Delta Sportsmans Association is applying for a Waiver of Operation for having failed to meet requirements 3 AAC 304.170(j)			
specifically 3 AAC 304.170(j)(7) "record sales with a cash register that retains a record of transactions".			

Although Delta Sportsmans Association has been using a cash register system, we have discovered during the present renewal process that our current register system was no longer operating in accordance with the requirements regarding the use of a cash register that retains a record of sales, specifically when requested to produce said information covering the last two year period of activity.

In solution to this issue, we have purchased a new cash register system consisting of an electronic tablet, credit card reader (swipe, tap, and chip), activated cash drawer and receipt printer system. This upgraded system arrived May 12, is being installed and configured, and will be put into use immediately. It will produce both digital and paper receipt records, enabling Delta Sportsmans Association to meet state requirements in the next and all future reporting cycles.

Request for Waiver: Liquor License #3272 (Currently operating as Seasonal 4/1-9/30/17) Inconsistencies 2015-2016 Operating Seasons

We appreciate the opportunity to address concerns realized at the April 6, 2017 meeting of the ABC/AMCO Board relating to renewal of our liquor license. All circumstances are unique, and I feel the Board acted wisely to further review the operations of the license holders, and educate and assist those of us who are small business owners and, of course, have our own set of circumstances. If we explain these circumstances to you, you will have gained valuable insight into the liquor service industry in an amazingly diverse State. It'll work best if we all work together.

AT ISSUE:

An audit of our establishment's liquor license for the year 2016 performed by Fairbanks Investigator Ms. Stonecipher from January 2017 to April 2017 (four months!) resulted in her determination that we could not provide indisputable written proof that we operated 8 hours per day; she determined that we had not operated within the regulations. We had not utilized time cards or other means of attendance at the bar, as we four owners are the only staff. We had no outside employees.



The only record we could think to provide to Ms. Stonecipher was the business transaction detail on our cash register tapes (every transaction is listed with date, time, amount, sales category). Based on these entries, she established that we had met the 30-day open requirement, but that we had not been consistently "clocking-in or -out" using the cash register as a time clock.

This will be corrected in 2017.

Your letter of May 1 was the first time we found that we <u>also</u> were to request a waiver for 2015. So separate Waiver of Operations Application forms are enclosed here for 2015 and for 2016.

Our establishment is a large property, offering food, beverages and accommodations.

Our LLC purchased the property in 2008.

Business is run on a seasonal basis (April-Sept)

The business is currently for sale. It has been listed for sale since 2012

We are four members. Each of us is retired from long "real life" careers.

Our intent with this purchase was a <u>five-year historic preservation project</u> to restore and perform deferred maintenance on the Camp and return it to a viable business opportunity.

After our 5-year committment, the business is FOR SALE.



To Take You Back:

Chatanika is located 28 miles from the city of Fairbanks, Alaska, on the Steese Highway. The Chatanika Valley was home to a vibrant mining industry from the very early 1900's to the gold dredging that began in the early 1920's, and was one of the Interior's "hearts" of the Gold Rush.

The town of Chatanika and the city of Cleary sprouted up in the valley, bringing in hopeful miners and their families, businesses and banks to support this new population as they came to mine the rewarding gold deposits in the area streams.

In the early 1920's dredging for gold in the valley commenced, resulting in the construction of an expanded man-camp consisting of several buildings to support operations and repairs for F.E. Co. Gold Dredge #3. These included the main camp building, a 40'x70' structure housing kitchen, mess-hall (dining), and upstairs accommodations for dredge workers and staff.

In 1947, our dad (Otto Bubenicek) was Camp Cook at the mess-hall. In 1949, he purchased and became proprietor of the Chatanika Trading Post, located adjacent to the Fairbanks Exploration Co. (F.E.) bunkhouses, mess-hall and assorted support centers. He operated there until the mid-1950's when the Steese Highway was rerouted through the lower valley, being rebuilt on the piles of rock tailings left by Gold Dredge #3; the Trading Post was then relocated to the main highway, and is now known as the Chatanika Lodge, under different ownership. That explains how far back our interests have resided in the town of Chatanika.

Chatanika Gold Camp became an established bar/restaurant/accommodations business in the years after the ending of gold dredging operations in 1963, and the vacancy of the Camp structures. It was refurbished to offer a restaurant and accommodations, and has been in semi-continual service as such ever since. It has been through several different DBA's over the years.

The F.E. Gold Camp is listed on the **National Historic Register** as one of the early mining history sites. It is located along a stretch of the historic Davidson Ditch and early-day Fairbanks-Circle Mail Trail.



To Take You Forward:

Our LLC purchased the F.E. Gold Camp in 2008.

We are four members.

Each of us is retired from long "real life" careers.

Our intent with this purchase was a <u>five-year project</u> to restore and perform deferred maintenance on the Camp as a historic preservation project. <u>Then sell.</u>

Again, our mission was historic preservation.

This became a great project and we accomplished our goals: in addition to putting the establishment back on the map as a local and tourist-attracted site, and offering a dining opportunity and accommodations for this area, we could show that financially this location was able to support itself.

We re-established a lively clientele and showed the general public that this was a viable establishment.

Mission accomplished. Ready for someone with more energy.

Having accomplished our goal, the establishment was put on the market. It has been officially <u>listed for sale since 2012</u> with Fairbanks local realtors Wes Madden Realtor, Absolutely Alaskan Realty, Remax; it is listed again (2016) with Wes Madden Realtor (Chick Wallace Agent).

The property has been priced to sell quickly, to respond to 2017 season operations.

It has been advertised as a Commercial Property (see Wes Madden Realtor web site) whose business specifically depends on <u>inclusion of</u> the liquor license as chatel.

For the business season 2017 our business has committed to catering several special events in the bar/restaurant. Our liquor license is critical to fulfilment of these bookings.



We will take it a year at a time, based on a potential sale of the business. Even if it does not sell in 2017, we have renewed all of our operating permits and licenses and are conducting business in a limited manner If not for the required liquor license window of operation, we most likely would not open the business beyond 2018.

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Renewal of this liquor license impacts State of Alaska tourism opportunities; business support to local purveyors and vendors; preservation of Alaska's historic buildings; our sharing of a wealth of the history of the early days of living in the Chatanika Valley; conservation and displays of the antique machinery, dredge buckets--antiques and memorabilia to satisfy all interests.
