Staff Rec.: Deny the renewal

Background: At the August meeting, the board tabled the renewal of this recreational site license and asked the licensee to provide information on his eligibility for a golf course license.

AS 04.11.115. Golf course license.

- (a) A golf course license authorizes the licensee to sell beer and wine on licensed premises located on a golf course.
- (b) A license may be issued only if
 - (1) an application is approved by the local governing body and the board;
 - (2) the applicant does not hold a beverage dispensary license or a restaurant or eating place license; this paragraph does not apply to an applicant who holds a beverage dispensary license or a restaurant or eating place license if the license was acquired by transfer from a licensee under AS 04.11.280.
- (c) The biennial license fee is \$400. The license fee and application fee must accompany the application for the license. An application must include a drawing of the golf course. A sample minimum food menu must accompany the application.
- (d) Food similar to that listed in the sample menu must be available during times when beer and wine are sold, served, and consumed on the licensed premises.
- (e) A golf course license may not be transferred or relocated.
- (f) In this section,
 - (1) "golf course" means a course, having at least nine holes and covering at least 2,950 yards, that is open to the public; and

(2) "licensed premises" includes buildings located on the golf course or a vending cart designed to carry beverages or food located on the golf course.

The licensee provided the attached letter, which states that his golf course is in excess of 3,125 yards. In actuality, this nine hole course is 1,555 yards in one direction. Apparently each green has a tee box at each end so that the course can be played backwards. If playing in both directions is counted in the yardage, the course length would be 3,110 yards.

The licensee did not address what food he serves in his letter, but in discussions with Investigator Hamilton, he stated that he serves some food and has a microwave. The golf course license requirements state, "A sample minimum food menu must accompany the application" and "Food similar to that listed in the sample menu must be available during times when beer and wine are sold, served, and consumed on the licensed premises."

The licensee also owns a seasonal beverage dispensary license (#4747) at the same location. In trying to understand the meaning of AS 04.11.115(b), which prohibits the issuance of a golf course license to the holder of a beverage dispensary license unless the holder of the BDL acquired it by transfer from another licensee, I found the following explanation provided at a hearing of the House Rules Committee from staff to Representative Rokeberg, who sponsored legislation to create the golf course license in 1998:

SHIRLEY ARMSTRONG, Legislative Assistant to Representative Norman Rokeberg, Alaska State Legislature, came before the committee. She referred to Version R, page 2, line 20, subsection (2), "A license may be issued only if the applicant does not hold a beverage dispensary license or a restaurant or eating place license;" and said the paragraph doesn't apply to an applicant who holds a beverage dispensary license or a restaurant or eating place license if the license was acquired by transfer from the licensee under AS 04.11.280. Ms. Armstrong stated that means if someone has bought a beer and wine license or a beverage dispensary license on the open market, and they currently hold one, if they want to have a golf course license and they bought it that way, they can have both. They don't have to sell their license. She informed the committee that there are two golf courses that have beverage dispensary licenses, which are more valuable than a golf course license, and the likelihood that they would do that is probably not high. Ms. Armstrong said, "On the same token, people who got their beer and wine license directly from the ABC Board, and the ABC Board does issue licenses, if they got one directly from the ABC Board then they have to give it back to them in order to get the golf course license and that's what that says. So the distinction is being made from somebody who bought one and if they want to get the golf course license, they can go ahead and sell their license and keep the golf course license and that's how that works."

License #4747 was transferred to this licensee from another person and location in 2008.

A golf course does not appear to meet the statutory requirements for a recreational site license:

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Sec. 04.11.210. Recreational site license.

- (a) The holder of a recreational site license may sell beer and wine at a recreational site during and one hour before and after a recreational event that is not a school event, for consumption on designated areas at the site.
- (b) The biennial fee for a recreational site license is \$800.
- (c) In this section, "recreational site" includes a location where baseball games, car races, hockey games, dog sled racing events, or curling matches are regularly held during a season.

While each golfer plays a "game," a golf course is clearly different from the examples given in AS 04.11.210(c) of the types of locations and events that qualify for a recreational site license. The service of alcohol is not related to an event start and end time but instead relates to the opening and closing times of the business.

Representative Rokeberg's testimony in 1998 before the House Rules Committee on HB 458 to create a golf course license included the following:

REPRESENTATIVE ROKEBERG said, "I am prepared to explain the legislation to the committee so they understand the bill ... Thank you Mr. Chairman, I have gone through -and the supporting information for the committee substitute for the bill is outlined of the rationale behind this legislation. Number one, this particular legislation would affect only a championship style course which is defined in the bill as being at a minimum of nine holes and 2,950 yards. It does not mean a small chip and putt type course or anything else. I call it a championship style course because it has to have at least that minimum yardage, which would actually preclude a number of small courses in the state of Alaska right now. The idea here is to encourage the development of golf course licenses as a tourist amenity and as a benefit to the recreation activities of a community and help enhance these tourist activities. It also streamlines the ability of the ABC Board to issue these licenses by repealing the existing municipal golf course license in regulation. And then it eliminates the use of a recreational events type license which is the one -- the type of license used by the Birch Ridge Golf Course in Soldotna currently. Some of the complaints about the bill is that this is just another way to get a liquor license in the hands of people that sell alcoholic beverages. Mr. Chairman, point in fact, the reason I got involved in this bill was because the Palmer Municipal Golf Course asked me to work on this. I'm familiar with the folks up there. They have the only municipal golf course license issued in the state. ... And there is only really seven golf courses affected by this legislation currently. That does not mean to say that there couldn't be the development of additional golf courses in the future that could apply for this license..." (emphasis added)
