show that the licensed premises was operated in a similar fashion to other licensed premises of the same type and shall, at a minimum,
 - (1) provide signage, of sufficient size and visibility to show that the premises is open for business, stating business name and hours of operations;

Three Bears admits that after the store was moved to a non-authorized location, the logo sign and hours sign were lost, so there were no signs in 2015 and 2016.

- (2) offer for sale at the licensed premises, as appropriate to the type of license, a variety of malt beverages, wines, and distilled spirits;
- A photo labeled "2015/2016" is provided showing a variety of alcoholic beverages.
- (3) visibly display the alcoholic beverages stock in a licensed package store premises;
- A photo labeled "2015/2016" is provided showing a variety of alcoholic beverages.
- (4) provide seating in beverage dispensary licensed premises for at least one-half of the maximum number allowed by the occupancy permit;

Not applicable to a package store license.

(5) comply with all state or municipal health, fire, and zoning laws or ordinances required for the operation of business;

Unclear if the new, unauthorized location complied with these laws.

- (6) maintain a record of all purchases of alcoholic beverages for resale on the licensed premises; and Records of purchases for this store have been provided. Records show purchases from Odom Corporation and Southern Glazer's of Alaska made in November of 2015. No records showing purchases in 2016 were provided.
- (7) record sales with a cash register that retains a record of transactions.

No cash register records were provided.

It is impossible to conclude that Three Bears has met the requirements of 3 AAC 304.170(j) proving that they operated for at least 30 eight-hour days in 2015 and 2016. They claim as mitigating circumstances that previous ABC Board staff direction indicated that a minimal amount of information was sufficient to meet the standard.

As noted in correspondence from Three Bears, they are in negotiations to sell the license.

Recommendation: Deny the renewal based on lack of compliance with minimum operating

requirements.

Should the Board consider renewing the license, I recommend that the Board direct me to prepare an accusation and a civil fine for board consideration at the September meeting, for a violation of AS 04.11.150(a) which authorizes a package store licensee to sell alcoholic beverages to a person present on a licensed premises, and require a transfer application be submitted by September 30, 2017.

Dear Director McConnell,

This letter is in response to the requests that you made at the April 21, 2017 meeting in your offices between you, David Weisz, and me and this letter is also in preparation for Three Bears' appearance before the ABC Board at the upcoming July 11, 2017 meeting in Fairbanks.

Responses to Requests from April 21, 2017 Meeting

At our April meeting, you requested documentation regarding alcoholic beverages purchased for resale during our operation of License 4165 in 2015 and 2016. Records of those purchases are attached as Exhibit 1. At our meeting you also asked for a list of all personnel who were involved in operating License 4165 in 2015 and 2016, and that list consists of one person, Curt Wilson.

Items in Preparation for Appearance Before the ABC Board on July 11, 2017

During the course of our addressing Notice of Violation AB16-0628 (the "Notice"), the question has come up more than once as to why we did not submit a transfer application in accordance with the next to last paragraph of Director Franklin's January 3, 2017 email (please see Exhibit 2).

As we discussed at our April meeting, the reason we did not file the transfer application for a location change as described in Director Franklin's email was because we thought it was very likely that we would soon be filing a transfer application for a change of ownership. And this is partly why in both our first response letter to Director Franklin and then in our second response we requested the meeting with the Director that we are entitled to per the last paragraph of the Notice.

Of course, we know that through various circumstances, that meeting did not take place with Director Franklin and it did not take place with Acting Director Chambers. Rather, your meeting with David Weisz and me on April 21, 2017 was when Three Bears was finally able to have the meeting provided for in the last paragraph of the Notice.

And at that meeting, we discussed with you how several parties in Valdez have expressed interest in purchasing License 4165 from us and that we thought we were close to reaching an agreement with one particular individual name Ryan Sontag. We also related how there had been some delays along the way as he first wanted to secure a location before he entered into a purchase agreement with us. Finally, though, just this Tuesday, June 20, 2017, we entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement with Ryan (please see Exhibit 3—price information blacked out as proprietary information per AS 40.25.120(a)(12)). Also, attached as Exhibit 4 is email correspondence with another individual (David Verfaillie) who's interested in purchasing License 4165 from us if our deal with Ryan somehow falls through.

