What is this form?

This renewal license application form is required for all individuals or entities seeking to apply for renewal of an existing beverage dispensary – tourism liquor license that will expire on December 31, 2017. All fields of this form must be complete and correct, or the application will be returned to you in the manner in which it was received, per AS 04.11.270 and 3 AAC 304.105. The Community Council field only should be verified/completed by licensees whose establishments are located within the Municipality of Anchorage or outside of city limits within the Matanuska-Susitna Borough.

This form must be completed correctly and submitted to the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office (AMCO)'s main office, along with all other required documents and fees, before any renewal license application will be considered complete.







Katmai Lodge – Tourism License

1. Explain how issuance of a liquor license at your establishment has/will encourage tourism.

- a. In a state where sport fishing contributes millions of dollars to its economy, Katmai Lodge has the distinction of being **the largest fishing lodge in Alaska**. Katmai is the original river-based lodge **located in the only designated Trophy Sport Fishing Area, the Alagnak River**. In this land of 3,000 rivers, 3 million lakes and 6,640 miles of coastline, Katmai Lodge highlights Alaska's beautiful natural resources, including wildlife along the Alagnak River, at Brook Falls at Katmai National Park, and in the air when guests fly to Katmai from King Salmon Airport. Katmai Lodge has a 30+-year history of bringing in tourists from across the United States and other countries for a *"fishing experience of a lifetime."* Many of these anglers return year after year to repeat their adventure at the Katmai Lodge, and to refresh their albums with photos of the largest fish they have caught in their lives; majestic Bald Eagles; mighty Brown Bears; and a variety of other wildlife unique to Alaska. Migration of Pacific Salmon, Rainbow Trout, Arctic Grayling, and Dolly Varden along the Alagnak River provides several seasons of fishing in what many of our clients say is a *"National Geographic-type Alaskan fly fishing experience."*

2. Explain how the facility was/will be constructed or improved in accordance with this application.

- a. Katmai Lodge traces its beginnings back to 1979, where the foundation began on a native allotment just down the Alagnak River from its present location. Local residents of the area, John and Mary Tallekpalek of Levelock, had previously built a cabin along the Alagnak River and graciously allowed the previous owners of Katmai Lodge and a few fishing guides to utilize their small home as a base camp. In 1980, a larger facility was built, where Katmai Lodge now stands. The first 3 buildings of Katmai Lodge that were constructed were the Main Lodge, the Sockeye Lodge, and the kitchen. Recent additions to the Main Lodge include the Katmai Pub and an updated fly-tying area. In 1993, a gravel runway was added to the property, which now allows for guests and supplies to be flown in by wheel or floatplane. The rich 30+-year history of Katmai Lodge is captured both in the traditional Main Lodge, which has been preserved and kept intact through great care and effort, and the 18 buildings that since have been added to the Katmai Lodge facilities, including 8 guest lodges. The Sockeye, Rainbow, Eagle, Brown Bear, Grayling, and Osprey Guest Lodges, all were completely renovated in 2014 and 2015. The property is well-maintained year-round.



3. Who operates the facility for which a liquor license is being applied?

Operations at Katmai Lodge are managed by General Manager, Robert Kantor.

4. Do you offer room rentals to the traveling public?

- a. Yes, Katmai Lodge has 36 rooms available for the traveling public, with a maximum occupancy of 79 guests.
- b. Guest rooms do not have kitchen facilities.
- c. Guest rooms do not stock alcoholic beverages in guest rooms. The Main Lodge offers a fully stocked fridge of soft drinks, adult beverages and an honor bar in the evening.
- d. Katmai Lodge is not located within an airport terminal.

5. Does your establishment include a dining facility?

Yes, our chef at Katmai Lodge provides world-class fine dining.

6. Are additional amenities available to your guests through your establishment (e.g., guided tours or trips, rental equipment for guests, other activities that attract tourists)?

Yes, Katmai Lodge offers guided fishing tours; guided wildlife tours and boat rides; fishing equipment rentals; fly-tying lessons; Alaskan steam sauna; fly-outs to world-famous Brooks National Park; clothing store & gift shop; nightly slide shows that feature highlights from the day's fishing; Wi-Fi, darts, books, cards, and board games.
