This form must be completed correctly and submitted to the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office (AMCO)'s main office, along with all other required documents and fees, before any renewal license application will be considered complete.





This is a notice to you as licensee that an alleged violation has occurred. If the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board decides to act against your license, under the provisions of AS 44.62.330 - AS 44.62.630 (Administrative Procedures Act) you will receive an Accusation and Notice of your right to an Administrative Hearing.

Note: This is not an accusation or a criminal complaint.

On 11-19-2017 Ketchikan Police were called to the Totem Bar in Ketchikan fro a report of an unconscious on-duty bartender. Upon officers and EMS arrival it was found the bartender was drunk and no other medical conditions were apparent. This is a violation of conduct relating to drunken persons.

~~Sec. 04.16.030. Prohibited conduct relating to drunken persons.~~

(a) A licensee, an agent, or employee may not with criminal negligence

(1) sell, give, or barter alcoholic beverages to a drunken person;

(2) allow another person to sell, give, or barter an alcoholic beverage to a drunken person within licensed premises;

(3) allow a drunken person to enter and remain within licensed premises or to consume an alcoholic beverage within licensed premises;

(4) permit a drunken person to sell or serve alcoholic beverages.

You are directed to respond in writing to this Notice of Violation within 10 days of receipt to explain what action you have taken to prevent a re-occurrence of this violation. FAILURE TO RESPOND TO THIS NOTICE OF VIOLATION WITHIN 10 DAYS WILL RESULT IN YOUR APPREARANCE, EITHER IN PERSON OR TELEPHONICALLY, BEFORE THE ABC BOARD AT THEIR NEXT REGULARLY SCHEDULED BOARD MEETING.

3 AAC 304.525 (B) provides that upon receipt of a Notice of Violation, a licensee may request to appear before the Director and be heard regarding the Notice of Violation. The request must be made within ten days after receipt of the Notice and the Director must grant an appearance within ten days after receipt of a request. A Licensee shall respond, either orally or in writing, to the Notice.

Steve-

I regret to inform you the violation notice sent on 11-19-2017 for the Totem Bar in Ketchikan was delivered to my father who is 90 years old and his caretaker who signed for this notice did not inform my father or myself that it had arrived. Please excuse me for not replying in a timely manner as I am well aware of the importance of the subject matter in this notice.

The behavior noted in the violation notice is not tolerated by myself nor my business. The employee in question was immediately suspended for a 3 week period to get his personal life in order and decide if he could conduct business like a professional.

To ensure this conduct does not occur again, my wife and I are regularly monitoring an 8 camera surveillance system for the establishment and doing periodic unannounced drop ins to the bar on all shifts for all bartenders. I have purchased a home breathalyzer and every bartender is required to submit a breath sample at any time during their shift upon request.