Also, please note that when we appeared before the Valdez City Council on April 4, 2017 regarding their protest of our renewal of License 4165, we told them that we thought we were close with Ryan and they related how Ryan had also told several of them that he was close to a deal with us. However, we also told the Council that other individuals had expressed interest and that we didn't necessarily want to be tied to doing a deal with Ryan but we instead asked for six months to enter into a deal with Ryan or someone else if the deal with Ryan fell through. And as you know, it is with those contingencies that the City of Valdez suspended its protest of our renewal of License 4165.

Finally, in order to make sure that the complete record of our responses to the Notice is before the Board at its July 11, 2017 meeting, we're also including a copy of our response to Acting Director Chambers together with all of the attachments to that response (the "Second Response"). And we request that both this letter with its three exhibits and the Second Response be part of the package given to the Board in relation to our appearance at the July 11, 2017 meeting.

Dear Mr. Mierop,

I have received and reviewed your response to our Notice of Violation. I have some issues with it that I hope you are able to address. First, you never revealed where it is exactly that you have been operating the license to meet minimum operating requirements. Our investigation found that the periodic sale of alcohol was not occurring on the original licensed premises, which is a major problem. As you are well aware, a liquor license is not something you pick up and set down wherever you like, it is attached to a physical premises.

Second, operating to meet the minimum requirements after having filed waivers indicates an intention to hold onto a license even though there is nowhere to operate it. That is essentially what your response said. It was very vague on any details regarding how you intend to fix this. I think that the board will not like to see that having exhausted waivers and determined to hold on to the license anyway, you have minimally operated the license in the method you have chosen.

I am copying the regulation regarding operating only the minimum operating requirements here. As you can see, you as the licensee have the burden of proof to prove each and every one of these things to the board. Nothing in your letter tells me how you are going to do that. In fact, much of the information gathered by our enforcement team about your operations in Valdez speaks to the exact opposite of these requirements:

<u>3 AAC 304.170. Waiver of annual operating requirement and minimum operating requirements</u> (a) Except as provided in this section, the board will deny an application for renewal of a license if the licensed premises were not operated for the time required by <u>AS 04.11.330(a)(3)</u> or (d)...

- (j) If a license is exercised only to satisfy the minimum operating requirement under AS 04.11.330(a)(3) or 3 AAC 304.107(c)(1), a licensee has the burden of proof to show that the licensed premises was operated in a similar fashion to other licensed premises of the same type and shall, at a minimum,
- (1) provide signage, of sufficient size and visibility to show that the premises is open for business, stating business name and hours of operations;
- (2) offer for sale at the licensed premises, as appropriate to the type of license, a variety of malt beverages, wines, and distilled spirits;
- (3) visibly display the alcoholic beverages stock in a licensed package store premises;
- (4) provide seating in beverage dispensary licensed premises for at least one-half of the maximum number allowed by the occupancy permit;
- (5) comply with all state or municipal health, fire, and zoning laws or ordinances required for the operation of business;
- (6) maintain a record of all purchases of alcoholic beverages for resale on the licensed premises; and (7) record sales with a cash register that retains a record of transactions.

I will allow you 10 days from the date of this email to provide me with a revised response to the NOV which explains exactly how and where you have been operating the license since you ran out of waivers and provide me with the evidence required as above. I will allow you 30 days to file a transfer of location to where ever it is in Valdez that you intend to operate the license on a seasonal basis, including proof of right to possession of the proposed premises, such as a lease.

If I do not receive these responses as outlined above, my recommendation will be to proceed to an accusation requesting that the board take action against this license which could include suspension, denial, a fine, or any combination thereof.

PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT

This Purchase and Sale Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into and made effective as of June 20, 2017 by and between Three Bears Alaska, Inc. (an Alaska corporation, the "Seller") Ryan H. Sontag (a natural person and resident of Alaska, the "Buyer").

RECITALS

A. The Seller currently owns Alaska Package Store License No. 4165 (the "License").

B. The Seller wishes to sell to the Buyer, and the Buyer wishes to purchase from the Seller, the License.

AGREEMENT

Now therefore, in consideration of the premises and the promises set forth herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Sale of License; Purchase Price.

- 1. Subject to the Closing Conditions defined and set forth below, the Seller hereby agrees to sell, transfer and forever remise the License either to the Buyer or, upon the request of the Buyer, to an entity owned and controlled by the Buyer.
- 1.2 The Purchase Price shall be \$ Dollars) (in full or in part, the "Purchase Price")
- Within seven (7) days of the full execution of this Agreement, the Buyer shall pay to the Seller a refundable deposit of \$\)
 Dollars) (the "Deposit").
- 1.4 At the Closing defined and described below, the Buyer shall pay to the Seller \$ Dollars) (the remainder of the Purchase Price) as final payment for the License.

- 2. **Conditions to Closing.** The Closing shall not take place and there shall be no transfer of the License from the Seller to the Buyer until all of the following conditions (the "Closing Conditions") shall have been satisfied:
 - 2.1 The Seller and the Buyer shall have complied with all requirements of laws and regulations applicable to the transfer of the License, including the requirements of the Alaska Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (the "ABC Board") and any other authority administering such laws.
 - 2.2 The ABC Board and any other applicable authority shall have approved the transfer of the License from the Seller to the Buyer.
- 3. Closing; Return of Deposit. Upon, and only upon, the satisfaction of the Closing Conditions, the Buyer shall pay the Purchase Price to the Seller and the Seller shall sell, transfer and forever remise the License to the Buyer. If the Seller becomes subject to a final nonappealable order from the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board or another authority of competent jurisdiction, which order either directly or effectively prohibits the Seller from transferring the License to the Buyer, the Seller shall promptly refund the Deposit to the Buyer.
- 4. Representations and Warranties of the Buyer. In order to induce the Seller to enter into this Agreement, the Buyer hereby represents and warrants to the Seller as follows:
 - 4.1 The execution and delivery of this Agreement by the Buyer and the performance by the Buyer of his obligations under this Agreement have been duly and validly authorized by all necessary action on the part of the Buyer. This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Buyer and (assuming that this Agreement constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of the Seller) constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of the Buyer, enforceable against the Buyer in accordance with its terms.
 - 4.2 The execution and performance of this Agreement by the Buyer does not conflict with any agreement by which the Buyer is legally bound.
- 5. Representations and Warranties. In order to induce the Buyer to enter into this Agreement, the Seller hereby represents and warrants to the Buyer as follows:

- 5.1 The execution and delivery of this Agreement by the Seller and the performance by the Seller of its obligations under this Agreement have been duly and validly authorized by all necessary action on the part of the Seller. This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Seller and (assuming that this Agreement constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of the Buyer) constitutes a legal, valid, and binding obligation of the Seller, enforceable against the Seller in accordance with its terms.
- 5.2 The execution and performance of this Agreement by the Seller does not conflict with any agreement by which the Seller is legally bound.
- 6. Notices. All notices or communication hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be duly given if sent by registered mail, return receipt requested, express courier or facsimile transmission, as follows:

or at such other address as any of the above may have furnished to the other party in writing by registered mail, return receipt requested, express courier or by facsimile transmission, with a confirmation sent by registered mail, return receipt requested, and any such notice or communication given in the manner specified in this <u>Section 6</u> shall be deemed to have been effectively given (a) three days after deposit with the U.S. Postal Service, postage prepaid, registered or certified with return receipt requested, (b) one business day after deposit with a reputable express courier, prepaid for

- overnight delivery, or (c) upon confirmation of receipt by fax by the party to be notified.
- 7. Waiver. The provisions of this Agreement may be waived, altered, amended or supplemented, in whole or in part, only by a writing signed by each of the parties hereto.
- 8. Assignment; Binding Effect. Except as provided in Section 1.1 above, neither this Agreement nor any right or interest hereunder may be assigned in whole or in part by any party without the prior written consent of each other party. This Agreement will be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assignees.
- 9. Governing Law. This Agreement, including, without limitation, the interpretation, construction, validity and enforceability hereof, shall be governed by the internal laws of the State of Alaska, without regard to the principles of conflict of laws thereof.

