This renewal license application form is required for all individuals or entities seeking to apply for renewal of an existing beverage dispensary – tourism liquor license that will expire on December 31, 2017. All fields of this form must be complete and correct, or the application will be returned to you in the manner in which it was received, per AS 04.11.270 and 3 AAC 304.105. The Community Council field only should be verified/completed by licensees whose establishments are located within the Municipality of Anchorage or outside of city limits within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough.

This form must be completed correctly and submitted to the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office (AMCO)'s main office, along with all other required documents and fees, before any renewal license application will be considered complete.

General Statement:


The Seward Highway starts at Seward and ends in Anchorage. The Seward Highway from Potter Marsh to Indian Creek (mile 103), is a national scenic highway and located in the Chugach State Park. The Highway and Park provide numerous parking areas and off highway Park facilities along that fourteen mile stretch between Anchorage and Indian. These areas are for viewing the Turnagain Arm, the wildlife along this highway and using the picnic and hiking areas. The highway itself is one of the most popular tourist attractions just outside the Anchorage Area. The Indian House was first opened in 1953, when the Seward Highway was completed and open. The first Liquor License was issued by the Alaska Territory as a business license in 1953, and when the ABC Board was created in 1956, the Territory issued the first Dispensary License. If not the oldest, it is one of oldest dining and lounge facilities on the Seward Highway. The Indian House is located at mile post 103.5 of the Seward Highway, in Indian, Alaska. It is approximately 14 miles from Anchorage, a half mile from Indian Creek and 3 miles from Bird Creek. The Indian House has 200 feet of frontage on the Seward Highway and is easily accessible to tourist and commercial vehicles. It is the first dining, lounge facility out of Anchorage, and one of the few indoor Public facilities along this stretch of highway where tourists visit the highway parks and parking areas. The Indian House is part of the history of Alaska.

Question 1: Encourage Tourism

The Indian House is a Tourist attraction. The Indian House features a breathtaking view of the Turnagain Arm, where you can see the whales run and watch the Bore Tides. The view includes the community of Hope in the Resurrection Creek Valley, Sunrise Mountain and the 20 mile creek valley (where Sunrise Community once existed). The view described is on north shore of the Kenai Peninsula, and is where Captain Cook, in 1776 turned back because it did not lead to the Northwest Passage. Also the area was rich with tales of gold mining and railroad construction in the turn of the last century. We are extremely proud of our view. The house and the view is designed to be family friendly. This attracts both tourists and Alaskans. In addition, Anchorage area residents bring their visiting guests to experience this scenic, historic part of Alaska, or use it as a destination when they just want to get out of town. Besides the view, the House has historic photos, some artifacts, and coin collections left by tourists in the last century. The inside is quite picturesque and Museum like. In general, people take pictures outside from the deck and of the inside of the building.

Question 2: Facility Construction

The Indian House building is sided with rustic logs from the Turnagain area. The ceiling and walls in the front area of the building is constructed with wooden slats and boards milled in the Bird Creek Sawmill in the last century. A wall divides the lounge and restaurant so that the restaurant area can be more family oriented. Dining is available in both areas. Also, the front of the building has a very large deck. The facility has three restrooms, which includes a handicap restroom. There are eight picture windows in the restaurant/lounge area that are vintage Alaska Railroad passenger car windows. There is also a small, alcohol free, outside dining/picnic area.

Question 4: Room Rentals

We have 10 rental rooms available. None of the rooms have cooking facilities. We do not stock or serve alcohol in the rental rooms.

Question 5: Is there a Dining Facility

Yes. The Indian House is basically a family style restaurant with a lounge. Our restaurant is generally our primary revenue producer during our busy periods.

Question 6: Additional amenities available to our guests through our establishment:

We have a unique Alaskan gift shop that features Alaskan style gifts and souvenirs, and when available, we feature art work made by Alaskan artists. We share the history of Turnagain Arm and the surrounding area, with photos of the history of the area and the artifacts, such as the carved Bilikins and carved wooden Indians. We have an information display of brochures available for tourists. These are supplied by the Alaskan tour guide services and operators, many which are local to Turnagain Arm and Girdwood. As a courtesy, we offer free limited parking to tourists in motorhomes and RV's. This gives tourists a safe place to rest, dine, or to rent one of our rooms to freshen up.

Personal Note:

I moved to Alaska (Fairbanks) in 1959. In 1964, I joined the Alaska National Guard, moved to Anchorage to work construction after the 1964 earthquake and then went outside for basic training. When I returned to Anchorage in 1965, I worked for the Forest Service as a surveyor for the camp grounds on the Kenai. When returning to Anchorage that fall, the temporary Indian Bridge was damaged, and only foot traffic could cross. We walked across the bridge and another half mile to the nearest establishment. That was the first time I entered the Indian House. We had to call Anchorage for a ride by radio phone. During the 1980's, when I returned from trips to the Kenai, I made it point to stop at the Indian House for one last view of the Alaska wilderness before returning to Anchorage. I purchased the Indian House in 1993 and after an extensive remodel, opened it in 1994. I changed the theme, to that of a family style restaurant, while improving the lounge and bar area. I have committed myself to maintaining it as a highway friendly facility, with an Alaskan historic atmosphere with its extraordinary view of Alaska.

I respectfully request your approval for the renewal of the Indian House license.
