A wall divides the lounge and restaurant so that the restaurant area can be more family oriented. Dining is available in both areas. Also, the front of the building has a very large deck. The facility has three restrooms, which includes a handicap restroom. There are eight picture windows in the restaurant/lounge area that are vintage Alaska Railroad passenger car windows. There is also a small, alcohol free, outside dining/picnic area.