10. Submission to Jurisdiction

- 10.1 Any legal action or proceeding with respect to this Agreement or any document related thereto shall be brought solely in the courts of the State of Alaska or of the United States of America for the District of Alaska, and, by execution and delivery of this Agreement, each party hereto hereby accepts for itself, himself or herself and in respect of its, his or her property, generally and unconditionally, the jurisdiction of such courts. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably waive any objection, including, without limitation, any objection to the laying of venue or based on the grounds of forum non conveniens, which any of them may now or hereafter have to the bringing of any such action or proceeding in such respective jurisdictions.
- 10.2 Each party hereto irrevocably consents to the service of process of any of the aforementioned courts in any such action or proceeding by the mailing of copies thereof by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, to such party at its, his or her address provided herein.

- 10.3 Nothing contained in this <u>Section 10</u> shall affect the right of any party hereto to serve process in any other manner permitted by law.
- 11. Waiver of Jury Trial. Each party hereto hereby waives any right such party may have to trial by jury in respect of any litigation based on, or arising out of, under or in connection with this Agreement or any course of conduct, course of dealing, verbal or written statement or action of any party hereto.
- 12. Headings, Gender, etc. The headings used in this Agreement have been inserted for convenience and do not constitute matter to be construed or interpreted in connection with this Agreement. Unless the context of this Agreement otherwise requires, (a) words of any gender will be deemed to include each other gender, (b) words using the singular or plural number also will include the plural or singular number, respectively, (c) the terms "hereof," "herein," "hereunder," "hereto," and "Section" will refer to the specified Section of this Agreement, and (d) the conjunction "or" will denote any one or more, or any combination or all, of the specified items or matters involved in the applicable list.
- Invalid Provisions. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable under any present or future law, and if the rights or obligations of any party hereto under this Agreement will not be materially and adversely affected thereby, (a) such provision will be fully severable, (b) this Agreement will be construed and enforced as if such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision had never comprised a part hereof, (c) the remaining provisions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect and will, not be affected by the illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision or by its severance herefrom, and (d) in lieu of such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision, there will be added automatically as a part of this Agreement a legal, valid, and enforceable provision as similar in terms to such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision as may be possible.
- 14. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed (including by facsimile) simultaneously in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.

Dear Acting Director Chambers,

This letter is in response to an email sent by Cynthia Frankin, Director, and received by Three Bears on January 3rd, 2017 (please see Attachment A).

As in our initial correspondence with the prior Director regarding Notice of Violation AB16-0628 (the "Notice") (please see Attachment B), we believe it is very important to set everything in context because how we operated in Valdez since 2011/2012 and what happened in 2015/2016 did not take place in a vacuum. Rather, there is much mutual history between the ABC Board and Staff and Three Bears that has led up to where we are today.

How Three Bears Came to Operate License 4165 on a "Minimal Basis"

Up until the point that we shut down our grocery store in Valdez in October 2007 and accordingly stopped operating License 4165 full time, Three Bears had acquired package store liquor licenses and then almost immediately put them into full-time operation. Thus, when market conditions forced us to close our Valdez store, we had no experience with the ways to keep a package store liquor license alive for future use at a new location.

So, shortly after we closed in Valdez, we asked ABC Staff what we could do. And Staff told us about waivers and helped us familiarize ourselves with the required forms and procedures and even, at times, walked us through the process a bit (please see Attachments C and D—2010 correspondence with Staff regarding 2nd and 3rd Waiver Applications).

Once we got to the point where we had obtained a third non-operating waiver and the Board told us that there would be no more waivers when we appeared before them to get our third, we again found ourselves in unfamiliar territory and again turned to Staff to find out what, if anything, we could do next to keep License 4165 while we waited for an opportunity to return to the Valdez market with another grocery store or other store that would include a liquor store.

Staff told us that there was a provision—"minimal operation"—that was designed and meant exactly for our situation. And Staff pointed us to 3 AAC 304.170.

But the conversation with Staff did not stop there because we were still very much in unfamiliar territory. So, we went through 3 AAC 304.170 point-by-point on the phone and in person with Staff (our recollection is mostly with Christine Lambert and at least twice with Shirley Coté (Shirley Gifford then)) in order to understand exactly what Staff wanted to see us do in order for us to be in compliance. When we asked what it meant to operate "in a similar fashion to other licensed premises of the same type," we were told that the "type" was other licenses that we being minimally operated. But Staff emphasized multiple times that they didn't want to see us operating out of a hotel room (as other minimally-operating licensees had apparently done). Rather, they wanted to see us operate out of a location that had a direct entrance for the public and wasn't inside another building, up three floors by elevator, and down the second hall on the left.

We told Staff how we intended to cover the requirements for two years by operating for at least a little over two months spanning the end of one year and the beginning of the next (thus our references to 2011/2012, 2013/2014, and 2015/2016). We also told Staff how we would be renting space from Wilson Brothers and that they'd be helping us operate the store. Staff said that they were fine with all of this. When we discussed the sales records and cash register requirements with Staff, they said that even a simple written record would suffice. And then Staff emphasized that they wanted our records to include a record of the days and hours that we were open. They stressed that even if we had little or even no sales, it was very important that we actually operated the number of days and hours required.

So, to recap, the two things that Staff stressed most to us were 1) that we operate in a space where the main entrance gave the public direct access and 2) that we make sure to meet the requirement of operating for at least 30 8-hour days each year. And we have always done this. Further, when a question arose regarding whether we had actually operated at the end of 2011 and the beginning of 2012, we sent our daily records to Christine and she replied back to us that those records were fine (please see Attachments E, F, G, and H—2012 correspondence with Staff regarding minimal operations in 2011/2012).

Further, after we had worked our way through 3 AAC 304.170 with Staff and learned what they actually wanted to see happen in real-world terms, we asked if there was anything else we needed to do, and Staff said "No" and further said that if we did what we discussed with Staff "everything will be fine."

What Happened in 2015/2016

We all know now that we had problems in Valdez in 2015/2016. However, in 2015/2016, we still fully complied with the two items Staff had always stressed the most: 1) we operated in a space where the main entrance gave the public direct access and 2) we operated for at least 30 8-hour days each year and kept the operating records we had always kept and that Staff had always been okay with. We also stocked a meaningful quantity and variety of product (please see Attachment I—2015/2016 product photos) and complied with health, fire, and zoning laws or ordinances for operating a business in Valdez (please see Attachment J—2015/2016 photo of licenses). But we fell short on some of the premises location requirements and on the signage requirements. This happened because, unknown to us, our operator, Curt Wilson, moved the store from the building he owns at 1900 Airport Way (where the store operated in 2011/2012 and 2013/2014) to an adjacent building that he owns at 1800 Mineral Creek Loop Road. Also, the Three Bears logo sign and the hours sign that had always been used at 1900 Airport Way got lost in the move. So, there was no sign in 2015/2016, although members of the public went in and out of the

location almost every day and the store operation was plain to see once inside (please see Attachment K—shows 2015/2016 product right inside public entrance).

Now, Curt Wilson did move the store for a good reason as they were no longer manning 1900 Airport Way. Thus, he moved the store so that it could in fact be operated. Of course, if we had known of the move in advance and that the old signs had been lost, we would have applied to change the location and we would have provided new signs. But at this point, all that we can do is fix things going forward.

Fixing Things Moving Forward

Now we come to the Notice and specifically to the first sentence of the third full-sized paragraph that says, "You are directed to respond to the Director of the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office in writing to this Notice of Violation within 10 days of receipt to explain what action you have taken to prevent the reoccurrence of this violation" (emphasis added).

First, we note that we sent an initial response in a letter dated December 30, 2016 and delivered via email and U.S. mail (the "Response Letter") (please see Attachment L). We note also that the prior Director responded by email to the Response Letter and that this current letter is in response to the prior Director's January 3rd, 2017 email.

Second, we apologize if our initial response to how we intend to fix things going forward may have seemed vague. That was not our intent. Rather, the simple fact is that properly fixing this particular situation in the way that we intend to (by operating License 4165 seasonally in Valdez) is not the easiest process. As we mentioned in our Response Letter, we've already made, and are continuing to make, inquiries about new locations in Valdez. However, as we all know, it's the middle of winter, and we're finding that this is not necessarily the best time to be scouting properties in Valdez, especially because a final selection will require at least one trip to Valdez. Still, we are committed and are sticking to the task and would just ask for more than the 30 days we've initially been given to find a new location.

Third, as we've been talking with folks in Valdez and working to find a location (and perhaps as a result of those talks), we have been approached about selling License 4165. And dealing with a potential sale is another situation where we would ask for more than 30 days to finalize things.

Fourth, regarding the exact "season" we will operate (if we don't sell), we're currently planning on being open from mid-May to mid-September and plan to submit the exact dates when we apply to move License 4165 to a new location and to change it to a seasonal license.

Fifth, regarding timing as a general matter, we would respectfully ask that you allow us to work on a permanent fix until the date for the closing of the Agenda for the Board's April meeting. And we promise that by that time, we will have either submitted everything required for changing locations and operating seasonally in Valdez or we will have submitted a transfer application.

Sixth, regarding the letter that accompanied the Notice and requested additional information, we are attaching as much of that information as is readily available (please see Attachments M, N, O, and P) and will continue working to locate the rest. However, we ask for some patience here as our fiscal year ends on April 30th, and after our outside auditors have been and gone in our offices each year (generally by sometime in June or July), we box up all our accounting records pertaining to that year and send them

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off site. Unfortunately, not all the boxes are fully indexed as to contents or location and the records pertaining to Valdez are very small. So, we're continuing to work on locating and producing everything requested, and would again just ask for your understanding and patience.

Preserving the Potential for Competition in Valdez

As we mentioned in our Response Letter, it pained us greatly to see the Eagle Food Center in Valdez unreasonably raise their prices within minutes of hearing that we were closing our Valdez store. One of the many reasons that this was so disturbing is Eagle was a Safeway brand (today the store is simply branded as a Safeway), which means they have far greater buying power than Three Bears and have a much lower cost of goods. So, raising prices like they did was just monopolistic abuse.

Further, it should be noted that Tok is a remote community on the State's road system just like Valdez. Also, Tok has about half the population of Valdez, and thus one might expect to see higher prices given that there is only one store and that the market is considerably smaller. But while Safeway in Valdez charges some of the highest grocery prices in a community on the State's road system, folks living in Tok can purchase groceries at prices competitive with Anchorage and the Valley. This is because as Three Bears has grown and our buying power has increased, we have passed the benefits along to the communities we serve.

Now, when we recently reviewed the spreadsheet that lists all Alaska liquor licenses on AMCO's website, we noted that only three package store licenses are listed in Valdez: Safeway's Oaken Keg, Acres Beverage Center, and Three Bears. However, it appears from the Agenda and Minutes from the Board's April 26, 2016 meeting (select pages attached) that the Acres Beverage license has gone away as the Board voted down a fourth waiver.

Thus, if Three Bears or someone we sell to in Valdez doesn't continue to operate License 4165 there, then Eagle/Safeway's Oaken Keg liquor store will be the only package store in town and will be able to charge even higher prices. Further, with Valdez' population hovering around 3,000, there's the possibility that there will never be another package store liquor license in town and that Safeway's Oaken Keg could potentially have a permanent monopoly.

"Alaskans Serving Alaskans Since 1980"

Finally, we want to stress that while Three Bears has grown over the last 36 years from one store and a handful of employees in Tok to nine Alaska stores (and one in Montana) with over 500 employees, we are still a small, family-run company at heart, headquartered in Alaska and run by everyday Alaskans. And even during some of our more rapid growth spurts, we've always worked as hard as we can to be a good operator and to serve our communities as well as possible.

As a small part of striving to be a good operator and striving to best serve our communities, we started "carding hard" and requiring ID for all alcohol and tobacco purchases over 15 years ago, well before practically anyone else in the State did this voluntarily.

Further, in our dealings with the ABC Board and Staff, we have always worked as hard as we can to be open, honest, proactive, and transparent. And we have appreciated the responsiveness and professionalism of the Board and Staff helping us navigate the alcohol laws and regulations for over 20

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years now. We believe it's been a good relationship and want to do everything we can to keep it that way. And that's why we again ask for the opportunity to work together to resolve the problems that popped up in Valdez. As noted above, if given the opportunity, we believe we can have a solution by the time of the closing of the Agenda for the Board's April meeting.

Finally, over the past 36 years and through all of our growth, we've come to appreciate the amount of progress that can be made when folks sit down and have a face-to-face meeting. So, as we requested in our Response Letter, we once again request (per the last paragraph of the Notice) to meet with you in your Anchorage office to be heard regarding the Notice. In terms of scheduling the meeting, we are available during the period starting January 23rd and ending February 14th, 2017 and on any date starting from March 6th, 2017 and going forward.

Dear Mr. Mierop,

I have received and reviewed your response to our Notice of Violation. I have some issues with it that I hope you are able to address. First, you never revealed where it is exactly that you have been operating the license to meet minimum operating requirements. Our investigation found that the periodic sale of alcohol was not occurring on the original licensed premises, which is a major problem. As you are well aware, a liquor license is not something you pick up and set down wherever you like, it is attached to a physical premises.

Second, operating to meet the minimum requirements after having filed waivers indicates an intention to hold onto a license even though there is nowhere to operate it. That is essentially what your response said. It was very vague on any details regarding how you intend to fix this. I think that the board will not like to see that having exhausted waivers and determined to hold on to the license anyway, you have minimally operated the license in the method you have chosen.

I am copying the regulation regarding operating only the minimum operating requirements here. As you can see, you as the licensee have the burden of proof to prove each and every one of these things to the board. Nothing in your letter tells me how you are going to do that. In fact, much of the information gathered by our enforcement team about your operations in Valdez speaks to the exact opposite of these requirements:

<u>3 AAC 304.170. Waiver of annual operating requirement and minimum operating requirements</u> (a) Except as provided in this section, the board will deny an application for renewal of a license if the licensed premises were not operated for the time required by <u>AS 04.11.330(a)(3)</u> or (d). . .

- (j) If a license is exercised only to satisfy the minimum operating requirement under AS 04.11.330(a)(3) or 3 AAC 304.107(c)(1), a licensee has the burden of proof to show that the licensed premises was operated in a similar fashion to other licensed premises of the same type and shall, at a minimum,
- (1) provide signage, of sufficient size and visibility to show that the premises is open for business, stating business name and hours of operations;
- (2) offer for sale at the licensed premises, as appropriate to the type of license, a variety of malt beverages, wines, and distilled spirits;
- (3) visibly display the alcoholic beverages stock in a licensed package store premises;
- (4) provide seating in beverage dispensary licensed premises for at least one-half of the maximum number allowed by the occupancy permit;
- (5) comply with all state or municipal health, fire, and zoning laws or ordinances required for the operation of business;
- (6) maintain a record of all purchases of alcoholic beverages for resale on the licensed premises; and (7) record sales with a cash register that retains a record of transactions.

I will allow you 10 days from the date of this email to provide me with a revised response to the NOV which explains exactly how and where you have been operating the license since you ran out of waivers and provide me with the evidence required as above. I will allow you 30 days to file a transfer of location to where ever it is in Valdez that you intend to operate the license on a seasonal basis, including proof of right to possession of the proposed premises, such as a lease.



If I do not receive these responses as outlined above, my recommendation will be to proceed to an accusation requesting that the board take action against this license which could include suspension, denial, a fine, or any combination thereof.





Dear Director Franklin,

In order to address the issues raised in Notice of Violation AB16-0628, we at Three Bears believe it's helpful to put our current operations in Valdez in context.

First, our only current operations in Valdez are related to the actions we periodically undertake to operate license 4165 for at least 30 days each year and 8 hours for each of those 30 or more days.

Second, while Three Bears today operates a chain of nine stores in Alaska and one in Montana and is in fact the largest Alaskan-owned retailer in Alaska, this was not always the case. The company started in Tok in 1980 with a store named Gateway Food Center. Further, it was only with the opening of the company's second store in Valdez in 1989 that there was "a second link in the chain." The Valdez store was called "Three Bears" and is where the current name for the company and all of our stores originated. Plus, the Valdez store was our first store with a package store liquor license.

Now we fast-forward to late 2007, and we see that Three Bears had grown to six stores and was working on opening its seventh. But while most of the company was growing strong, there was a problem. In a nutshell, the problem was that both the City of Valdez and its economy had been shrinking for years and our Valdez store had been losing money for several years. And despite our best efforts, we just didn't see a way to turn things around in Valdez in any practical timeframe. So, in October 2007, as a company deeply committed to the communities we live in and serve, we took the very difficult step of closing our Valdez store.

Accordingly, it pained us greatly when we saw the only other grocery store in town raise all of its prices within minutes of hearing that we were closing. And, of course, they didn't do this because the cost of any of the products on their shelves suddenly increased. No, they did this because they no longer had any competition and knew that they could effectively charge whatever they wanted.

Seeing how the Valdez community was being taken advantage of and listening to the pleas from folks in Valdez (both at the time we closed and through the years since) for us to either stay or at least come back someday, we resolved that if we ever saw how we could make it work financially, Three Bears would return to Valdez.

That brings us back to license 4165. Because from day one of our thoughts of returning to Valdez, we have always known that we would need to have a package store in order to be competitive so that we could survive and serve the community again.

So, in order to keep license 4165 for a potential return to Valdez, we applied for and received non-operating waivers. Then, after receiving our third waiver, we faced the prospect of either operating enough to keep the license alive or potentially forever giving up our hopes of someday returning to Valdez. The solution we chose was to operate the license for at least 30 8-hour days each year.

However, operating for just 30 8-hours days each year has not been without difficulties and has unfortunately brought us to the place where we received the Notice of Violation. And that has brought us again to that other place—namely, the place where we once more have to decide how committed we are to preserving the viability of a future return to Valdez.

As a company strongly committed to Alaska and the communities we serve and the ones we may one day serve (or serve again), we have decided to prevent the recurrence of the violations noted in Valdez by committing additional resources to the Valdez market. Specifically, we intend to operate license 4165 in the future as a seasonal license where we make and meet all the commitments required to give Valdez a solid choice of package stores for the several months that we will be operating in Valdez each year in the future.

We have already started to inquire about available locations and will apply to the ABC Board to change the premises for license 4165 just as soon as we secure a location. And we will also take the necessary steps to convert license 4165 to a seasonal license.

Finally, we note that in the Notice it says that we may request to appear before you to be heard regarding the Notice. And in terms of setting a date for that appearance, we would ask that our appearance at your offices in Anchorage be scheduled for either the week of January 2nd, 2017 or the period starting January 23rd and ending February 14th, 2017.
